RESOLUTIONS

Passed by the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron; sanctioned and approved by the Bishop of the Diocese.

Moved by the Rev. G. J. R. Salter, M.A., seconded by Rev. F. W. Sandys, D.D.:

Whereas it frequently happens that persons from various parts of the Diocese, and from other Dioceses, make application for assistance in building Churches, Parsonages, &c., to the Clergy and Laity of the Church throughout the Diocese, without any recognized authority and proof of the facts of the case for which application is made:—Resolved, therefore, that the Bishop be respectfully requested to establish as a rule in the Diocese that no Clergyman or Layman be permitted to collect money for any Church purpose beyond the bounds of his own Mission, or to proceed to any other Diocese for the same purpose without the sanction and approval of the Bishop, given as a heading to his Subscription List; and that it be the duty of such Collector to communicate with each Clergyman before he makes a collection in his Parish: and that, on his return from his collection tour, every person collecting shall present his Subscription List to the Bishop, and account for all moneys received. And further, that no person from any other Diocese shall make collections within this Diocese without first obtaining the sanction of its Bishop, under his hand and seal.

Moved by the Rev. F. W. Sandys, D.D., seconded by the Rev. G. J. R. Salter, M.A.:

Resolved, That inasmuch as great inconvenience and loss arise from the delay that too often takes place in making the collections for the Church Society and transmitting them to the Secretary, the Clergy are therefore requested to make the collections on some Sunday during the month appointed for each Collection, and to see that they are forwarded without delay to the Secretary.

Moved by Rev. C. C. Brough, A.M., seconded by G. Ryland, Esq.:

Resolved, That all applications for grants of money, books, &c., shall be submitted for the consideration of the Standing Committee previous to action of the Society thereon.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

ADOPTED BY THE SOCIETY AND CONFIRMED BY THE BISHOP, SEPTEMBER
22ND, 1858.

INCORPORATED FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

FIRST—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Huron, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

SECONDLY—For the encouragement of education, and for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

THIRDLY—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

FOURTHLY—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

FIFTHLY—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage-houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

I.

That before the Society shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following prayers shall be said:—

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings; with Thy most gracious favor, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Queen Victoria, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honor and glory. Prosper with thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

“O MISERICORDIOUS God, who has made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldst the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live: have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels and Heretics, and also upon all those heathen nations upon which the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone; especially the Indians of this continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*”

“OUR FATHER, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*”

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED,

“ALMIGHTY God, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving-kindness, to us and to all men: more particularly for the providential support by which this society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all, for Thy inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace and for the hope of glory, which thou hast given us, in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ: to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*”

“The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*”

II.

That the Society shall consist of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, and of all Clergymen and Laymen who shall contribute to its funds.

III.

That the Lord Bishop of the Diocese be President, and the Dignitaries within the Diocese be Vice-Presidents of the Society.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of the Diocese, of the members appointed by the charter, and of so many of the other members

as shall be elected members of the Corporation at the meetings to be from time to time holden, on the day and at the place appointed by the by-laws of the Corporation for its stated meetings.

V.

That every incorporated member of the Society shall subscribe not less than five dollars annually, to the funds of the Society, or contribute not less than fifty dollars in one sum, or land to the value of one hundred dollars; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary on the first day of April in each year, to notify all incorporated members who have not paid for the current year, and at the meeting in the month of June in each and every year, to make a return of those who have not paid up the five dollars for the year ending the 31st day of May previous, and such defaulters shall cease to be incorporated members of the said Society.

VI.

That there shall be a Standing Committee (three of whom shall be a quorum,) to prepare the business for the meetings of the Society.

That the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Solicitor be *ex-officio* members of the Standing Committee.

That the other members of the Standing Committee, not exceeding twenty in number, being ten Clergymen, and ten Laymen, shall be elected by the Society, out of its incorporated members, at the Annual Meeting in June.

VII.

