GOVERNOR SULZER DIVESTED

Of right to exercise his executive functions. Supreme Court Justice gives decision.

Krugers, N. Y., Sept. 11.—Supreme Court Justice gave today its decision that Governor Sulzer was regularly impeached, and while awaiting impeachment the power to exercise the executive functions of the office was vested in the Governor-elect.

Wages were also discussed and a decision was reached to ask the legislature to compel mine management to pay their men one week instead of fortnightly, as is now the custom.

At a meeting of the Provincial Executive Association held at the Hotel Scotia on Monday evening, the subject of a resolution for general adoption, was discussed.

It was also decided to request the aid of the government in coming additional safeguards in mines where electrical apparatus is used.

Arthur Davis, of Sydney Mines, claimed the right to hold a convention of the Provincial Executive Association at the Grand Hotel of the city.
