REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

The Council has the honour to submit the twenty-seventh annual report of the proceedings of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association and is glad to be able to congratulate its members on a successful year's operations.

The Council considers it its first duty to acknowledge its indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor-General, the Earl of Aberdeen, who was generously pleased to continue the annual subscription of \$500 established by his predecessors.

The Hon. J. C. Patterson, M. P., Minister of Militia and Defence, Lt.-Col. F. C. Henshaw and T. C. Brainerd, Esq., President of the Hamilton Powder Company, continued their annual donations of \$100 each; Messrs. Hiram Walker & Sons again contributed a prize for the highest individual score in the "Walker" Battalion Match, and Lt.-Col. J. A. L. Strathy, commanding 5th Royal Scots, contributed \$40.

To all of the above contributors the thanks of the Association are due.

The Annual Prize Meeting of the Association was held as usual on the Rideau Range, Ottawa, commencing Monday, August 27th. On the first day a protest was entered by a large number of competitors concerning the alleged use of 1893 ammunition in the Macdougall Match (which resulted in a decision by the Executive Committee, that the scores in both the Hamilton Powder Co. and the Macdougall matches should stand for individual prizes, but that they should not be allowed to count in the Grand Aggregate). The meeting was a most successful one, the weather being all that could be desired, the shooting very good, and the matches concluded on schedule time.

The question of a reduction in the expenses of management of the annual competitions and the camp arrangements at Ottawa, which would appear to be gradually increasing in amount from year to year, has engaged the attention of the Council, and with a view of ascertaining if the expenditure could be reduced in some direction to bring the same within the annual revenue, a Committee was appointed to make the necessary enquiry in this regard.

The report and recommendations of the Committee will no doubt be fully considered by the Council.

The Honorable J. C. Patterson, Minister of Militia and Defence, further evinced his deep interest in the proceedings of the Association by having a beautifully furnished marquee on the ground, and Mrs. Patterson held "At Homes" on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons during the matches, and during the unavoidable absence of the President, Lt.-Col. Hon. J. M. Gibson, the wife of the Chairman of Council, Lt.-Col. Fred C. Henshaw, entertained on Thursday afternoon, all of which were largely attended and thoroughly enjoyed, the Band of the Governor-General's Foot Guards executed a fine selection of music, to the great satisfaction of the large assembly.

By the courtesy of the Hon. Sir A. P. Caron, K.C.M.G., Postmaster General, a well equipped Post Office was again furnished for the convenience of competitors and those using the Range.

The report of Major E. B. Ibbotson, 5th Royal Scots, Command-

ant of the Bisley Team will be found in its place, and will well repay perusal, giving as it does a history of the proceedings of a most successful team, and making several suggestions which it will be well to consider when arranging for future teams.

By the kindness of the Major-General Commanding, Martini-Metford rifles with free ammunition were served out to marksmen desirous of testing them, and they were tried in the afternoons after the regular firing was completed.

In view of the fact that, in all probability new Ranges will have to be procured after the expiration of the lease of those at present occupied, your Council has not been idle, and after a good deal of searching, found what it considers a very eligible site for a range, situated immediately on the south side of the Ottawa River, and about half a mile from the present terminus of the Electric Railway at Rockliffe. Your Council has secured the option of purchase of the land required at what is considered a reasonable price, and it remains for the Association to consider the best means to be taken to insure the possession of a new range which will answer the requirements of a modern rifle.

The Council has pleasure in thanking the staff generally for the admirable way in which they performed their respective duties and brought the annual prize meeting to a successful conclusion.

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's Statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the year duly audited is herewith submitted.

Affiliation fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$668.00, as against \$635.00 received last year, an increase of \$33.00.

The number of affiliated Rifle Associations is as follows, viz: Provincial 8, Regimental County and others 34, an increase of one Association as compared with last year.

Annual subscriptions received for the year amounted to \$228.00.

