He then proceeded to explain in detail his estimates of expenditure for the current year, which shows a large increase compared with the expenditure of 1872. The Treasurer puts the total estimated expenditure at \$2,771,028. Of this amount nearly \$271,000 is included in connection with the municipalities fund and the tand improvement fund. From the total amount \$80,074 in connection with the expenditure of last year has to be deducted, which the Treasurer claims will reduce the actual expenditure this year to \$2,690,944, or about \$100,000 more than the expenditure of 1872. The chief items of increase are as follows :- Under the head of Civil Government an increase of \$18,095; for Colonization Roads an increase of \$66,594. New Coal-Cutting Machine.-A coalcutting machine has not only been in wented, but is actually at work, and with results which which we transcribe with no slight saustaction. This machine can cut in eight hours' time, 350 feet of coal, yielding from 70 to 76 tons in weight—which production, we are told, represents the work of 40 men for the same period. Three, or. at most, four men are required to tend the machine, and the calculation is that its genera adoption would render it possible to dis-pense with the labor of 300,000 of the 800,000 men now employed in the coal mines of England. Moreover, whereas the "waste" incidental to hand-cutting is estimated at fully 12 per cent. of the whole product, that detriment is reduced chine-work to one-third of the amount, representing an economy of no less than ten million tons of coal every year. As all this is stated of an inven-tion actually in operation, and proved, indeed, by the experience of a twelve-month's use, there seems hardly any room for doubting the practical efficiency of the new system.