That this Society shall at the quarterly meeting in June choose one or more Vice-Presidents, in addition to the Dignitaries; one or more Treasurers; two or more Auditors; one Secretary; and such other officers as shall be thought necessary, provided that none but members of the Society be eligible to any office.

VIII.

That the paid officers of the Society shall be the Secretary, and an Assistant if required, and that the former shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the President and Standing Committee.

IX.

That if any vacancy occur by the death, removal, or resignation of any officer, notice of such vacancy shall be given to the Incorporated members of the Society and the President shall appoint a successor until the next meeting of the Corporation.

X.

That the Corporation shall meet in London, on the third Thursday in the months of March, September and December, and in the month of June on some day during the week in which the Synod meets, provided, however, that the Bishop shall have the power of changing the time of meeting in any of the said months if he shall see good cause, and the annual public meeting of the Society shall take place on some evening during the week in June in which the Synod meets. The President or Standing Committee shall have power to call a special meeting of the Corporation at any time.

XI.

That no act done in any meeting of the Society shall be valid and effectual unless the President or some one of the Vice-Presidents shall be present at such meeting.

XII.

That with regard to all meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any by-laws, rules or regulations, it is to be specially noticed that by the act of the Legislature, 7 Vic., ch. 68, it is enacted that no act of the Society, or meeting of the Corporation, shall be valid unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto. And, further, that no constitution, by law, rule, or regulation of the Society; nor any abrogation, repeal, change, or

alteration of the same, shall be of any force or effect until it shall have been confirmed by the Bishop, in writing, under his hand.

XIII.

That minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each meeting of the Society the minutes of the preceding meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

XIV.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the 15th day of May, in each year, and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

XV.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take minutes of the proceedings of the general meetings and committees, prepare the annual report of the Society, attend meetings of the associations throughout the Diocese under the direction of the President, and take the superintendence of the affairs and the accounts of the Society in all its departments.

XVI.

That in order more fully to promote the objects of the Society, each congregation, in the persons of its clergyman and church-wardens, shall be a sub-association in correspondence, through its chairman, the clergyman, with the Parent Society, and may be denominated "*The Parochial Association of the Church Society.*" The Committee, which shall consist of the above named, with power to add to their number, shall meet so often and at such periods as they themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavor, by every means in their power, to augment the resources of the Society.— All moneys raised to be transmitted to the Secretary of the Parent Society.

XVII.

That four collections be made annually, the proceeds of one of which shall be devoted to the Widow and Orphans' Fund, and that of the other three to Missionary purposes; and at such other times and for such purposes as the Bishop may direct. The collections to be forwarded to the Secretary of the Society. It shall be the duty of every clergyman to give notice of these collections, and to call the attention of their congregations to the importance of the objects, and their claims for liberal support.

XVIII.

That all moneys shall be paid by cheques on the Treasurer, signed by the President and counter-signed by the Secretary.

RESOLUTIONS

PASSED AT THE THIRD ANNUAL MEETING, HELD ON THE
20TH JUNE, 1861.

The Annual Meeting of the Church Society was held in the City Hall, London, on Thursday evening, June 20th, 1861. The chair was taken by the President, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, at 7 o'clock, p. m.— The Bishop read the appointed prayers. The Secretary read the report.

Moved by A. Shade, Esq., seconded by A. Greer, Esq., supported by Rev. J. McLean, M. A.,—

1. That the report now read be received and adopted, and that it be published for circulation in the Diocese.

Moved by J. Keefer, Esq., seconded by P. Roe, Esq., supported by Rev. J. Gunne,—

2. That this meeting desires to express its humble thankfulness to Almighty God for the measure of success which has attended the efforts of the Society for the past year.

Moved by L. Lawrason, Esq., seconded by H. Johnson, Esq., supported by Rev. E. Sullivan, A. B.,—

3. That the very favorable report which has reached us of the increasing prosperity of the great religious societies in the parent country calls for the devout thankfulness of all the members of the Church throughout the world, and should stimulate us to emulate such a noble example.

