



STANDING RULES

FOR THE

CONSTITUTION & GOVERNMENT

OF THE

Rewfoundland Church Society.

I.—This Society shall be called " The Newfoundland Church Society."

II.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Patron, a President, Vice-Presidents (being the Rural Deans) a Treasurer and Secretary. The Committee of Management shall consist of the Officers of the Society, and of seventeen Lay Members of the Society, exclusive of the said Officers, of whom four shall be elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay, of whom seven shall be a quorum. The election of Lay Members of the Committee shall be as follows:—On Easter Tuesday in the year 1855, and on Easter Tuesday in every succeeding fourth year, a meeting of Electors resident in each Deanery shall be convened by the Senior Clergyman (or in the event of his omission so to do, by public notice) at some convenient hour and place.

of which notice shall be given during Divine Service in each Church in the Deanery, at least 7 days previously: at which meeting the Senior Clergyman, or in his absence some other person then to be chosen by the Members, shall preside, and at which meeting the Members present, whether in person or by proxies, Members of the Society and constituted by writing, shall elect, seriatim, their representatives to the Committee; provided that the persons elected may be resident in any other Deanery than that which they may be chosen to represent. The President. or in his absence, the Archdeacon of the Diocese, or Bishop's Commissary, shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Committee; and in addition to his vote as Member shall, when the votes on any question are equal, have a casting vote. All Clergymen of the Diocese shall be ex-officio honorary Members of the Committee, with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the said officers, of voting at its meetings. As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, or refusal to serve, of any of the said Lay Members, to appoint others or another in their or his places or place. a special meeting of Members of the Society, in such Deanery where the vacancy shall arise, shall be convened in like manner as the Easter Meeting; and the like notice shall be given of such special meeting, when the necessary number of Members, to replace those required, shall be in like manner elected.

III.—His Excellency the Governor for the time being shall be requested to accept the office of Patron: the Lord Bishop shall be President, and the Rural Deans Vice-Presidents of the Society.

IV.—All persons paying the annual sum of Tenshillings currency, shall be Members of the Society, with power to vote at the annual and other meetings.

V.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the funds, to the furtherance of the Gospel in this Island, under the recommendation and sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocess 7

—the objects to which such appropriation shall be made shall be as follows:—1st, towards the maintenance of the Clergy and licensed Lay-Readers—2nd, the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, and School-rooms—3rd, the supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books, and Religious Works and Tracts.

VI.—The Committee shall meet on the first Monday of every quarter at St. John's.

VII.—The Committee shall appoint, each year, two of their Members to Audit the Treasurer's Account.

VIII.—A Monthly Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held on the 2nd Wednesday in every Month, at 7 o'clock; and a General Annual Meeting of the Society on the 2nd Wednesday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon thereafter as the Bishop may appoint.

IX.—No existing law shall be repealed or altered, nor any rule established, except at a General Meeting of the Society, the proposed change having been first recommended by the President or the Committee, and in the latter case, approved by the President. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be convened by the President at any time on his own authority, or by the Committee, or by any twelve Members of the Society by a written requisition addressed to the Secretary.

X.—All Meetings shall be opened and closed with the Prayers recommended to be used at the Meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

XI.—The Members of the Church in every part of the Island, shall be invited to co-operate by forming Local Committees under the direction of the Clergy in on Mission or Parish.

XII.—No Mission or Clergyman of any Mission shall receive any allowance or assistance from the Society unless at least a list of the contributions, made in such

Mission to the Funds of the Society in the preceding year, shall have been duly forwarded to the President or to the Secretary, together with a return of all payments or offerings of money, not being fees for occasional Services.

Note.—While it is hoped that every Clergyman in the colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year, the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

PROCEEDINGS

At the Fourteenth Anniversary of "The Newfoundland Church Society," held at St. John's, 3rd July, 1855.

The Right Reverend the LORD BISHOP of the Diocese, President, in the Chair.

The Report of the Committee having been read by the Venerable Archdeacon BRIDGE, Pro-Secretary, and the Treasurer's Account submitted,—It was

Moved by T. BENNETT, Esq., J. P., seconded by J. S. CLIET, Esq. :-

That the Report now read be adopted, and printed, with the Treasurer's account, under the direction of the Secretary.

