

FIRST DAY.

KINGSTON, TUESDAY, 15th FEB., 1876.

At the hour of two o'clock p. m., Brother John White, M. P., R. W. Grand Master, took the Chair, and called the Grand Lodge to order.

Brother David Marshall, Deputy Grand Master, took the

Deputy Chair.

The R. W. G. M. then appointed Brother James Laturney, of L. O. L. No. 527 Outside Tyler, and Brother F. Morrison, of L. O. L. No. 6, Inside Tyler.

Companions William Johnson, County Master of South Hastings, and George Forde, County Master of Russell, tested the Brethren in the Illustrious Degree of Royal Scarlet.

Companion the Rev. A. Dawson, G. C. of B. A. then read the opening prayers and the R. W. G. M. declared the Grand Lodge open.

The Lecture was then repeated by Companions John

Holmes, G. L. and W. Makins, W. M. 352.

The R. W. Grand Master then declared the Grand Lodge reduced to the Orange Degree.

The R. W. G. M then delivered his address.

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

Members of the Grand Lodge of Ontario East :

BRETHREN,—It is with the greatest pleasure that I meet so many of you assembled from different sections of this Province, and it especially gives. me pleasure to meet you for the first time as a Provincial Grand Lodge in this magnificent hall. It is satisfactory to see your faces, beaming with contentment, and knowing that true and Loyal hearts are beating in every manly breast before me, hearts true as the colors you wear, and hearts that I ever trust you will keep pure, so that your conduct will reflect honor upon our noble society, which we trust yet to see occupying the foremost place in our country, for sobriety, honesty of purpose, and all that forms a Loyal and Protestant people. There are several things that have passed since we last met in Grand Lodge to which I will call your attention briefly. First I will allude to the Incorporation Bills, which you are well aware have been again rejected by those we have sent to our Legislative Halls.

We have elected representatives, and we have brought nothing before them that was contrary to the Constitution or the welfare of our Province or the Dominion at large. We have asked for nothing that we are unwilling to grant to others. Yet I am sorry to find that we have brethren amongst us who are not true to us as a Grand Lodge, but will support men who are enemies to our cause, because they happen to be of a Political stripe to which they have a bias. If we cannot be united ourselves how can we look for success. We should always consider our own interests before politics, which I consider as only a species of commercial interest and those who rule for the best interests of the country being mostly in power. We owe it to ourselves to be united, and we should strive to uphold Protestant Principles and the domination of the Bible, the charter of British Freedom, free and unsullied. I do not wish to find fault with the votes of many of those we considered our friends, but allow me to thank Bro: Robinson, of Kingston, for the stand he took in our favor. Brethren, I felt the defeat of our bills keenly, and I know if our Brethren had been united, we would now have had our right. I know in my own case, that the union of true Orangemen is powerful, because if it had not been for their votes, I would never have had a seat in the Commons of our Dominion. The short comings of one Lodge causes blame to be thrown on the whole, so, brethren I would again impress upon you the value of unity.

The next matter to which I would allude, is the remarkable success of Bro. Chiniquy, in the City of Montreal, who has the whole papal power of the Province of Quebec to contend against. Brethren, shall we not help him? Shall we as Protestants and Brother Orangemen allow him to fight manfully against the whole powers of Romanism, and not come to his aid? If we cannot do it by our presence let us do it by our means, and I would recommend that the Finance Committee take the case into consideration, and make as liberal a grant as our circumstances will allow. We must teach our Roman Catholic fellow citizens of Quebec Province that such actions as the mobbing of Bro. Chiniquy, and the destroying of a Protestant place of worship at Oka, will not be tolerated by the Protestants of our fair Dominion. We trust that our own Province will not be behind in the good work, but that still greater efforts will be made for freedom of religious liberty, which is being encroached upon. I must now refer to the attack of Mr. Devlin, of Montreal, upon our Orange order, and which was boldly and successfully thrown back by Bro. Mackenzie Bowell, our Most Worshipful Grand Master, from his place on the floor of the House of Commons. He showed himself the true friend of our order, as well as a most able and rising statesman.

I will also refer to the meeting of the Grand Orange Council in Londonderry during the coming summer, and I trust that you will send a delegate that will creditably represent this important Grand Lodge at that meeting, and that your interests will not suffer from the want of such.

I will not detain you any longer, but will at once allow you to proceed to work. You know your duty, and I will again remind you of the old motto, "No Surrender." I always trust there will be no surrender of the right by any of us, but alway keep to the right. The Grand Secretary's Report will show the state of the Order within our bounds for the current year, whilst the Treasurer's will show our position financially. And now I leave you to the work of the Grand Lodge, trusting that harmony will characterize our meeting, and may we so live and so work that we may meet in the Grand Lodge above, when our mission on this sublunary sphere is ended.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Grand Secretary then presented his Annual Report.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Master and Brethren of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Ontario East:

RIGHT WORSHIPFUL SIR AND BROTHERS,-I have the honor to present my Annual Report : First :

CORRESPONDENCE.

The Correspondence of the past year has been equal if not greater than on preceding years. Much of it is of interest, and as it will be brought before the Committee appointed by this Grand Lodge, I will not attempt to particularize. The letters on fyle number 190.

Copies of replies to any important affairs will be found in the Letter Book of Grand Lodge, from pages 121 to 265, both inclusive. Second:

WARRANTS.

It is encouraging to report a lively increase in the issue of Warrants during the past year, no less than twenty new parchments have been issued to the following Counties, respectively, viz:

ORANGE YOUNG BRITONS.

One Warrant only has been granted during the past year for a Lodge of Young Britons to be held at Bethany, County of East Durham. Sixth:

DUES AND ARREARS.