Moved by Hon. G. J. Goodhue, seconded by Rev. F. W. Sandys, D. D.,—

4. That when we consider the vast and increasing population of this Diocese, now containing nearly half a million of souls, and the very inadequate provision made for their evangelization, we feel it to be the imperative duty of the members of the Church to put forth all their energies to advance the interests of the Church Society.

THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF
The Incorporated Church Society
OF THE
DIOCESE OF HURON.

In presenting their Third Annual Report, the Standing Committee feel that they cannot better begin than by acknowledging the good providence and watchful care of our Heavenly Father, who has not only brought us in safety to the close of our third year's operations, but has so far stamped his approval upon the labors of this Society that, when again rendering up their account to the Society, the Committee can show a further increase to the income intrusted to them to forward the important objects for which this Society is established. Last year the income amounted to \$6,387.63, which was an increase of \$2,846.75 over the income of the previous year. This year the income of the Society, as derived from the Diocese, has reached the sum of \$7,771.41, being a further increase of \$1,383.78; and when we remember that the increase of the second year was the work of twelve months, as compared with eight months of the first year, your committee feel that they have great cause for thankfulness for the success of the past year; and, as from God alone cometh every good and perfect gift, as well the willing mind as the ability to give, *so, therefore, to him be all the glory, and all the praise.*

INCOME.

The income for the present year has been derived from the following sources, viz.:

In addition to this, as the accounts will shew, a large sum has been received from the various investments and other funds, which has been credited to the several accounts, but none of this can be considered a part of the annual income of the Society except the above, which is the product of the various subscriptions, collections and donations sent to the Society during the past year.

PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION AND LIFE AND ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The sum received on this account is \$3,938.21. Of this, \$895 has been carried to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, in accordance with the by-law regulating that fund, and the balance (viz., \$3,043.21,) to the General Purposes Account. Your Committee would here notice that no less than eight persons have become entitled, by their subscriptions during the past year, to be elected life members of this Society. Of these, however, seven reside beyond the bounds of this diocese, which, while it calls for thankfulness for the interest displayed in the welfare of this Society by friends in other dioceses, should also act as an incentive to many within our own bounds, who are able, and, we trust, will prove willing, to follow so good an example, and "go and do likewise."

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The sum received for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund during the year, from all sources, including investments, is \$2,917.02. The pensions paid to Widows during the year amount to \$400, and the sum paid for investments amounts to \$1,579.69, which, deducted from the sum received, including the balance on hand last year, leaves to the credit of this fund \$1,776.91, out of which about \$1,600 will be immediately invested.

During the past year one clergyman has been taken from us by the hand of death—the Rev. R. F. Campbell, one who labored long in this part of Canada, now the Diocese of Huron—leaving behind him a widow to be added to our list, which makes three pensioners on the Widows'

and Orphans' Fund. The income from investments belonging to this fund will soon amount to about \$750; thus, *one more* widow, at the present rate of pensions, would more than absorb the annual product of our invested funds. This shows how necessary it is to seek in every way to add to this fund, if it is to be at all proportionate to the probable future claims upon it.

MISSION FUND.

The balance to the credit of the Mission Fund last year was \$1,521.31, and, in addition to this there has been received, for the support of this fund, during the year, \$4,560.63, to which has been added \$500 from the surplus interest of the Commutation Fund, and \$500 from the General Purposes Fund, after estimating as near as can be the probable expenses of the Society for the current year, making together \$5,560.63, and after deducting the various grants for outfits and payments towards missionaries' salaries, &c., there remains to the credit of the Mission Fund \$2,300.05 to commence the current year.

DEPOSITORY FUND.

The sum of \$386.18 was realized by the collection on Thanksgiving Day, being a small increase on the collections of the previous year. This, together with the amount received for sales of prayer books and hymn books, has been paid out for books during the year, including 150 copies of a Domestic Commentary on the whole Bible, in four volumes, suitable for family worship, which by the expressed wish of a number of clergymen and laymen, have been procured from the publisher in England, and which can now be obtained from the Secretary by those who desire to secure a copy. This account appears to be in arrear, but there is a large stock of books on hand, which much more than covers the present debt.