2.—Moved by Rev. T. M. Wood, the Minister of St. Thomas's, seconded by BRYAN ROBINSON, Esq., Q.C.:—

That this meeting acknowledges, with devout thankfulness, the mercy of Almighty God in prospering this Society during the past year.

3.—Moved by Hon. THOMAS Row, seconded by Rev. G. M. Johnson, of Portugal Cove :—

That this meeting respectfully tenders its thanks to His Excellency CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Esq., for having taken the Newfoundland Church Society under his Patronage; and would impress upon every Churchman throughout the Diocese the great and growing necessity which exists for increased exertion to enable the Society to carry out its sacred and important objects, and to supply the deficiencies in the means of maintaining Clergymen and otherwise promoting the interests of the Church of England, which have arisen, or may arise, from the diminution or withdrawal of the bounty of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

4.-Moved by C. F. BENNETT, Esq., seecnded by F. B. T. CARTER, Esq., M. H. A.:

That this meeting desires to record at the same time its grateful sense of the obligations under which the venerable Societies for Promoting Christian Knowledge and the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts have laid this Colony, and their unabated interest in the Church Societies of the other Colonial Dioceses.

5.—Moved by H. W. HOYLES, Esq., M. H. A., seconded by the Venerable Archdeacon Bridge, M. A.:—

That it shall be competent for the respective senior Clergyman in those Rural Deaneries in which the election of Lay-Representatives required by the 2nd Standing Rule, did not take place on last Easter Tuesday, to proceed with, and cause to be made such election at their earliest convenience in the manner prescribed by the Rule, as nearly as may be; and the persons se to be elected shall serve on the Committee of Management, as if chosen at the time hereinbefore appointed for that purpose.

6.—Moved by Rev. J. H. PHELPS, Vice President of the College, seconded by R. PROWSE, Esq., M. H. A.:

That F. C. K. Hepburn, Esq., be requested to accept the office of Treasurer in the place of George T. Brooking, Esq., who has left the Colony; and that the thanks of the Society are due and are hereby given to the Officers and Committee of the same for their services during the past year, and especially to the late Treasurer, for his performance of the duties of Treasurer since 1848, and for the liberal support which he has already given, and still continues, to the Church Society.

7.--Moved by E. HARVEY, Esq., seconded by W. H. Ellis, Esq., M. H. A.:-

That this meeting respectfully acknowledges the kindness of the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of the Diocess in presiding on this occasion.

REPORT, &C.

After the lapse of another year it again becomes the duty of your Committee to submit to you a Report of their proceedings, with such other matters of interest as relate to the Church in the Colony.

Office of Patron.

It is with very great pleasure that your Committee, first of all, inform you, that having been permitted to wait upon the Governor, Charles Henry Darling, Esquire, with an Address, tendering to His Excellency the congratulations of the Society on his safe arrival in this colony, and soliciting the honour of His patronage, in conformity with the 3rd Standing Rule, His Excellency was pleased to accede to that request, and also to notify to the Archdeacon his intention of contributing £30 per annum to the Society's funds.

The Address of your Committee, and the gracious Reply of the Governor were as follows:—

To His Excellency CHARLES HENRY DARLING,

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,-

The Officers and Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society, in offering to your Excellency their respectful and sincere congratulations on the arrival of yourself and family on these shores, beg permission to bring under your Excellency's notice the above Institution, and to solicit the honor of your accepting the office of Patron, in accordance with the 3rd Standing Rule of the Society.

Your Excellency having been already pleased to receive a copy of the last Report published by the Society, which contains its Rules and explains its objects, they will not trespass now on your valuable time with any lengthened exposition either of its constitution or of its They would but inform your Excellency briefly, that the Society was established, simultaneously with kindred Institutions in the other North American Dioceses, in the year 1834—that it has obtained, year by year, increasing favor and support among the Members of the Church of England, and especially since the year 1846,—that it has enjoyed the patronage of former Governors of this Colony—that its agency has been largely blessed of Almighty God in extending the inestimable benefits of true Religion along the Coasts of Newfoundland and Labrador,—and that it may be regarded as the association, through whose instrumentality the ministrations of our Reformed Church are to be permanently secured to her numerous and widely-scattered children within the limits of your Excellency's present Government.