Associate members' fees received as qualification to compete in matches amounted to \$314.00, as against \$320.00 received last year, a decrease of \$6.00.

Receipts from special donations amounted to \$840.00, as against \$845.00 received last year.

Special donations from banks amounted to \$750.00, the same as last year.

The entry fees to matches, including the charge for sighting shots, post entries and fines for challenge shots amounted to \$4,118.20, as against \$3,701.90 received last year, showing an increase of \$416.30.

The charge for ammunition, collected with the entry fees, and supplied to competitors at the firing points, amounted to \$1,188.80, exceeding the amount received last year by \$314.13.

After deducting the actual cost of the ammunition and the charges connected with the distribution at the several ranges, including pay of employees and cartage, a balance remains at credit of ammunition account of \$134.48.

Cash prizes and badges amounted to \$7,053.69, as against \$7,065.35 paid last year, a small decrease of \$11.66.

The expenditure on account of the Bisley team amounted to \$5,859.78, as against \$5,448.21 in 1893, an increase of \$411.57. This is accounted for by the increased cost of passages of the team to England, and also the return passages of members of the team to their homes in Ontario and British Columbia.

The receipts from all sources for the year amounted to \$19,611.15, which, with the balance of \$7.99 carried forward from last year, shows a total of \$19,619.14 at the credit side of the account.

The expenditure amounted to \$19,070.45, leaving a balance of \$548.59 at the credit of the Association at the end of the year.

It will be observed by the Treasurer's Statement that the sum of

\$1,500 was received from the Militia Department on account of expenditure incurred by the Association in maintaining the Rideau Ranges, which ranges are in constant use by the Militia Force at Ottawa, except during a fortnight in each year, when the Dominion Rifle Association has possession.

The receipt of this amount enabled the Executive to close the accounts of the year, and leave a good balance at credit of the Association.

A detailed account of the expenditure made by Major Ibbotson, commanding the Bisley team for 1894, will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF
 MAJOR E. B. IBBOTSON,
 5TH ROYAL SCOTS,
 COMMANDING THE
 BISLEY TEAM FOR 1894.

MONTREAL, September 30th, 1894.

To Lt.-Col. The Hon. J. M. Gibson, Pres. Dominion Rifle Association :

SIR,—Having had the honour of being appointed Commandant of the Bisley Team for the year 1894, I now beg to hand you my report.

In accordance with your instructions, I inspected the team in the Montreal Drill Hall on the afternoon of the 22nd of June.

When the roll was called every member answered to his name, and with one exception were all properly and well uniformed, which latter defect was remedied before reaching Bisley.

I may here state that the whole team presented a most creditable and soldierly appearance.

We embarked S.S. "Parisian" that same evening, a large number of our brother militiamen also full band and 150 members of the Royal Scots assembled to wish us "bon voyage."

Leaving at daybreak the following morning, we sailed from Quebec at 9 a.m. on the 24th of June.

Owing to fog, ice and heavy seas, we did not arrive in Liverpool until 10.30 a.m., Wednesday, July 4th.

Though we had a dirty passage, it was made most pleasant by Captain Ritchie and the other officers of the ship.

The accommodation of the team on both the outward and home-ward voyage could not have been improved upon, and all expressed their entire satisfaction with the treatment they received.

I forwarded to Sir Charles Tupper the names of the team, on landing, also the date of departure from Cambridge to Bisley. Proceeding to Cambridge via London & North Western Railway an hour and a half after our arrival we reached our destination that evening at seven.

The arrangement of transport to Cambridge, Bisley and return was most satisfactorily performed by the Company's Agent, Mr. Thompson.

On arriving at Cambridge we proceeded at once to the Lion Hotel where I had previously arranged for the team to be quartered.

Owing to the renewed kindness of Col. Roberts, we had again the use of the University Ranges, and as all arrangements had been completed beforehand, practice commenced on Thursday, July 5th, continuing until Saturday, the 7th.