COMMUTATION FUND.

There has been received on account of this fund \$13,360 for debentures matured during the year, and from this, after paying \$212 due by this fund at the end of last year, and \$8,499 for investments, and \$3,474 to the credit of the interest account, to repay the money borrowed from the bank, and to enable that fund to meet the current salaries, there remains \$1,175 now on hand to be invested. The interest account of this fund has thus not only paid the salaries chargeable on it during the past year, but from the surplus, \$500 have been carried to the credit of the mission fund, in accordance with the mission fund by-law.

EPISCOPAL FUND.

This fund is gradually improving, as may be seen by the report of the committee appointed to manage it, which is published with this report. Still, however, the annual income derived from this fund is not sufficient to meet the Episcopal stipend, even at the lowest sum required by the Governor General, which is the sum now paid to the Bishop; further exertions, therefore, will have to be made ere long to put this fund upon a better footing. Your committee regret to be obliged to state here that the application which was made during the past year to the trustees of the Colonial Bishops' Fund, for further assistance for this fund, has been without success; to the diocese, therefore, we must now look, in great measure, to place this fund on a sounder basis, and as there are many persons who have come among us since this fund was raised, and who have not had an opportunity of contributing to an object in which they are equally interested, we doubt not but that much in this way will yet be added to this fund. And here your committee would thankfully acknowledge a legacy of \$400 bequeathed to this fund, and received during the past year, from a farmer in the Township of London—the late R. Isaacs—and, judging from the experience of past ages in our fatherland, public attention has only to be drawn to this manner of assisting religious societies to induce many, as wealth increases in our midst, to leave a lasting token behind them of sympathy and interest in this and similar funds. By the arrangement entered into with the Bishop last year, the interest of the episcopal fund has, since July the 1st last, met the episcopal income at its present rate, and it will continue to meet our engagements with the Bishop for some months longer. But your committee would remind the society that we are indebted a sum of \$4,000 to the Bishop, upon which interest has also to be paid, and that the Episcopal income is put down to the lowest sum named by the government, which many think not sufficient, and that it should be increased as soon as possible; this, therefore, is an additional reason why further exertion should be made to place the Episcopal Fund of this diocese on a better footing. Moreover, the Province of Canada West, lately the Diocese of Toronto, has been again subdivided, and a new diocese formed from the eastern part of it, and within the last few days its first Bishop has been selected by the united suffrages of its clergy and laity. While, therefore, your committee congratulate this Society and the Church at large on the consummation of what has been so long desired, they firmly believe that churchmen

in the Diocese of Huron will not rest satisfied until the fund for the support of its Bishop is quite equal to that of any other Canadian diocese. In the last session of the Provincial Parliament, an act was passed—and which is now law—to complete the transfer of lands held within this diocese, by the Church Society of Toronto and others, to the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, and further, to empower the Church Society to sell such lands where it is thought to be for the benefit of the parties interested. In obtaining this act, we are again indebted to the kind offices of those members of the legislature, who assisted in obtaining our act of incorporation. Meetings for the Church Society were held during the past year in almost every congregation of the diocese, which were attended by deputations sent forth by the Bishop, who were everywhere most kindly received, and your committee believe that a deep interest has thus been aroused in behalf of the work of the Church Society throughout the whole diocese, as shown by the collections for the Mission Fund made at these meetings, which last year amounted to \$796.75, being an excess of \$275.11 over those of the previous year. When reviewing the work of the Society for the past twelve months, your committee feel that much has been done, but when they look forward to the future, they feel that still more remains to be done, and that therefore it is necessary to put forth still greater exertions. Last year at this period there were sixty-seven clergymen in the diocese, now there are seventy-two. Still what are they for the extent of country embraced by this diocese, or for the supply of the spiritual wants of the population with which its townships teem, now numbering nearly half a million, and a large proportion of these will, we believe, be found to be members of the United Church of England and Ireland. Your committee would therefore desire earnestly to impress upon every churchman within the diocese the necessity of assisting in the great work we have in hand, according to his ability, by rendering up for God's work a portion of that intrusted to his care, and then, indeed, we believe that, great as have been our past mercies, greater still will be poured upon us. For then, in the words of the Psalmist: "Then we shall see the earth bring forth her increase, and God, even our God, will give us his blessing."

