

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council, at the expiration of another association year, have to present to the members the accustomed annual report, and in it to record the more special events of the past shooting season.

At the regular meeting in November, 1887, it was decided to hold the Prize Meeting during the week preceding the D. R. A. Matches, and accordingly Tuesday, the 28th day of August, was fixed for the opening of the Sussex competition, and, as usual, that and the two following days sufficed to finish the matches.

By the addition of a Martini Match at 600 yards, and of some prizes to the Grand Aggregate and Elder Match, the amount of the Prize List was increased by about \$100, the whole amounting to \$1147.

What has hitherto been known as the "All Comers' Match" was made the "McPherson," and in it was placed a cup presented to the Association by Charles E. McPherson, Esq., of Boston. The offer was made to the Council early in the season, and very gladly accepted, and the thanks of the Association are due the donor for this most desirable prize.

The weather during the first day was rainy and disagreeable, but eventually became as pleasant as the competitors could have wished for. The greatest number of entries in any one match was 76, being nine less than in the corresponding match of last year. The absence of several old attendants was noticeable, one of these being Captain Langstroth, who has probably taken part in all the

preceding meetings of the Association. Carleton County was well represented, while a falling off occurred in the number from St. John and Kings.

The regulations contained a clause requiring competitors to shoot in all matches in uniform, this being the substance of a resolution unanimously passed at the annual meeting last October. The effect was a very desirable one, in that the field, at all times, presented a much more pleasing and business-like appearance than when the wearing of plain clothes was allowable.

The method of having paid Register Keepers was again employed, and the work was done as well, perhaps, as could be expected from men having little or no previous experience. The active conduct of the shooting was once more happily undertaken by Colonel Blaine, and the Association and competitors are equally indebted to him for imparting so much punctuality to the firing.

The Council rejoice to report that the Snider Ammunition of this year's Canadian make gave the utmost satisfaction to the competitors, and, judging from the results obtained with it, there seems to be no cause to doubt its being fully reliable. The average shooting this year rose again to what it used to be when Mark IX. was the only available ammunition, and the aggregate shooting of the first few winners in the Grand will fully bear comparison with the records of any former meeting.

The presentation of leading prizes was made on the afternoon of Thursday, and it is worthy cf mention that, with two exceptions, all those entitled were present in uniform to receive their prizes.

The Council are privileged to again acknowledge the kindness of Col. Maunsell in supplying a cup for the Nursery Match, and in being present on the last day to evince his interest in the work of the Association.

The Council have further to state that His Excellency the Governor General, Lord Stanley, has signified his intention of offering silver and bronze medals for yearly competition.

The fact is also to be roted that the McLellan Cup has now been

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shot for at five consecutive matches, and the winners will next year contest for its ownership.

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The Shooting Year was very successfully opened with the Maritime Match at Bedford Range, Halifax, on Thursday, June 14th. With less difficulty than hitherto a team was formed to represent this Province, and in a well-fought match succeeded in making the highest team total of 661 points, Nova Scotia being a close second with 646, and the Island third with 616.

The selection of the New Brunswick Team was made according to the method devised by the Council in 1886 and approved at the last Annual meeting, but in view of the fact that any members who gained places by their shooting at Sussex did so wholly with the Snider Rifle, the Executive Committee gave the matter further consideration while the Sussex Meeting was in progress. Being unanimously of opinion that Martini shooting should in some degree determine every place on the team, a notice was posted on the board that four members of the 1889 Team should be chosen from the Wimbledon Team Aggregate at Ottawa, and the other four would be named or selected by the Executive Committee.

The Trophy for this competition has since arrived from London, and is now in the custody of the Association. It is gratifying in this connection to mention that the generous support of members and outside friends has enabled the Association to meet its share of the cost of the Trophy without in the least resorting to its ordinary funds.

The Special Allowance from the Provincial Government of \$300 was, as usual, made to the Association, and enabled it to provide for a team of twenty-eight men to take part in the Dominion shooting at Ottawa. It is difficult to estimate the value to the Association of this allowance. It is the means—which otherwise would be wholly wanting—of insuring for the Province a credit able representation at the annual gathering, and places our shots in a position to there contest with riflemen from all the other Provinces and to win for themselves the right to represent Canada at the great meeting of the N. R. A. in England.

Happily the success of former teams has always been such as

to warrant the Association in yearly seeking a continuance of the grant, and the record of the Team just returned is again so creditable that the Association may well anticipate the same generous provision for the coming year. The Prize Return herewith submitted shows the Province to have won the highest prize of the competition—the Governor General's Prize of \$250 for the best aggregate score in His Excellency's Match; the Team Aggregate Challenge Cup for teams from affiliated Associations presented by Lord Lansdowne on his departure from Canada; five places in the Governor General's Sixty; two places on the Wimbledon Team, and money prizes to the amount of \$772.

Canada was represented at the Wimbledon competitions by the usual team of twenty men, and, though not meeting with any special success, the members did well in the ordinary matches. Our New Brunswick members were Lieutenant E. A. Smith, Sergeant H. Miner, and Sergeant W. H. Adams; the shooting of the former, both in practice and at Wimbledon, being such as to secure him a place on the Kolapore Eight against the Home Country.

The accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer are presented herewith, showing a slight increase in the balance to the credit of the Association, now amounting to \$276.

The proceedings of last year, and the shooting of the several County Associations, were printed in the usual pamphlet form, with the desirable addition of the minutes of the Annual and Council Meetings.

OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

ST. JOHN, N. B., 3rd Oct., 1888.