Leaving the team in charge of Captain Kirkpatrick, I proceeded that day to London and Bisley, to see that all previously ordered details had been carried out for the arrival of the team in camp which they reached at 2.30 p.m. on Monday, July 9th.

I was able, through the kindness and assistance of Major W. Clarke, late of the 90th Winnipeg, to arrange for the messing of the team during their stay at Bisley, within Canadian lines, and I cannot speak too highly of the thorough satisfaction this new departure gave to all.

We were greatly disappointed while in camp at not being inspected, as was the custom, by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, but were fortunate in having had an official visit from H. R. H. Duke of Connaught and staff.

It was impossible for His Royal Highness to inspect the team during the second week, but I ordered them to parade in full dress at the presentation of prizes on Saturday afternoon, when they were heartily welcomed on going up to receive their honours from the Duchess of Connaught.

In the course of his speech the Duke said "he was very much pleased to see present his old friends the Canadians, and to know that they had met with such success. It was also a great satisfaction to Englishmen to feel the deep interest taken by the Dominion in the N. R. A. meeting, voting as it did annually £2,000 to enable the successful marksmen to represent Canada."

We were deeply indebted to Earl Waldegrave, Lt.-Col. Sir H. Fletcher, M.P., Col. Mackinnon, Mr. Rook, and other members of the

Council for their kindness and attention during the meeting, also to Sir Charles Tupper, Mr. J. C. Colmer and Staff of Canadian Government Office.

The Canadian team of 1894 have distinguished themselves by the number of prizes won individually and collectively in the N. R. A. meeting, viz: Seven 1st, five 2nd, five 3rd, and 21 others, amounting to £550 2s. 9d., also prizes in kind to the value of about £65.

In securing the St. George's challenge vase and winning the Dragon cup and gold jewel cross and £30 by Staff-Sgt. W. C. King, Canada has won the most important individual prize which has ever fallen to her lot.

This prize ranks next to Queen's, as it is open to all efficient; whereas, the Prince of Wales prize, which Canada has more than once been credited with, is open only to a limited number.

It is worthy of special notice that four of the team were in the final hundred of the Queen's:

The 12th York Rangers are to be congratulated on having six of their men on the term of 1894.

This corps has earned for the Canadian battalions a high reputation by carrying off the Ranelagh cups from the picked men of the whole British volunteer force for the highest scores in the Queen's 1st stage.

It will rarely happen that six men from one battalion will secure places on the Canadian Team, but the success of the 12th would indicate that where three or four men of one corps win places a local effort should be made, with the concurrence of the D. R. A., to find the men and the money requisite to complete the battalion team for the Ranclagh Cups. This matter is of sufficient importance to warrant careful consideration.

It affords me great satisfaction that the Canadian team took 2nd place in the Kolapore Match, winning £80 and defeating all other teams from different parts of the Empire. Canada can hope but rarely to beat the Mother Country considering the material from which this team is selected and the masterly way it is coached and handled.

Even with an occasional victory, as in the past, the Canadians are likely to find it increasingly difficult to maintain second place.

satisfied with 3rd place, making 114 points as against 124 made by the English team. (Thanks are due to Captain Kirkpatrick who had the exclusive management of this match.) The Canadians were the only ones who received full number of points for drill. This well compensated us for the loss of a better place.

The Canada Club again presented a cup which was won by Lt. T. Mitchell, after shooting off a tie with Staff-Sgt. W. C. King.—Score 314 points.

The Canadian "At Home" was held on the second Thursday of the meeting and was largely attended. Lady Tupper again kindly consented to receive the guests, and among the many distinguished visitors present were :—

Sir Charles Tupper, Sir Donald and Lady Smith, Baroness Macdonald, Earl and Lady Waldegrave, Lord Frederick Fitzgerald, Hon. Mrs. Herbert, Lord Wantage, Lt.-Col. Sir H. Fletcher, Senator Dickey, Hon. W. V. Vale, Major Thorburn, Lt.-Col. Balfour, Mr. Stavely Hill, Col. Alex. Wilson, Major McKerrell, Lt.-Col. and Mrs. Frank Caverhill, Major Buchan, Capt. Girouard (R.E.), Lt.-Col. and Mrs. Denison, Capt. G. Kirkpatrick (R.E.), Mr. J. C. Colmer, Capt. Gaudet, R.C.A., Capt. Hudon, R.C.A., Col. Wyndham, Col. J. J. Cardin, Col. Horatio Ricardo, T. G. Gillespie (Pres. Can. Club) and Col. Marsden.