In conclusion, the Officers and Committee of the Society assure your Excellency that their Prayers shall not be wanting for an abundant blessing on your administration of your high trust, as the Representative of our beloved Queen, that it may tend to the promotion of all the interests,—especially the best interests—of the people of this ancient dependency of the British Crown.

Appointment of Committee.

The new law adopted at the last Anniversary Meetting, regulating the future election of the Committee, came into operation on Easter Tuesday of this year. At the Meeting held in this town, the following Members of the Society were duly elected as the Representatives or Delegates for the Rural Deanery of Avalon, viz.—the Hon. Thomas Row, Eugenius Harvey, F. C. K. Herburn and P. G. Tessier, Esquires. Your Committee regret to have to state that the only other returns which have yet been received, are from the Rural Deanery of Conception Bay, where F. B. Carter, M. H. A., C. Crowdy, and W. Rendell, Esquires, were duly elected,—and from the Rural Deanery of Fortune Bay, which is represented on the Committee by H. W. Hoyles, Esquire, M. H. A., and J. B. Wood, Esquire.

The Rev. B. SMITH, Rural Dean of Trinity Bay has informed the Secretary, that at a meeting duly convened and held in Trinity, Delegates were elected, but two

of the gentlemen so elected having been also chosen elsewhere, no return has been made from that Deanery, and it is intended to proceed to a new election.

Your Committee, having been informed that in two Rural Deaneries no election of Lay-Representatives or Delegates was held on Easter Tuesday, as required by the 2nd Standing Rule, appointed a Sub-Committee, consisting of B. Robinson, H. W. Hoyles, and F. B. Carter, Esquires, to consider the best mode of making provision for such omissions; and in due course a Resolution framed by those gentlemen, will be submitted to this meeting, by the adoption of which, it is hoped and believed, the difficulties which have arisen will be removed.

Appropriation of Funds.

The appropriation of the Funds, was made, as usual, on an early day after the 25th of March, and the principal votes then passed by your Committee, were—

£836 9 0 towards the Salaries of Clergymen.

Collections for 1854.

The Collections in the different Missions, for 1854, were such in amount as to call for thankfulness from all who are interested in the Society's welfare, and to prove that the Society is advancing in the estimation of the members of our Church in the colony. They have not in all cases been equal to those of the preceding year, but the circumstances sufficiently account for any falling off, without leaving room to dispute what has just been affirmed, of the growing appreciation of the Society, as a necessary and faithful handmaid of our beloved Church.

St. John's is one place in which the Collection for 1854 is somewhat less than that of 1853;—and in explanation of this the Rector of the Parish writes:—

"I assribe the slight diminution of receipts for the year 1834 as compared with those for 1853—(I) to the circumstance of several special donations having been made to the Society in 1853—(2) to the bad fishery in 1854—(3) to the prevalence of the Cholera at the usual season of collecting the payments to the Society—and (4) to the failure of the Seal-fishery this Spring,—to which, as you know, we are accustomed to look to make up for deficiencies accruing in the preceding Autumn from an unsuccessful fishery during the Summer. I have generally collected between £30 and £40 from the Sealers—the last Spring I collected only a few Shillings. Indeed I applied to the crew of but one vessel,—not thinking it right to apply to others, when the catch was generally so small, and the necessaries of life so high."

The Rev. Mr. Colley writes :-

"The enclosed papers you will find are the accounts of the Subscriptions to the Newfoundland Church Society, collected in Fortune and Hermitage Bay, the Fall last past, 1854. They are a few pounds less than was sent the year before; but the reason is obvious. This Summer there was only one Clergyman for the two Missions: last year there were three, two at Harbor Briton, one at Grole, and those of the people who are in the least backward or unwilling to pay, are ever ready with an excuse; yet the fact, that many who have only seen their Pastor once, and some few, not at all this summer and notwithstanding have paid their subscription, proves that they are anxious for his visits, and willing to contribute according to their ability towards his support among them."

