

Canadian woolens are firm and in good demand, and the mills are reported to be reasonably busy. Payments are reported fair, but the coming settling day on Feb. 4 is looked forward to, if not with a axiety, with some interest. Failures in th

there is no special feature in the past week's trade in hardware. There is a fair demand for metals, galyanized iron, tin plates, ingot copper and ingot tin going out to consumers in fairly large volume. Tinsmiths are reported to be stocking up for the year. Shelf and heavy hardware are moving slowly and in small sorting lots. Travelers report a hopeful feeling throughout the country, and look forward to an active business beginning about March I. Payments are reported fair.

TRADE AND FINANCIAL GOSSIP.

The passage of the anti-option bill in the United States Senate does not mean that such a measure has become law. It will yet have to be passed by the House of Representatives and obtain the President's signature. Before it goes that far it will probably be made plain that a law to prevent business being done on an option basis can never be enforced. Half of the business of the present day is done on an option basis. Drygoods travelers sell goods agreeing to deliver them two, three or four months hence at certain price. Various other lines of merchandise are sold for future delivery. So the grain broker sells to the miller July wheat in the month of January, and the latter is sure he will suffer no inconvenience from want of stocks three or six months hence, according to the option he buys. Even our farmer is a dealer in options. He sells his sheep and his lambs and his bullocks, agreeing to deliver them one, two and three months hence.
