PROGRESS AT SMELTER

Samplers Now Running Regularly at Crofton—More Machinery Arrives.

"The samplers are now running regularly, and two large heaps of ore (some 60 feet by about 20 feet by 15 feet) are roasting in the open on the graded ground behind the bins," says the Crofton Gazette.

"Three more cars of machinery have arrived, bringing piping both for the steam connections between the boilers and engine houses, and the water supply. The matte furnace is in place, and the water-jacket furnace, which will smelt about 10 tons an hour, is nearly ready, and will be completed in a few days.

There is yet a third furnace to be installed. This is a "copper-jacket" furnace, of a new pattern which has not yet been extensively tested on a large scale, but which promises a great increase of economy in working over present methods. In this new furnace the ore will be smelted and converted in one process. As soon as the large driving shaft and one or two other pieces of machinery shall have arrived, there need be but a few days delay in the "blowing in." The water supply for the smelter is ample for all purposes, and has been secured from dams about a mile north of which have been built along the line of the Mount Sicker railway. A flume conveys the water to large tanks near the works, with which connection is made by means of an eight-inch iron pipe."

Another burglary reported last night. Upper Yates Street Residence Entered While Family Were Away—Twenty Dollars Stolen.

Another burglary was reported to the police last evening, and added to the rather startling list now under investigation by the local detectives. Judging by its nature the work was probably done by the same party as the one whose operations singularly enough appear to have been confined chiefly to the Coronation Day provisions.

Early last evening when L. Camussa, of 318 Yates street, returned home from Cordova Bay, where he and others had been camping, he discovered that the house had been forcibly entered. As a matter of fact no gentle hand or foot either had left its mark on the lock of the back door had been broken, while the door leading from the kitchen to the dining-room was evidently kicked open, for it had been smashed from the lock, which still held. Inside the dining-room the jewelry cabinet of a vigorous search, upsetting the furniture, prying into corners and leaving traces of their visit in all directions. Unfortunately there was one evidence, especially conclusive—the removal of \$20 from the bureau drawer of Miss Camussa's room. The money was in a box in the back of the drawer, and its discovery by the housebreakers showed just how exhaustive was their search. They ransacked everything in sight, but as far as known took nothing but the money. Fortunately the jewelry cabinet was consigned to the charge of a neighbor a few days ago, "doing" this city on Coronation Day were particularly active in that part of the city. It would appear that they started at the Wilson house on Cordova Bay road, and operated down, taking in Haddess Clarke's, Mrs. Camussa's and Mr. Wilkinson's houses in that order. THE ISLANDER COMMISSION.

Examination of Officers of the Wrecked Steamer for Seattle Law Courts.

It would be difficult to define the status of the special commission from Seattle which is now sitting at the Victoria Hotel, taking evidence of local witnesses of the Islander disaster for the District Federal court of Seattle in connection with the claims before that court against the C. P. N. Company. The special commissioner and three of the local counsel appearing before him are citizens of the United States—with an accent on the "U" while our representative before the court is a British Columbia resident. The examination is in the hands of John B. Hart, who, with the local counsel, represents the claimants across the board.

The commission presumably has no power to call any witnesses here anyway, but the legal lights from the Sound say they are here to suit the convenience of the C. P. N. interest, statement which Mr. Davis disputed yesterday.

However, the commission is very much here, and anyone who stops in during the examination will find that Mr. Hart is convinced that it is a pretty lively commission at that. The hearts of the court house caretaker is nearly broken at the clouds of cigar smoke which arise from the lips of learned counsel, and the general absence from the proceedings of that dignified decorum which marks similar proceedings of our own.

The cross-examination of A. L. Brownie, formerly chief engineer of the Islander, was concluded this morning when Mr. Hart endeavored to procure evidence from the witness that on her last trip south the Islander was being run at her highest speed, Mr. Brownie admitted that just prior to the accident the telegraph was fixed by the captain at full speed, and that, in one sense, the steamer was travelling at that rate, viz., 14 to 14 1/2 knots per hour, but that the "best speed" she was capable of by another knot to the hour.

Questioned as to whether Capt. Foote had been drinking after leaving Skagway on the 14th of August, last year, and on other occasions, the witness said not. Mr. Hart: "I believe Capt. Foote would take a drink sometimes, like yourself."

Mr. Hart objected to this statement. "Now," said he, "that is, I suppose, a fair sample of the value of your evidence, but I believe you ever see me take a drink in your life?"

"Yes," replied the witness, and the learned and unlearned gentlemen present joined in a hearty laugh at Mr. Hart's expense.

But Mr. Hart wouldn't accept this statement, and finally the witness said he had seen Mr. Hart in the Grotto last evening, but had not actually seen him take a drink. "It was a clear," said the witness, "and I am a member of the Seattle authority on the quality of evidence, and the witness had to admit that he had seen Mr. Hart take a drink. The next witness called was Cyril D. Neurotos, formerly chief officer of the Islander, whose examination was just completed before the midday adjournment.
