NEW PROHIBITORY BILL.

Hon. Mr. Scott, Secretary of State, has introduced his new Liquor Bill. It received its first reading in the Senate on Friday.

The bill is entitled "an act respecting the traffic in intoxicating liquors." He treats it as an enlargement of the Dunkin Act.

By this new bill power is given to any county or city within the Dominion to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors, excepting where medical, sacramental and mechanical cases demand its use.
