Summary of Latest News. The situation as regards the differ-encess between England and Russia in-creases in gravity. A protest has been sent from London to St. Petersburg against the continued advance on the Bosphorus and the Dardanelles. Eng-land stands to her demand that Russia shall formally engage to submit all the terms of the San Stefano Treaty to the Congress, and Prince Gortschaft has again replied, merely reiterating his pro-mise that all the conditions shall be sub-mitted to the Powers. The *Times* de-clares the Latest phase is that Russia, while willing to submit all the points of the Treaty, declines to be ultimately bound by the decision of the majority of the Powers. Turkey, in event of the difficulties between Russia and England resulting in war, has, it is reported, de-cided to remain neutral, which means, if true, that she will stand by and see her former eneury either gain additional glory and more power to crush her, or true, that she will stand by and see I former enemy either gain addition glory and more power to crush her, look on and not take the advantage administer a blow which might ultima ly restore her to her former status.

Supreme Court prompt'y decided the act un-constitutional. At the time of his failure he was engaged in an effort to construct a railroad twenty-six miles long, claiming it to be a link in a new line of railway from Pitbaburgh to Bing-hampton. A coonection was to be made with the Albany and Susquehanna, which would join Pitbaburgh to Boston through the Hoo-nac tunnel. It is said that this would be 135 miles shorter than any existing route. The road was to connect with what is known as the Low Grade road this side of Pitbaburgh. A cut from Red Bank to Homewood, on the Pitbaburgh, Fort Wayne, and Chicago Rail-road, would leave Pitbaburgh thirty miles to the south, and shorten the distance between Boston and Chicago aixty miles. Herdic's main interest in this scheme was to be found in the fact that the projected line would tap 25,000 acres of bituminous coal land owned by him. Of course it would be immensely valuable by such a connection. As this scheme is backed by the Pennytvania Rail-road, who own the Low Grade road and con-


