The business of voting will be conducted as follows:— The polls will be opened at nine a. m., at the places in each electoral district announced in the Official Proclamation issued by John Shiroff, Esq., Returning Officer.

Excepting in districts where there are a large number of voters on the lists, only one voter will be admitted to the polling booth at a time. There will be present in the place where the poll is held two returning officers or deputy returning officers and his clerk, together with two representatives or agents of each candidate.

The Voter, after giving his name, and it being ascertained that he is entitled to vote, will receive his ballot, on the back of which the returning officer shall have put his initials, together with the voter's name on the counterfoil, or bottom part.

The Voter will then retire to the private room and place the cross mark on the back of the ballot containing the name of the candidate for whom he wishes to vote (just as the cross-mark above is placed for the guidance of all friends of Mr. Adams).

The Voter, having marked his ballot, shall fold it so that the returning officer's initials may be seen without its being opened, and hand it to the returning officer, who on examining the initials and number on the counterfoil, shall tear off the latter and deposit the ballot in the box. If a Voter accidentally spoils a ballot, he will be entitled to a fresh one on returning that spoiled.

Should the voter not be able to read, or should he be otherwise incapacitated so as to need assistance in marking his ballot, such assistance will be rendered by the Returning Officer in the presence of the sworn agents of the respective candidates, and no other persons.