The Rev. Mr. KINGWELL writes :-

"I now forward by way of Tizzard's Harbour, the list of Contributions for the past year, in behalf of the Newfoundland Church Society, with an order on Messrs. Clift, Wood & Co. for the amount. The Codfishery the past Summer has throughout the Mission been very limited, to which in a great measure may be attributed the small collection in favour of the Society."

The Rev. Mr. SALL writes :-

"Agreeably to your request, I send you a copy of my last year's collections for the Church Society. Besides the collection for the Church Society, there was one made to aid in the purchase of a Bell for Bonaviata Church; this, I think, lessened the former collection. The people's donation of Firewood amounted to about £9 12s. If you insert this, together with the sum given towards the Bell last year it will make about £63 3s. 2d. collected in this harboar, for Church and Missionary purposes. I fancy it would have a good effect on future collections; let; the people see that the smallest of their gifts is not forgotten."

In other Missions, however, your Committee have the pleasure of reporting that larger payments have been made to the Society, in 1854, then in any former year; —amongst these, the Mission of Island Cove, of which the Rev. Charles Walsh is in charge, is conspicuous, —the collection there having amounted to £66. The amount collected in 1853 was £34 18 6.

The Rev. W. Shannon has likewise returned from the Mission of Brigus an amount exceeding what has been before collected from the several congregations (in Brigus, Burnt Head, and Salmon Cove) under his Pastoral care, £67.

The Rev. B. SMITH, Rural Dean of Trinity has remitted to the Treasurer £42 15 6 towards the stipend of his Assistant, the Rev. Mr. CROUCH;—and an account has been forwarded by the same Rev'd gentleman to your Committee exhibiting a total sum collected for Church purposes within his Mission, during 1854, of £79. At Port-de-Grave, from which no return was made for several years, the Rev. Mr. HARVEY has made a collection exceeding £60.

Clergy.

Since the last Anniversary, the Lord Bishop of the Diocese has made some few changes in the location of clergy. The Rev.J.G.MOUNTAIN, M. A., late Rural Dean of Fortune Bay, has been transferred to St. John's, where he holds the office of Principal of the Theological College, and performs the pastoral work in the Out-Harbours.

Mr. Mountain has been succeeded at Harbour Briton by the Rev. W. K. White, and Mr. White at Harbour Buffett by the Rev. Mr. Meen, formerly a Student in the Collegiate Institution, and who was admitted to Deacon's Orders on Trinity Sunday, 1954.

The Rev. J. B. FREER has been removed to Bermuda, to serve the new Church in Hamilton, and the Rev. E. Colley from Grole to Hermitage Cove, where a handsome Brick Church has been erected at the sole expence of Thos. Hunt, Esq. of London, and a Parsonage House, partly by assistance from this Society.

The Committee mention with thankfulness that during the past winter only one Clergyman has had occasion to absent himself from his duties on account of ill-health, viz.:—the Rev. S. Crosse, of Herring Neck, whose place has been supplied during the winter by the Rev. J. DARRELL.

. Churches and Parsonages.

Of Churches, the building of which has been assisted by grants from the Society, the only one which has been consecrated since the last anniversary, is that of Portugal Cove. The Consecration took place on St. Peter's Day, the Church being set apart to its holy uses by the name of the Church of St. Peter the Apostle. The Building, which is a good specimen of a wooden Church, was designed by the former Missionary, the Rev. W. Grey, whose friends in England contributed largely towards its erection:—the labour and responsibility of bringing the sacred work to its completion devolved on his successor, the Rev. G. M. Johnson, who with great zeal and energy, under God's blessing, triumphed over considerable difficulties, and carried the work to a successful and happy termination. Your Committee report with satisfaction that Churches in course of erection at St. Lawrence, in the Mission of Burin, at Oderin, Hermitage Cove, at Lamaline, and on the coast of Labrador, at Forteau and Battle Harbour, are in that state of forwardness, that they may be consecrated at the Lord Bishop's next visit to those places. Churches are likewise in course of erection at Bay-de-Verd, Old Bonaventure, Nipper's Harbour, and Lower Burgeo.