All of which is respectfully submitted.

REPORT OF THE EPISCOPAL FUND COMMITTEE.

The Committee appointed to manage the Episcopal Fund securities beg to report that they have endeavored, during the past year, to bring the securities in class B into such a position as would warrant their being placed in Class A.

The present state of the fund is as follows:—

In addition to this there are securities and notes representing \$8,141.90, most of which are considered so bad that the committee recommend that for the present they be written off, as it is useless to burden the fund with securities the greater part of which will never yield any return. The Committee, however, will not lose sight of these securities, and should any portion of them prove hereafter available, they will be added to class A. The following statement will show the improvement effected during the past year:—

Such is the present state of the Capital Fund; and with regard to the Interest Fund your Committee have to state that it has not only paid the Bishop's stipend in full since July the 1st last, and the interest on \$4,000 due his Lordship by the Fund, but has also met very heavy expenses connected with the King-st. property, and has paid the account of the Solicitor of the late Episcopal Fund Committee, and your Committee have full expectation that, even in its present state the fund will be able to meet all its liabilities for nearly another year, without asking any assistance from the Church Society, besides which they indulge in the hope that the fund will show further improvement before the close of another year, even if it is not increased by additional donations and subscriptions.

BY-LAW.

By-Law to make provision for the due administering and improving of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

WHEREAS, in the division of the funds and property in which this Society is interested with the Church Society of Toronto, certain lands and investments have been conveyed to the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, for the purpose of making provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the United Church of England and Ireland, in the Diocese of Huron, and as other lands may be given for the same benevolent purpose, and whereas sundry sums of money have from time to time been given and granted for the same purpose, and whereas sermons have been and will be annually preached, and collections made throughout the Diocese, the proceeds of which have been and will be annually invested, unless wanted for current demands, for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased, it is expedient to provide for the due administration of the said fund, and to make further provision for the same object.

I.

Be it therefore enacted, under the authority of the Act incorporating the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, and with the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, that all the said investments, and all monies received by the Secretary of the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, as the proceeds of the collections made for this purpose, form a fund to be denominated "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Diocese of Huron."

II.

That all rents, issues or profits, of lands or tenements held by the Society for the relief of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, and all moneys given or granted for the same purpose by individuals, or appropriated to the fund by the Church Society, shall be put to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

III.

That the Society shall and will put to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, yearly and every year, on the first day of June, a sum of money equal to five dollars for every Incorporated Member of the Church Society

IV.

That in order to entitle the Widow and Orphans of any Clergyman to enjoy the annuity hereafter provided, he must have continued connected with the Church Society, and have made all the collections and subscriptions called for this Society, unless excused therefrom by the Lord Bishop.

V.

That every Clergyman entering the Diocese, and desirous of availing himself of this By-Law, be required to pay to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund the sum of forty dollars, within six months after such entrance into the Diocese, in one payment; or under the sanction of the Bishop, by eight annual instalments of five dollars; and in case such Clergyman shall decease before such instalments be paid, that then such instalments, as they become due, shall be deducted from the annuity payable to his Widow and Orphans; and that every Clergyman of the Diocese re-marrying, and desirous of availing himself of the provisions of the By-Law, be required to pay to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund the sum of forty dollars, in one payment, within three months after said re-marriage.

VI.

It shall be the duty of a Committee to be appointed for that purpose, to prepare for the consideration of the Society, at its quarterly meetings, all business relative to the investment and improvement of the Widow and Orphans' Fund, and no matter connected with the investment of the said Fund shall be decided upon, until it has been submitted to such Committee for them to report thereupon.

