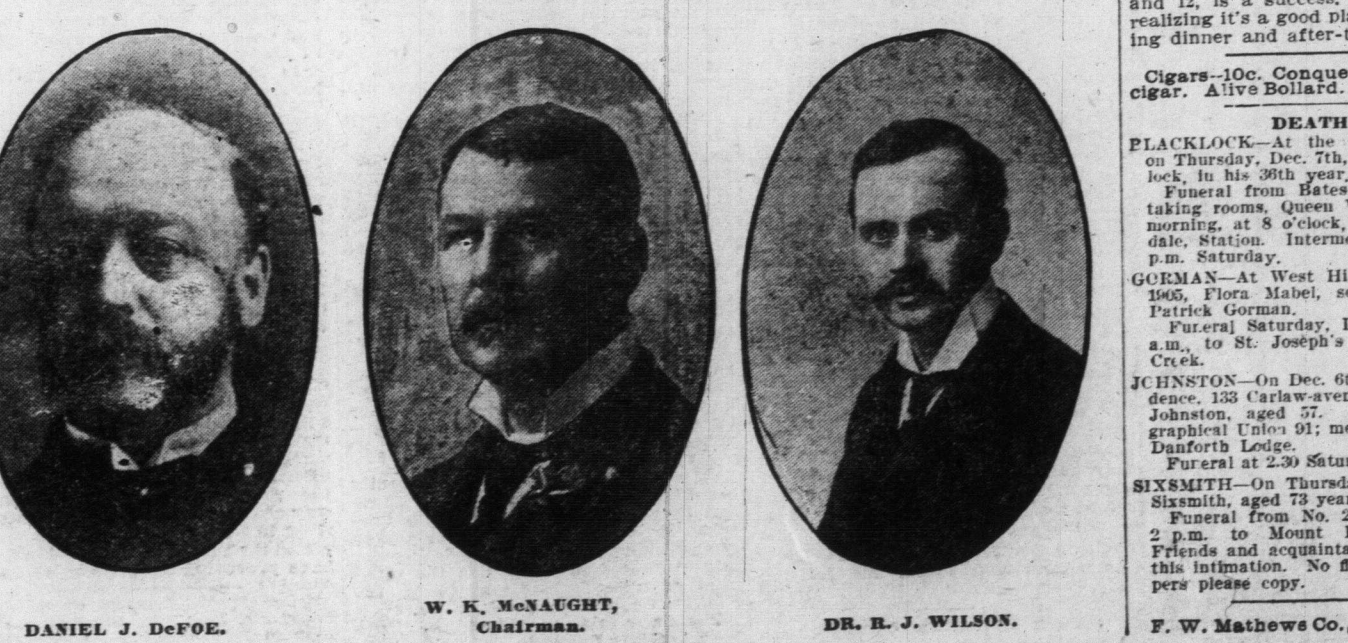

SALE OF YORK COUNTY LOAN ASSETS TO DOMINION PERMANENT LOAN CO

Provisional Agreement Which Will Be Presented for Ratification by Shareholders of Former Company on January 11

The World has got hold of an advance copy of the provisional agreement between the York County Loan and Savings Co. and the Dominion Permanent Loan Co. The significant clauses are given below in full. It is in substance a liquidation by agreement of the York County Loan and Savings Co. in a way that makes most for the shareholders of the liquidating company and as such will be submitted to the consideration of the shareholders of that company on January 11 next.

Agreement for Purchase. 1. This indenture shall not be deemed to be an agreement for the liquidation of the said two corporations, the vendor company and the purchasing company, but it shall be deemed to be an agreement for the purchase and acquisition by the purchasing company of the assets of the vendor company.

2. Subject to the said ratification and acceptance hereinafter provided for by the respective corporations, parties hereto (except as hereinafter provided) the purchasing company is dispensed with by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, and the vendor company doth hereby sell and effectually convey and transfer as a going concern to the purchasing company to and for the absolute use and benefit of the purchasing company, and the purchasing company doth hereby purchase all and singular the assets, undertakings, goodwill, business, and the lands, buildings, hereditaments, and all other charges, liens, rights, privileges and franchises, leases and licenses, goods, chattels and effects, money, stocks, debts, stock and stock subscriptions, books, records, title deeds, papers and documents, and all bills, notes, receipts, in action, contracts, agreements, bonds, debentures and securities, and all other property and assets, real and personal, and all rights and incidents appertaining thereto whatsoever or belonging to the vendor company.

3. The liabilities of the vendor company shall for purposes of this agreement be divided into two classes, namely: First, the debts, liabilities, obligations, contracts and duties to creditors, which shall not be deemed to include any liability direct or indirect, present or future of the vendor company to any shareholders of the vendor company, whether such shareholder holds permanent stock or shares of the vendor company, and the liabilities to shareholders, that is to say, the liabilities to holders of shares of permanent stock and to holders of shares of fully paid and installment terminating or withdrawing stock of the vendor company, and the liabilities to stockholders of stock, either permanent or terminating or withdrawing stock, being hereinafter referred to as shareholders. No preference or distinction arising out of notice of withdrawal or of shares not being given, or arising otherwise, shall be made among the shareholders and the liabilities to stockholders shall, in so far as possible, be satisfied in the order set forth in this agreement.

4. As for the consideration for the said sale, conveyance and transfer, and upon the assets hereto of the Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario in Council: (1) The purchasing company as to the debts and liabilities of the said vendor company to creditors as defined in the next preceding paragraph, the said purchasing company shall have the same rights and remedies against the said purchasing company as they would have had against the said vendor company had this agreement not been made, or had the said assent not been given; and the purchasing company hereby covenants and agrees with each and every one of the said creditors of the vendor company that the purchasing company will pay each such creditor the sum or sums in which the vendor company is indebted to each such creditor respectively; the said purchasing company hereby covenants and agrees with the said vendor company, its successors and assigns, to discharge, carry out and perform all the said debts, liabilities, obligations, contracts and duties to the said creditors, for or in respect of which the said vendor company is or might hereafter become liable to pay, discharge, carry out and perform, and the said purchasing company hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the said vendor company, its directors and shareholders and every of them, from every such debt, liability, obligation, contract or duty.