The Rt. Hon. Earl of Dufferin, the most Honourable Marquis of Lansdowne, Rt. Hon. Baron Stanley of Preston, and the Marquis of Lorne, regretting their inability to be present.

The chief event of the "At Home," which was enlivened by the strains of the 1st Battalion Royal Warwickshire Band, was the presentation of the handsome cup given each year by the Canada Club to the member of the team who makes the highest aggregate score.

Sir Charles Tupper, acting on behalf of the Club, presented me with the cup to be disposed of at the close of the shooting and heartily complimented the team upon their success at the ranges and especially in winning the Ranelagh cups, after which I tendered thanks on the behalf of the team, the Association and the Dominion.

We were pleased to have had Major J. Bruce (10th R.G., Toronto) with us while at Bisley, also to entertain Lt.-Col. F. Caverhill and Major Buchan (R.C.I.), for several days. We have to thank Lt.-Col. Caverhill for so kindly presenting for competition a pair of field glasses to be given to the Tyro who stood highest in the aggregate. They fell to the lot of Pte. Bayles.

I cannot speak too emphatically of my thorough appreciation of having had the privilege of so able and willing an Adjutant as Captain A. T. Kirkpatrick, who was untiring in the many and arduous duties devolving upon him, all of which he performed with great credit and satisfaction to myself and every individual member of the team.

As to the conduct of the team under my command, I can well bear testimony that they were truly a credit to Canada, and my hope is that every member will look back with as great pleasure as I do to the happy recollections of the days spent together at Bisley camp in 1894.

Before closing my report allow me to make the following suggestions:—

The D. R. A., in sending a team year by year to the N. R. A. meeting, renders a service of the highest value to the Canadian force and to the Dominion at large. It provides an incentive to excellence in the use of the rifle of the most honourable and patriotic kind and is spoken of with admiration by all branches of the service in the Mother Country.

It has also an aspect of great importance and one which cannot be too widely understood in Canada, that of an advertisement of the Dominion as a centre whose influence reaches not only every portion of the Mother Country but every colony and dependency of the Empire.

For this reason alone Canada could ill afford to dispense with such a practical and popular method of making herself known, and instead of any idea of minimizing this wholesome influence, efforts should be made, if possible to extend it.

Should the D. R. A. find that the present limit under the Federal arrangement cannot be increased, there seems no good reason why the various provincial associations, in conjunction with their respective local government, should not contribute to the funds of the D. R. A., a specified sum per capita and nominate as many of their best shots as the subscription would cover.

In some such way the team might be substantially increased and men of undoubted ability, who, for various reasons, may have missed getting into the twenty enabled to take their place in the Canadian contingent. With such a plan no Province need be left unrepresented in any year while Provincial interest would thereby be encouraged and sustained.

The advantages of preliminary practice are too obvious to call for particular remark, but the departure of the team from Canada should be arranged to give the men, if possible, one clear week's practice without fatigue.

It will be of interest to note that a movement is on foot to amalgamate the leading Scottish meetings so as to form one grand Scottish gathering. It is intended that it shall last one week only and that it shall commence fourteen days prior to the date fixed for the N. R. A. meeting.

Should this arrangement be effected it would manifestly be to the advantage of the Canadian team to be despatched in time to take part in this meeting, for they would secure in competitive practice the best possible preparation for their work at Bisley.

