PARISH NOTES.

S. Andrew's Day, Nov. 30th, will be the jubilee of the consecration of St. George's Church. It is intended to make some celebration of this interesting event, in what special manner has not yet been decided, but due notice will be given. It would be interesting to know the names of those who were present on that occasion, that special invitations to be present may be sent them. The Rector has already called the attention of the congregation to the fact that the service books in use at St. George's are out of date. It would be pleasant if some member or members would present new books to be used for the first time on the occasion of the jubilee.

On Sunday, Oct. 25th, we were favored by a visit and sermon from the Rev. J. Shields Boyd, the Canadian missionary in China. His most able address was much enjoyed and a new interest aroused in the Foreign Mission Work of the Church.

The congregation of St. George's will join all the parishes in the Rural Deanery in congratulating Canon Welch and themselves on his appointment as Rural Dean of Toronto.

Once again we have to regret the loss of one of our most energetic workers by marriage. On Wednesday, Oct. 14th, Miss Allarton Gosling was united to Mr. Harold Eveson, of Wooton Hall, Warwick, in St. George's Church. local newspapers have already given long accounts of the ceremony. It only remains for us to thank, on her behalf, the Sanctuary Guild for so prettily decorating the Church on the occasion. The Sunday School, of which for some time the bride was the secretary, presented a handsome and chaste silver-mounted writing case as a token of their appreciation of all her good work.

The Harvest Festival Services were held on Sunday, Oct. 18th, and were attended by very large congregations both morning and evening. The Church was never more effectively decorated, though the "labourers were few," and our sincere thanks are offered to Miss Wyatt and the Misses Boulton and one or two others who worked so hard and successfully.

The Organist and Choir are to be congratulated on the excellent character of their work. The services, and especially the very beautiful anthem, being particularly well rendered. Miss Cowan sang the solo with her accustomed sweetness and purity of tone.