The Parsonage Houses at Burin and in Hermitage Cove, towards which grants have been made by the Society, and the latter of which has been largely assisted by friends of the Rev. G. MOUNTAIN, have been

at Lamaline, also, is now occupying as a Parsonage, a commodious house, purchased for that purpose, and to which a grant was made from the funds of this Society.

Episcopal Offices.

On the Sunday after the Christmas Ember-week, the Lord Bishop held an Ordination, at which the Rev. Messrs. Phelps and Freer were advanced to the Priest-The Bishop held a confirmation in the Cathedral Church, on Sunday, 26th November, 1854, when 150 persons renewed and ratified their Baptismal promises. At the end of last year his Lordship left St. John's for Bermuda, and your Committee, gratefully remembering the liberality of our Brethren in that part of the Diocese in contributing towards the restoration of our Church after the calamitous fire of 1846, feel that they will be only giving expression to the sentiments of the Members of the Society in offering to those kind, though unknown, friends, their best congratulations on the recent consecration of a portion of a noble Church, in the capital of those Islands, in which, it is hoped, many souls will be fed and nourished unto life eternal. In connection with this event, the Committee have much atisfaction in reporting that in this Church, on last Trinity Sunday, the Rev. C. P. K. COOMBE, formerly a student in the Theological Institution in this town, was advanced to the order of Priesthood.

Asylum,

One of the most gratifying events which it is the duty of your Committee to include in this Report, is the meeting held in this town on the day appointed by His Excellency the Governor as a Thanksgiving day for our relief from the Cholera, for the purpose of establishing a House of Charity, or Home for Widows and Orphans, as some testimony of the Divine goodness both in having preserved us and our families during the prevalence of that epidemic, and in having removed from the Colony to terrible a visitation. The call addressed by the Lord

Bishop to his flock and the friends of the poor, in a Pastoral Letter issued on the preceding Christmas Day, was cheerfully and liberally responded to. The subscriptions to the Building Fund, which have been made in every instance without solicitation, amount already to nearly £700, and those for the annual maintenance to to about £90.

Among the former your Committee cannot but refer especially to one contribution of £50 stg. This was given by John Rainey, Esq., of Bath, England, who, having been shipwrecked on this coast in the Autumn of last year, has thus shewn his gratitude to God for his preservation and his appreciation of some little kindnesses received from the Bishop. Mr. Rainey has also presented a Carpet for the Apse and Eastern portion of the Cathedral.

Correspondence.

The Committee regret to state that the Reports from the Clergy of their proceedings, and of the state of their respective Missions, during the year, have been fewer than usual, which may partly be accounted for by the fact that the venerable Parent Society for the Propagation of the Gospel now requires quarterly reports from each of their Missionaries. These reports are duly forwarded through the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, or, in his absence, through the Commissary. Your Committee, however, have as much pleasure in submitting, as they are sure the Society will have in receiving, the following extracts:—

The Rev. W. K. WHITE writes from Harbour Briton, under data of March 24, 1855, of his old Mission:—"As I made the collection on behalf of the Church Society in the Mission of Harbour Buffett, Placentia Bay, I think it due to the inhabitants of that Mission to report the readiness with which they paid their subscriptions, and the ease with which a collection, the largest ever made, was effected. Had I not been so very unsettled, expecting almost daily to leave the Bay for this Mission, I have no doubt it would have been my pleasing duty to have reported a much larger amount. Several instances have occurred of a most encouraging nature; in two or three cases persons who have always refused to subscribe beretofore, have called upon me and asked me to receive their figh;