I strongly recommend as practice ground Runemede or Perbriht in preference to Cambridge as the condition and location of these ranges are nearly the same as at Bisley, and Runemede especially is well equipped and has unlimited target accommodation. It is also near to London and Bisley and situated on the bank of the Thames.

(I enclose particulars, cost of accommodation, also cost of transport from Liverpool to Runemede, Bisley and return.)

I am convinced from my own observation and from the comforts enjoyed by the team this year that all meals should be provided for within the Canadian camp. It is reasonable to assume that this new departure contributed in no small degree to the fine shooting made by the Canadians up to the last day of the meeting.

By a favorable combination of circumstances I was able to complete the arrangements for the messing of the team within the limits of the present per diem allowance. Owing to my happily securing the services of Major W. Clarke, who took the entire management and successfully carried out the details connected with this new departure solely for the pleasure of forwarding the interests and comfort of the Canadians. To him, therefore, the team of 1894 are deeply indebted.

It is obvious that future teams could not be catered for on the same terms, but the extra expenditure of at least £50, would be necessary which amount could easily be covered by the allowance annually voted for expenses.

There is probably no subject which better deserves the serious attention of the Council of the D. R. A. than that of permanent quarters, which matter has already been recommended by former Commandants.

I cannot too forcibly impress upon the Association the necessity of erecting buildings of such proportion and structure that ample accommodation would be provided for the needs of all future teams.

The cost of erecting buildings in keeping with the distinctive position Canada has earned for herself would soon repay the Association for the outlay. Owing to the difference in climate the discomfort and risk to the health of the men and many other disadvantages which it would be impossible to name, it is questionable if one good thing can be said in favour of the present arrangement.

The Canadian team is not sent to Bisley for the purpose of enduring hardship as good soldiers, as in the matter of sleeping in unfloored tents when it is possible to secure them at small cost, and they greatly add to the comfort of all in rainy weather.

If, however, the present hire system is continued, I would recommend that the entire furnishing and equipping of the camp be given to T. White & Co., who would supply all requisites for £71, in place of the £90 or upwards of previous years. (I enclose tender of T. White & Co.)

If the entire outfit could be bought and stored with N. R. A., a further annual saving could be made.

The thanks of the team are due to Messrs. Hubbard & Co. for allowing them the use of their portable oven, which proved so satisfactory in every way in the Mess Department. The fame of this Canadian oven soon spread throughout the Camp.

Time and money could be saved if in the future all transport arrangements be made with the Great Northern Railway, whether practice be continued at Cambridge or elsewhere. (For particulars see letter and time table and rates.)

I have arranged that early in April, prior to the departure of the team, programmes of the meeting should be obtained from the secretary, Col. Mackinnon, but a reminder would insure that this be carried out.

If the team were ordered to report at one hotel in Montreal much trouble and expense would be saved to the Commandant in handling and labelling of baggage, etc.

Owing to its proximity to the G. T. R. and C. P. R. stations and its easy access by electric car to the Drill Hall, the Queen's Hotel would be most convenient.

I am instructed by the N. R. A. to say that in consequence of all the aggregate matches being competed for in the second week, in future prizes cannot be drawn until two days after the close of the meeting.

The trophies won this year are to be returned with the Commandant of 1895.

It affords me great pleasure to send you so favourable a report of the Canadian Bisley Team of 1894, and I enclose sheets showing list of prizes won, acquittance roll, aggregate scores of the members of the team, also detailed account of expenditures, hoping that it will meet with your favour.