VII.

That the Secretary shall lay before the Society, at its meeting in June in each year, a statement of all the lands belonging to this Fund, and of all monies invested or in his hands on the 15th day of May preceding belonging to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and of all monies received and paid on account of the said Fund, since the last annual statement.

VIII.

That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the Society will pay to the Widow of every Clergyman, who at the time of his decease shall have been duly licensed to the cure of souls in this Diocese, or as a Curate or Assistant Minister therein, or recognized by the Lord Bishop as such, or have been placed on any Superannuated List with the consent of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who, from the passing of the By-Law, or from the time of his appointment in the Diocese, shall have been an Incorporated Member of the Society, or a Subscriber thereto of five dollars per annum, or shall have become a life member under the fifth Article of the Constitution of the Society, (said subscription having been paid to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund) and who shall have complied with the requirements of this By-Law, such annuity not exceeding two hundred dollars, as the income of the Fund

will admit, payable in two equal half-yearly payments, on the first days of January and July each year; the first of such half-yearly payments or such portion thereof as may have accrued from the day of the death of her husband, to be made on the day above mentioned next following the death of her husband, such payments to be continued during her natural life, so long as she shall remain a Widow. And in case such Widow shall, at her death or marriage, have four or more children by her late husband, under the age of twenty-one years, such annuity shall be paid to the guardians of such children; and should there be less than four children, then such a sum, not exceeding sixty dollars, as the income of the Fund will admit, shall be paid as aforesaid for each, provided that all annuities shall cease from the half year next preceding the marriage of any person, whether male or female, entitled by this By-Law to any such annuity, and that all annuities paid for children shall cease on the day at which they attain the age of twenty-one years. And in case of a Clergyman deceased leaving no Widow, but having children, then such children shall enjoy the annuity as above provided on the death or marriage of a Widow; provided always that the Widow and Children of a Clergyman shall not be in the receipt of an income from other sources exceeding \$600 per annum, or, in case of children, that the guardians of such children shall not be in receipt of an income from other sources exceeding \$600 per annum for their benefit.

IX.

That the amount of the annuity paid to the Widows or Orphans of the clergy for each year shall be fixed at the meeting of the Corporation in June in each year.

X.

That all monies in the hands of the Treasurer that may not be required to meet the annuities payable to the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy shall be from time to time permanently invested in some good and sufficient security, upon the recommendation of the Investment Committee.

XI.

Every Widow or Guardian of any of the Orphans of a Clergyman desiring annuities from the Widows' and Orphans' Fund shall apply by Memorial to the Church Society for such annuity, setting forth the time of the decease of such Clergyman, the name of his Widow, and the names and ages of each of the children, as the case may be, and that the income does not exceed \$600 per annum.

XII.

Every annuitant on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund shall, whenever he or she may be paid his or her half-yearly annuity, make one of the following declarations, in the presence of a Clergyman, which declaration shall be attested by the Clergyman before whom it is made:

I, do hereby declare that I am the Widow of the late

Reverend _____ that I am entitled to an annuity from the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron; that I am still a Widow, and that my income for the past twelve months, whether from property invested or profits of business, including any sum or sums of money which may be available for the maintenance and education of my children, has not exceeded \$600.

I, _____ do hereby declare that I am the duly appointed Guardian of the Children of the late Reverend _____ whose names and ages are respectively written below; that they are entitled to an annuity from the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, and that their income for the past twelve months has not exceeded \$600.

XIII.

Should any doubt hereafter arise as to the interpretation of this By-Law, or the construction which should be put upon it, or upon any of its clauses, such doubts shall be referred to the Standing Committee, or to any other Committee that shall be appointed for that purpose, who shall make a report thereupon to the Quarterly Meeting of the Church Society, and the decision upon such doubt, when sanctioned and confirmed by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, shall be final.

XIV.

This By-Law to take effect from the first day of November, 1857.