and no event has taken place to render the duty of receiving the annual contributions painful or unplement. At Oderin I was more than usually gratified; for not only was the fish collected by some young men without any care or charge required from me, but one young man on Saturday night even carried 80 lbs. of fish on his back nearly the whole length of the harbour, lest I should be gone on Monday before he could ship it on board my boat. I witnessed evidences of the warmest feelings, even enthusiasm, towards the Church at Oderin; and I have been pleased to learn that since my departure the Church has been painted externally and much work done—as usual by free labour. I think it can hardly be said of any other Church in Newfoundland, that all the work on the spot has been done by the people, without any paid labour of any kind, which is the case at Oderin. At Harbour Buffet a Tower has been commenced, and much labor given; it should not be forgotten that the people at Harbour Buffet pay all the annual expenses of Divine Service, and assist their Church School in addition to the subscriptions reported. The clergyman has paid no freight for the carriage of his supplies for these seven years past. The Church School under the direction and control of the Clergyman, has been well attended, and on Sundays upwards of 60 children and adults have been present. At Arnold's Cove a subscription was presented to the Church Society from every house, which ought to and might have been the case at Spencer's Cove, if a collection was there at the proper time. It is pleasing to see the exertions of poor people among their neighbours on behalf of the Society, and the good effects which result. In this Mission it is a sad drawback to the success of the Society, that its friends are so scattered, and from the nature of the settlements, unable to combine for the common good. If honest reputable men would interest themselves in the Society's affairs, their humble station would be no impediment to their use. fulness in their various harbors."

· And on April 21 :-

"I wrote you on Easter Tuesday with the return of election for Delegates (Messrs. Hoyles and J. B. Wood) for this Deanery, and I hope you have received it in safety. Since that time I have been cruising and have visited all places between this and Belloram and Connaigre Bay.

I am very busy, and I hope doing good. On Easter Sunday I collected at the offertory on behalf of the Patriotic Fund, and I had the pleasure of placing on the Holy Table £13 10s., which I think is creditable. My Churchwardens advise this sum heading a list which Mr. Ellis, at my suggestion, has opened in his office."

The Rev. Mr. KINGWELL of Moreton's Herboar writes:—"I think I have reason to fear that a satisfactory sum will not be realized until another Clergyman be established at Ward's Harbor, or in its vicinity. Could such an object be effected, there would not only be a more manifest claim upon the members of the Church,

but the clergyman resident among them would have an opportunity of frequently impressing upon their min is the duty of contributing towards the support of their ministers. It, however, afforde me comfort and encouragement to know that there are some who evince a sincere desire for the velfare of the Society, both by exerting their influence and showing the example. Sincerely desiring a continual increase of the funds of the Society, and the furthere ance of its objects, &c."

The Rev. Mr. Shannon writes from Brigus, June 13, 1855 :--"I have much pleasure in stating, that the claim of the Society on the members of the Church in this Mussion for increased support are beginning to be more fully recognized, and a more lively interest taken in its operations. In proof of this statement, I have only to refer you to the list for the past year, which exhibits an increase of subscriptions over that of any previous year. It may be supposed by some persons unacquainted with fact, that in a wealthy place, such as Brigus is represented to be, the amount of contributions to the Society ought to be far larger than it really is; but when it is remembered that we are much less in number than other congregations around us, and, excepting a few families, comparatively poorer, they will find that in this respect, we are not much, if at all, behind any other Mission in the Diocese. I must not, in justice to the subscribers, omit to mention, that in scarcely a single instance was I obliged to call on them for their contribution; they were either brought or sent to my own residence,-a circumstance very gratifying to myself, and which cannot, I am sure, but be pleasing to all who wish well to the Society."

The Rev. Mr. Colley writes:—"A growing desire for spiritual things menifests itself throughout the Bay, and the moral character of the people generally is greatly improved, so that the seed sown has not been in vain, but is, I feel sure, springing up unto everlating life. Our beautiful little Church at Hermitage Cove, will, D.V., be ready for Consecration by the middle of the coming summer; the fittings and other articles for its completion, are expected here in April. The frost has done little or no damage this winter; what is done, will be of little consequence, and very little hindrance. The Parsonage, we expect, will be ready for occupation in May, when, D.V., we shall remove from Grule."