(2) After the amount of the said debts and liabilities of the vendor company to the said creditors is deducted from the value of the said assets ascertained as hereinafter provided, the balance remaining shall be deemed to be the net value of the assets of the vendor company, and the purchasing company shall apportion among the shareholders of the vendor company as hereinafter mentioned permanent stock of the purchasing company at par in shares each of the par value of ten dollars, such shares being fully paid up and non-assessable and the aggregate of the said issue shall be in amount exactly equal to the net value of the assets of the vendor company as ascertained as hereinafter provided. (3) The purchase price of the said assets shall be deemed to be the sum of the said permanent stock of the purchasing company at par in shares each of the par value of ten dollars, such shares being fully paid up and non-assessable and the aggregate of the said issue shall be in amount exactly equal to the net value of the assets of the vendor company as ascertained as hereinafter provided. (4) The purchase price of the said assets shall be deemed to be the sum of the said permanent stock of the purchasing company at par in shares each of the par value of ten dollars, such shares being fully paid up and non-assessable and the aggregate of the said issue shall be in amount exactly equal to the net value of the assets of the vendor company as ascertained as hereinafter provided.

Forthwith after the shareholders of the vendor company have ratified this agreement in accordance with the provisions of the said Loan Corporations Act, the vendor company shall prepare and submit to the purchasing company a schedule of all liabilities to creditors, with full particulars thereof, and all information pertaining thereto, which may be required by the purchasing company, and such schedule or statement shall be duly verified by the statutory declaration of the general manager and secretary-treasurer of the vendor company, and the purchasing company shall have the right to investigate and examine into the books and accounts, records and vouchers of the vendor company to verify the same, and the vendor company shall afford or to enable the purchasing company to arrive at a true and correct account of all liabilities to creditors.

REVOLUTIONS IN RUSSIA CAUSE DECREASE IN THEIR NUMBER. An interesting side effect of the revolution in Russia is the possible speed with which the population of a species of animal which for many years has been jealously protected by the law, in times of peace and contentment the European Bison lives in the forests of Lithuania, presumably unmolested; but whenever there is a rising in Poland and the rebels take a part of the forest, the bison is killed for its hide, and the number of animals is reduced in numbers of this herd, which by many zoologists is thought to be due to inbreeding; yet there are others who believe that the decrease in this protected herd, which 50 years ago numbered nearly 2000, is due to the fact that the bison is too timid to be accounted for solely by inbreeding, and must be due to destruction by man, notwithstanding the efforts made by the authorities to protect them. Statistic of the European bison in Croatia show that between 1833 and 1857 there has been an increase from 700 to 1858, but from this time on the decrease has been constant until 1892; the herd numbers now are 1000, which is reported to be taking place on a scale quite unparalleled in times of peace for the last hundred years, since the bison has been reported to be in the process of extermination by the bison hunters, which for hundreds of years has been preserved from extinction by the very hand that brought its numbers so low.

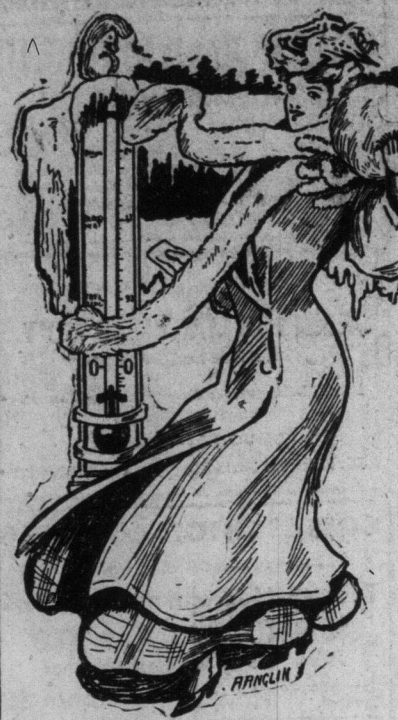

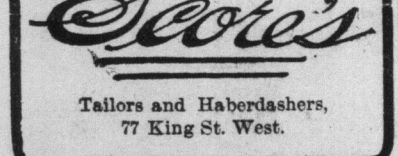

112 LOADS AT CITY MARKET QUALITY GENERALLY POOR

Hog Prices Again Advance—Now \$6.37 1-2 Cwt—Sheep, Lambs, Calves Firm.

Receipts of live stock since Tuesday, as reported by the railways, were 112 car loads, composed of 1504 cattle, 1700 sheep and lambs, 2500 hogs and 10 calves.

The quality of fat cattle was disappointing to those dealers who wanted something good for the Christmas trade, as the bulk was of common to medium class. The few good to choice cattle were readily bought up.

As there was a large number of buyers from outside points, there was a fair trade, but prices were low, as will be seen by the sales given below.

Exporters

A few export bulls sold at \$3.65 to \$4. The few odd lots of cattle heavy enough to export were bought for butcher purposes, but few of these were of good quality.

Butchers

The best butchers' cattle sold at \$4 to \$4.50 and there were few that brought the price. Medium butchers' cattle, at \$3.50 to \$3.80; common at \$3.25 to \$3.50; cow, at \$2.75 to \$3.00; light steers, at \$2.25 to \$2.75.

Feeders and Stockers

Henry Marry reports the run of stockers and feeders on the market today as fair, but the demand for them being limited, trade was slow.