The following "Act" was passed during the last Session of the Provincial Parliament.

An Act to confirm and legalize a certain agreement entered into between the Church Societies of the Dioceses of Toronto and Huron, relative to certain Church Lands in the Diocese of Huron.

WHEREAS the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron have by their petition represented, that in pursuance of their Act of Incorporation, it has been agreed between the said Church Society and the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, amongst other things, that the said first mentioned Church Society should have, receive and take all lands held by the said last mentioned Church Society, to and for the uses and purposes in their Act of Incorporation set forth, or any of such uses and purposes, and situate within the limits of the said Diocese of Huron, and all lands situate within the limits of either of the said Dioceses, and lawfully held by the said Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, or by the Bishop of Toronto, to and for any special use, trust or purpose, for the benefit or advantage of any Church, Parsonage or Rectory, or otherwise howsoever within the limits of the said Diocese of Huron; and that certain of such lands are held upon such trusts by the said Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and certain thereof by the Bishop of Toronto, and that it would be proper to confirm and effectuate the said agreement by an Act of Parliament of this Province, and otherwise to enact as hereinafter is enacted; and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

I.

The said agreement between the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto and the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron is hereby, in every particular, ratified, legalized and confirmed.

II.

All lands situate within the limits of the Diocese of Huron, and lawfully held by the Church Society of the

Diocese of Toronto, to and for the uses and purposes in their act of Incorporation set forth, or any of such uses and purposes, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

III.

All lands situate within the limits of either of the said Dioceses, and lawfully held by the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, or the Bishop of the said Diocese of Toronto, upon any special use, trust, or purpose, for the benefit or advantage of any Church, Parsonage or Rectory, or otherwise howsoever of the United Church of England and Ireland, within the limits of the said Diocese of Huron, shall be and they are hereby vested in the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

IV:

All lands situate within the limits of the said Diocese of Huron, and now lawfully held by any person or corporation upon any special use, trust or purpose for the benefit or advantage of any Church, Burying ground, Parsonage or Rectory, or otherwise howsoever of the United Church of England and Ireland, within the limits of the said Diocese of Huron, may by such person or corporation, with the consent of the parties beneficially interested, be transferred to the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

V.

All lands, moneys, mortgages and securities heretofore conveyed, paid, made or assigned to either of the said Church Societies, or to any other person or persons for the benefit, and forming part of the fund called the Episcopal Trust Fund, to be applied in aid towards the support and maintenance of the Bishop of the Diocese of Huron, for the time being, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron.

VI:

The said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron shall and may have, hold, receive, acquire and take all lands, moneys, mortgages or securities now, or hereafter made, paid, given, devised or bequeathed to or otherwise acquired by the said last mentioned Church Society under this Act, or otherwise for the use of the said Episcopal Trust

Fund, and may, with respect to such lands, moneys, mortgages and securities, exercise all the powers by their Act of Incorporation conferred on them with respect to any other lands, moneys, mortgages or securities.

VII.

All lands, moneys, mortgages, and securities which, by or under authority of any section or sections of this Act, shall be vested in the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, shall, by the said Church Society, be held upon, to and for the uses, trusts, interests and purposes, upon, to, and for which the same were heretofore held by the person or corporation holding the same; and the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron shall execute and discharge such uses, trusts, interests and purposes, and such other persons and corporations are hereby discharged therefrom.

VIII.

The said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron may sell and dispose absolutely of any such lands, mortgages, and other securities as in this Act mentioned, or any other lands, mortgages or securities had, received, taken or held by the said Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, for the purposes, uses or trusts of their incorporation, and shall have and hold the proceeds of such lands, mortgages and securities upon the same trusts as the said lands, mortgages and securities had been before held; but no purchaser shall be liable for the application of any moneys paid by him on any sale under the provisions of this Act.

IX.

Nothing in this Act contained shall be considered in any wise to touch or affect the lands patented as endowments for any parsonage or Rectory within the said Dioceses or either of them.

X.

This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.

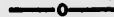