The Rev. JULIAN MORETON writes from Greenspond:—"The whole amount of my collection for the Church in the past year is £52 8s. 3d., which includes £13 paid in reduction of debts upon the Church at Pincherd's Island; £12 19s. 6d. contributed to a fund now being raised to build a new Church in Greenspond; and £26 8s. 9d. for the general fund of the Church Society. The first of these amounts was paid by the contributors to the creditors of the Church, the second and last I have remitted to the Treasurer. Besides the contributions of money, a good deal of timber, and

some labour have been given towards the new Church in Greenspond, by many persons. These cannot be more particularly acknowledged here, but credit will be given to each contributor of material or labour, when the work is, by God's blessing, brought to completion. About 100 persons worked for the new Church on New Year's Day, in bringing timber together from different parts of the Harbour to the site of the building; and some others have constructed a saw-pit and sawn board or dressed timber. A great many persons have promised to pay a rate of 1s. in the pound upon the preceeds of the ice voyage, if their share in the voyage amount to £5 or more, each. The list of these contributions cannot be given until the sharemen have received "the rise" upon their weels. It is encouraging to find my people willing to undertake the building of a new Church, after such an unsuccessful fishery as that of the past year; and I think the mode of contributing, by a tate upon their earnings, must commend itself to every one as being strictly fair, and, what is more, Scriptural. I accept it as s token that people own their duty, when they do not require their Clergymen to ask them for their offerings, but bring them freely, and I am happy to say that in the past year, as in the year before, many persons brought their contributions to me before I had asked them from any one. Such offerings must always be doubly valuable. Some of the sums given were truly liberal compered with the means of the persons giving, and some who gave, I know found it difficult to spare what they so freely brought.

The Rev. CHARLES WALSH writes from Upper Island Cove : --"I beg to transmit to you for the information of the members of the Church Society, so far as the Committee think proper, that I can testify to the general willingness of the people of this mission to support the objects of the Church Society. It is searcely four years since I came to reside among them, and during that time the duty of contributing to the support of their minister has been better understood and attended to by them .- And it is not only in respect or their contributions to the Church Society, (or as they commonly understand the payment to be to their minister,) that I can speak with satisfaction, but also as to their general behaviour. In this respect also there has been a considerable improvement, and, I believe, that many persons here, if they were severally asked, would bear similar testimeny. I mention this, because formerly disorderly conduct was too common in this place, (Upper Island Cove,) so much so, that the place had quite a name for it, and now happily, in this respect, we have begun a retrograde course. The yearly subacriptions in the four settlements of the mission amount to sixty six pounds for the last year. And here, I think it right to eay, to prevent a possible muspprehension that may arise in the minds of some persons in St. John's and elsewhere who are aware of the poverty of this district, that nearly all the subscriptions are from brions that do not generally receive poor relief from the government. It is owing to a moderate increase of subscriptions from

several of the old aubscribers in each of the settlements, and from the subscriptions of many young men who have never before given anything towards the support of their pastor, that I must attribute my tolerably good collection. What I predicted two years since as probable, viz, : that the Church Society's collection, in course of time, I hoped would be £60 instead of £40, has been thus early Much, nay, everything seems to depend upon the Clergyman doing his part in bringing home to all classes of persons, and particularly to young men who have their own earnings, the duty of supporting God's minister, &c. I trust I shall not be thought vain or presumptuous in expressing this opinion, or in speaking of what is done in a pecuniary point of view in my mission. At present we are far behind in one respect, and that is with regard to a place of ahode for the minister. There is no parsonage house, nor any prospect of one at present.—I am happy to say that the proposed improvements to the Church at Bryant's Cove have for the most part been effected, i. e, as far as the funds placed at my disposal by his Lordship the Bi-hop, and the Committee of the Church Society would enable me. The people of Bryant's Cove assisted most willingly in contributing such labour and material as was in their power. Several of them assisted at the alteration and enlargement for a fortnight, and some even for three weeks and longer much praise could hardly be bestowed upon many of them as they kept to the work while there was anything to be done, and this all gratuitously. It is satisfactory also to be enabled to state that the tower to the Church at Spaniard's Bay has, after lying many years, been finished by the people, with the exception of the windows-Had the seal fishery been good, a subscription towards painting Spaniard's Bay Church was to have been made, -As things were, however, it was of no use to think of it. I trust the above, or por-tions of it will, be deemed interesting to the Committee of the Church Society, and I hope, please God, my life is spared amongst this portion of Christ's fleck for a few years, to report still better things of them."