SIR,-My final duty as Captain of this year's Ottawa Team is to report to you as to the strength and success of the contingent representing this Association at the Dominion of Canada Rifle Meeting. It will be remembered that an unfortunate delay in receiving the passes to Quebec delayed our departure until the night of Friday, the 31st August, when we found ourselves to number twenty-eight. It is, perhaps, well to state that ours was probably the least experienced team which has yet gone from the Province, and that as many as six of our most capable shots were conspicuously absent. In order to reach Ottawa by the opening morning of the matches we had to rely on leaving Montreal Sunday night by the Toronto train, and taking a local train back to Ottawa from Smith's Falls. We had every reason to be satisfied with the attention paid us by the C. P. R. agents both at Quebec and Montreal, and with the arrangements made by them for carrying us through to Ottawa without change on a special car.

As usual, I retained the Provincial Grant of \$300, out of it paying the various entries, and in time accounting to each member for the small balance remaining.

Speaking generally, the Dominion Meeting of this year was a brilliant one. There was good weather, a good attendance and strikingly high scoring. Various changes in the system of conducting the matches, which yearly experience has suggested, have been yearly introduced, and now there seems to be little, if anything, wanting to insure the satisfaction of the competitors. The recent meeting was certainly a marked success.

In the regular matches of the List sometimes a few, sometimes many, of our team gained places, but in all there were some New Brunswick winners. As a full return of the prizes is herewith submitted, I need not do more than mention the 4th and 5th in the Rideau; the 5th in the Manufacturers; the 2nd in the Minister of Militia; the 4th in the Standing; the 5th in the Dominion of Canada; the 4th in the Grand Aggregate, and the 1st and 2nd in the 80 Burns shot Prizes On th 2nd a option The

the 800 yards Martini Extra. Five of the team, Capt. Hartt, Pte. Burns, Staff-Sergt. Lordly, Lieut. McFarlane, and Gun. Loggie, shot in the Sixty and competed for the Governor General's Prizes, of which the Special First Prize was taken by Capt. Hartt. On the Wimbledon Team, as at present made up, Capt. Hartt is 2nd and Pte. Burns 18th. Lordly is 30th, and may yet have the option of going as a member.

The five representatives whose names were given to the Secretary viz., Gun. Loggie, Capt. Hartt, Pte. Burns, Sergt. Miner, and Capt. McRobbie, had the honor of winning for this Association the Lansdowne Challenge Cup, a valuable prize this year for the first time offered for competition. The conditions are unusual, in that they provide that the Cup shall be won by the joint aggregate scores, in five matches, of five previously named men from any affiliated Association. Under such conditions the winning of this Cup must always be a most creditable performance for the men themselves and the Association they represent.

In the London Merchants' Match, on the other hand, our team met only with misfortune, for three misses at 200 may surely be considered as such. The honors were taken by Ontario with 679points, and Quebec with 658 points, New Brunswick being sixth and last with 623. As heretofore, the chief aim of the Executive and Range officers seemed to be to get this match over with and out of the way. There seems to be little hope of ever seeing it made what it is intended to be, a team match properly so called.

Maritime Trophy.

By the conditions of the Maritime Match, as agreed to in 1888 by the Associations in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, it was provided that "a handsome challenge prize be obtained through the joint efforts of these Associations, and be held for the year by the President of the winning Association." In the autumn of 1887 a committee of members from the three Provinces selected one from a number of designs submitted by Elkington & Co., of London, Eng., and the Trophy was eventually ordered early in 1888, to be furnished with an ebony base, on which were to be placed three shields bearing in enamel the coats-of-arms of the three Provinces,

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and a fourth shield in silver, to be inscribed annually with the name of the winning Provinces, the whole to cost $\pounds 55$ nett.

The Trophy was safely received and delivered into the custody of the New Brunswick Association in September of this year.

A committee of the Council of this Association was appointed to solicit subscriptions to enable this Association to meet its share of the expense, and the following is a list of those who have made contributions:

"That Sergeant Bent be disqualified for five years from competing at any matches of this Association; that he be required to refund immediately all prizes won by him at the recent Sussex matches and that if he fails to do so a statement of the case and the correspondence be referred to the Association of Nova Scotia.

The amendment was carried.

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Col. Beer suggested that the certificate of efficiency be amended so as to contain a statement of efficiency by each competitor, and also a certificate of another member of the same corps as witness.

Moved by Major Markham, seconded by Major Hartt-

"That the Secretary write to all the commanding officers of Corps calling attention to the fact that some irregularities have occured and requesting them in future to be very careful in issuing certificates."-Carried.

The recommendation of the annual meeting as to civilians being allowed to compete being read, it was moved by Col.-Sergt. Henderson, seconded by Capt. Thompson and carried-

"That civilians be debarred only from the Nursery and Prince of Wales Matches."

Mr. Chipman submitted the case of Mr. James McMann of St. Stephen, an enthusiastic rifleman and a member of the Charlotte County Association. Being a one-armed man he had devised a spring arm of wood, which enabled him to shoot both standing and lying down. He was desirous of attending the Sussex Matches, provided the wooden arm could be considered as not

falling within the restriction as to "fixed or artificial rests."

"That Mr. McMann be allowed the use of the artificial arm, in any match for which he may otherwise be eligible."—Carried.

After discussion as to the unfitness of the repair butt on the Stockton Range as a storehouse for the plant of the Association and as to the necessity of repairs to it and the Secretary's hut, it was resolved—

"That Major Arnold be authorized to remove the targets and other plant from the ranges and assume the charge of them for the winter."

"That the Executive Committee be empowered to secure a further lease (one for ten years if possible) of the present Stockton Ranges."—Carried.