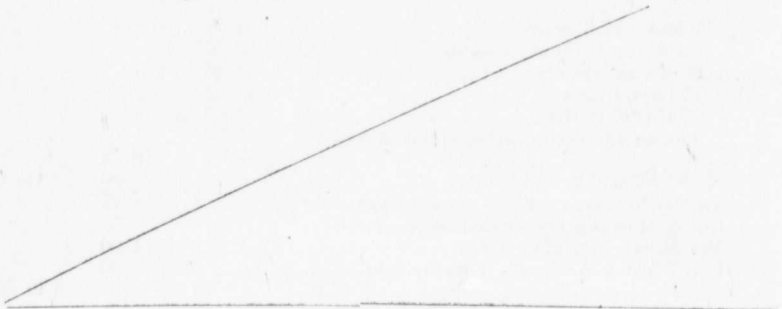

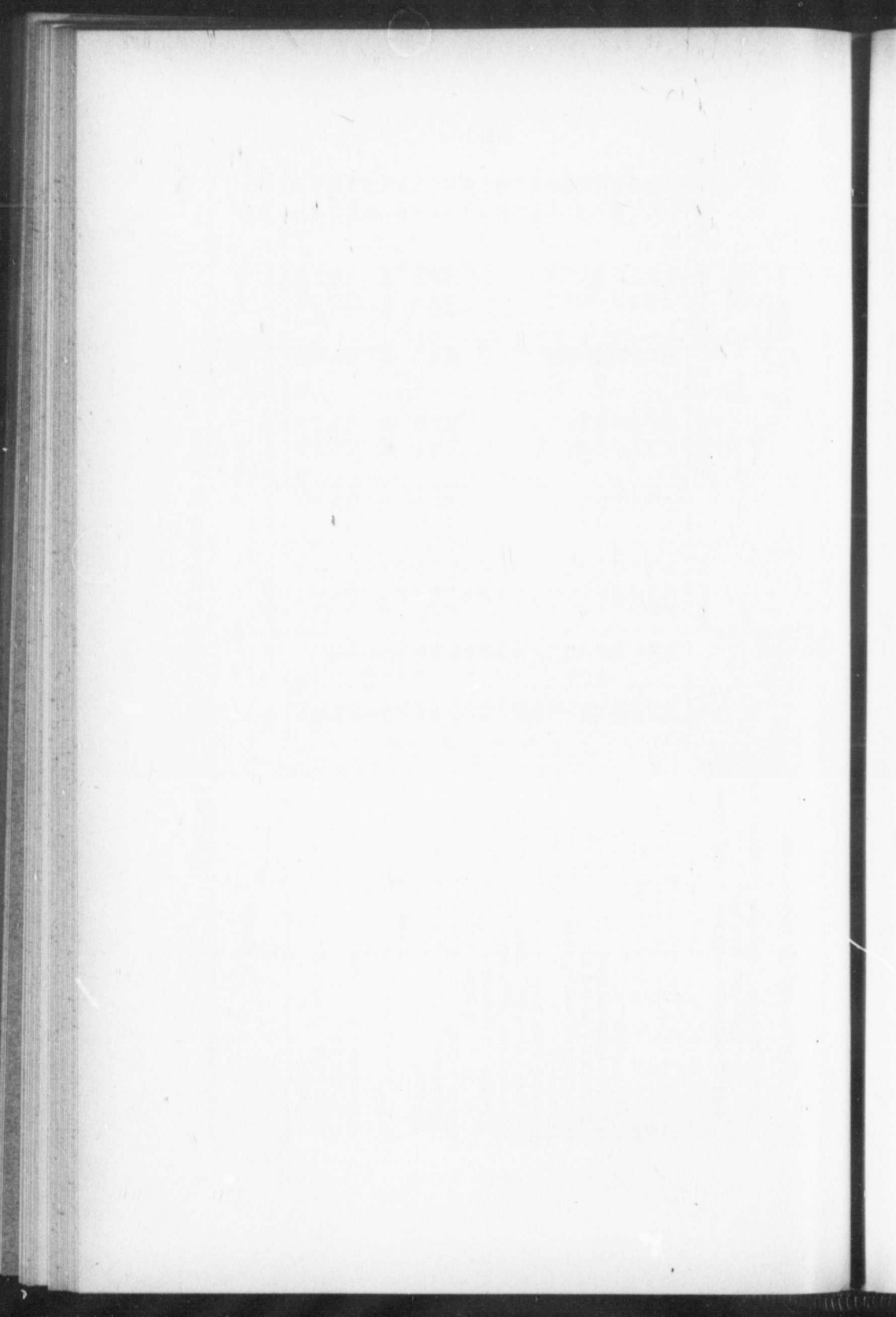

A Challenge Cup ; and a smaller Cup to be won individually, presented by Hiram Walker & Sons of Walkerville, Ont., with six Badges and \$198 in cash added by the D.R.A.