The Rev. Mr. BLACKMORE writes from Bay Roberts:—" In reply to your request for information for the next Report of the Church Society, I beg to say, that I have but little of particular interest to communicate; still this mission of Bay Roberts is in general, I humbly hope, prospering. Through God's blessing upon my efforts, the enlargement of the Church which was begun two years ago is now completed, and I have had the pleasure of seeing it well filled on repeated occasions with (judging from their demeanour) a devout and attentive congregation. This enlargement gives a hundred additional sittings. The erection of another Church in the adjoining settlement of Coley's Point has been commenced and proceeded with as far as the putting up of the frame to the wailplate. The untoward weather in the winter, preventing the hauling of timber, has proved a hindrance to its further advancement at present 4 but, D.V., it will go on, for the people have a

mind to the work. I have the further satisfaction of mentioning that my collections the past year have reached a larger sum than was ever raised before in this mission: it is true that a portion was raised for the Church on the Point, but exclusive of this it still shews an increase, and this has been brought about not by any extraordinary pressure, but in a great measure by the freewill offerings of the people. Among these offerings I must not omit to mention the valuable gift of a Silver Communion Service for the use of the Church. These things tend, I think, to shew that at least there is a degree of attachment to our Church and her Services prevailing here indicative of good; may the attachment increase, and all attendant blessings abound, and to God be all the glory and all the praise!"

The Rev. G. M. Johnson, of Portugal Cove, writes :-"The only unusual occurrence in the past year has been the holding a Church Society meeting in this place. This meeting was held on the 31st January in the largest room in the parsonage House. The Archdescor, the Rev. J. F. Phelps, and some gentlemen of St. John's came over to assist me on that occasion. The room, which holds a considerable number of people, was crowded, and all seemed to take a great interest in the proceedings. The Archdeacon presided, and explained the nature and working of the Church Society generally. A paper drawn up by myself, gave information as to its working in this mission particularly, and the duty of the people in relation to this Society; and the business was closed by suitable resolutions proposed by the gentlemen of St. John's, and some of the people belonging to this place. The whole proceedings seemed to give great satisfaction. Such meetings give a very good opportunity of explaining the duty incumbent upon the people of giving to the best of their ability for the support and furtherance of religion, and of pointing out the best means of fulfilling that duty. Though the people of my mission are very poor, I think they recognise this duty of giving, and are disposed to perform it. One very gratifying instance of this occurred when I was making my last collection. An old man, the oldest member of the Church here, quite past all labour, whom I had not spoken to, not thinking him able to give, came to my house, and asked me if I would receive so small a sum as a shilling for the Church Society. He added that it was all he was able to give, indeed all he had, and that he was almost ashamed to offer it, but that he would be very proud if I would accept it—he only wished he could give more. The circumstance gave me much pleasure, and I did not let the old man depart without assuring him I would not only gladly accept it, but that I thought more highly of his offering than all the others, although I am sure very many give very willingly, yet his only was a purely spontaneous offering. I could not help thinking of the widow's mite, and our Lord's comment upon it, nor could I refrain from applying it to this old man's case, and encouraging him by reminding him of it.

Meetings of Branch Societies.

Your Committee have received information of two meetings in aid of the Society held in the course of the year, at Trinity and Portugal Cove; and they would take this opportunity of respectfully recommending to the Clergy, in their several missions, the imitation of those examples, in the belief that no plan is better adapted for bringing their flocks acquainted with the character and operations of the Society, and obtaining their support of its great and sacred objects.

In concluding this Report, your Committee desire with humble and heartfelt gratitude to acknowledge the "goodness and mercy" which have followed, and still follow, the Society's operations. In the brief review which has been taken of the past year, many gratifying and encouraging circumstances have been presented to your notice, giving promise of a bright and prosperous future. Your Committee are fain to believe that the members of the Society will never forget how much, under God, the advancement of the interests of the Church depends on their sympathy and assistance, their prayers and their alms. If to any the words of our blessed Lord, "Freely ye have received," are applicable, they are surely applicable to us, and to all members of the Church in this Colony;—and what should follow, but ready and liberal obedience to the command of the same Lord, "Freely give?"