Open to teams of six members from any of the following :—

Cadets of the R. M. College ; Royal Schools of Cavalry, Artillery or Infantry ; any Regiment, Squadron or Troop of Cavalry, Field Battery or Brigade of Field or Garrison Artillery ; any Corps of Engineers, Battalion or Independent Company of the Active Militia, or of the same denomination of the force of H. M. Regular Army or Navy stationed in Canada, provided that all are members of the Dominion Rifle Association.

The amendment was carried, soon after which the meeting adjourned.

Moved by Major Mason, seconded by Major Hughes (M.P),—

That the Secretary be instructed to acknowledge the receipt of the letter from Messrs. Gorman & Fripp of the 30th August, and to inform them that the Executive Committee, after due consideration, cannot consent to change the decision already come to.—Carried.

The Chairman then reported upon the action taken by the sub-Committee appointed to take steps in the direction of obtaining a site for a new Rifle Range, stating that a new range site had been found east of Rockliffe and that the owners had been approached on the subject of sale of such portions of their land as would be required for the range, and that he was of the opinion that the requisite land could be had for one hundred dollars per acre, when it was

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Major Delamere,—

That action be taken by the Committee to bind the proprietors of the land required for the Rifle Range, in some legal agreement to be prepared by a lawyer, to a promise of sale of the property for a certain fixed price, the option of purchase to stand good for one year from date.—Carried.

The question of the liability of the Association for payment of duty, freight, insurance, etc., on Cups or prizes in kind won by members of the Bisley Team was talked over, and it was considered that the charges on those prizes which were to become the individual property of competitors should be paid for by them if they did not choose to bring them out with them on the return voyage, when no charges would be incurred, and it was

Moved, by Major W. C. Macdonald, seconded by Major Delamere,—

That in future, directions be given in the instructions to the Commandant of the Bisley Team, to bring out with him, any Cups which may be won by the Team, in order to save expense, and that such Cups be returned by the Commandant of the Team in the following year, such Cups to be insured by the respective commandants.—
Carried.

Sutherland, Major Sherwood, Major W. M. Blaiklock, Major Ibbotson, Lt.-Col. Tilton, Lt.-Col. Burland, Major Perley, Lt.-Col. Macpherson (Treasurer), Lt.-Col. Toller, Lt.-Col. White and Secretary.

Lt.-Col. Henshaw, Chairman, stated that the object for which the meeting was called was to consider the state of the finances of the Association and to make arrangements for getting out the Annual Report. He called upon the Treasurer to read a statement of the finances of the current year which he had prepared, which was done. The statement showed a considerable deficit.

Major Perley also read a comparative statement of expenditure of the Association of the last ten years, compiled from the Association's reports.

A long and earnest discussion was had on these two statements, and it was considered by the meeting that a considerable percentage of the outlay for work done upon the Rideau Range was fairly a charge that should have been borne by the Department of Militia and Defence, and it was resolved

That a Committee of Lt.-Col. Tilton, Major Perley, Lt.-Col. Anderson, Capt. Sutherland, Major J. J. Mason, and Major W. M. Blaiklock be appointed to examine and report upon the whole question of expenditure and management of the Association.—Carried.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a

Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the North-West Territories so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations,

one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those

electd by the Provincial Associations, to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutant's General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents, shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. Meetings of Council.
 The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Extraordinary Meetings.
 Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.
 that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of Finance Committee.
 three members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.
 chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sum for current expenses.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a general nature.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual accounts

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