The payment of Grand Lodge dues has exceeded that for the year 1874, but many Counties are very much behind in their dues.

460 Lodges are supposed to be in working order in this jurisdiction, and the M. W. Grand Lodge of British America, claims fifty cents for each of those Lodges, see Rule 91 of the Constitution; it is therefore incumbent, on County and District Masters to exert themselves to collect arrears or enforce the Rules; failing in this the financial state of this Grand Lodge will soon assume a very unpleasant position. It is to be hoped that these delinquent Lodges do not receive the Annual.

I cannot refrain from calling the attention of County and District Masters, and Masters of Primary Lodges, to Rules 34, 53, 110, and 131, trusting that they will take measures to enforce them.

On December 31st, 1875, the only Counties clear on the Books of Grand Lodge were West Peterboro' and Prescott, East Durham and Carleton not far behind, being nearly clear and showing fairly a clean sheet.

A considerable amount of arrears stand against Warrants which have been returned, or reported as dormant; these arrears should be paid by the District Lodges, see Rule 128. I trust this Grand Lodge will take some steps to cause this Rule to be obeyed, for Grand Lodge cannot afford to pay dues to the Grand Lodge of B. A. for these Lodges, and besides it is unfair to paying Lodges.

The Committee on Disputed Arrears, appointed by resolution at the last Annual Session of this Grand Lodge, held their first meeting at Port Hope, on October 26th, 1875. County Masters were duly notified by circular, of the holding of said meeting. No doubt that Committee will present a report to this Grand Lodge.

County Masters have had sent to them statements of Arrears of Lodges. and a notice that the Committee would hold an adjourned meeting at

Kingston, on Monday, February 14th instant. Seventh:

And the County of Stormont did not make any Annual Return during the year.

In consequence of these County Masters being remiss in their duty, Suspensions and Expulsions reported in those Returns have been delayed in confirmation by this Grand Lodge, and could not be printed in the Annual Report, besides many of the Returns when received by your Grand recretary are so incomplete that the required information is not obtained.

I have also to report that a Lodge numbered 528—Bro. E. R. Johnston, Master, held at Crysler, County of Stormont, does not appear on the Grand Lodge Registry of this Grand Lodge; this number has not been reported in the Returns for Stormont. I communicated with Bro. F. Anderson, County Master, on the subject, on August 20th, 1875, wishing him to correct the irregularity, as I fancied this was an old Dormant Warrant revived without any authority. Bro. Anderson did not reply to my communication. Tenth:

REPORTS, &c.

On April 30th, 1875, a full supply of the Annual Reports of this R. W. G. Lodge, was mailed to each Grand Officer, and County Masters, and also to distinguished Brethren in England, Ireland, Scotland and the Sister Provinces. And on September 6th, 1875, the Annual Reports of the M. W. G. L. of B. A., were mailed to those entitled to receive them.

A full supply of blank forms for returns was mailed to each County Master, on September 6th, 1875.

Notice of intention to apply to the Legislature of Ontario for an Act of Incorporation for the G. O. L. of Ontario East, was advertised in the Ontario Gazette and Kingston News, on July 12th, 1875.

On July 13th, 1875, the address of condolence was mailed to Mrs. D'Arcy Boulton, Toronto, widow of our late Brother D'Arcy Boulton, Deputy Grand Master of B. A. Mrs. Boulton's acknowledgment will be found fyled with the Correspondence.

On July 14th, 1875, a full supply of Rituals was mailed to cach County Master, the total number sent out being 3680.

The usual list of Grand Officers, County and District Masters and numbers of Lodges and indebtedness of each Lodge, has been prepared for use of Committee on Credentials.

Arrangements for reduced Railway Fares and Hotel Accommodations have been made, and notices of this meeting, together with Railway Certificates, were mailed to Grand Officers and County Masters.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Lodge of Ontario East:

The Committee appointed at the last Annual Meeting of the Grand Lodge, to whom was to be referred all disputed Arrears of Private Lodges, beg leave to Report:

1st. That your Committee met at Port Hope, in the Orange Hall, on the 26th day of October last, and investigated the several disputed accounts of arrears brought before them, on hand to that date.

2nd. That they find that Bro. D. Marshall, the Grand Secretary in the year 1866, received from L. O. L. 475, in the County of Victoria, \$2.00, which he omitted crediting to said Lodge. Bro. Marshall paid the amount to the Grand Secretary to-day.

3rd. They also find that Bro. W. Boulter, P. G. F. Secretary for the year 1872, received from L. O. L. 277, in the County of Peterboro', \$4.00, and \$2.00 from L. O. L. 509, in the County of Hastings, which he omitted crediting. Bro. Boulter paid the amount to the Grand Secretary to-day.

4th. L. O. L. 935, in the County of Victoria, dormant for the years 1868-69-70-71-72. This Lodge has since been resucitated and in good working order. Your Committee recommend that the sum of \$6.00 which would have to be paid for a new Warrant be received by this Grand Lodge in full of all demands for dues until the 31st day of December, 1875.

5th. The County Master of South Hastings states that L. O. L. 488, in said County, was dormant for three years, and the former W. Master refused to give up the Warrant to either District or County Masters. Your Committee recommend that the amount of arrears charged to the County of South Hastings for that Lodge be struck off, and the Lodge declared dormant; and also to strike off all arrears from L. O. L. 1378, as said Lodge was never organized.

6th. The arrears for South Frontenac were fully investigated, and your Committee recommend that the snm of \$22.00 which was paid into your Committee's hands to-day, Feb. 15th, 1876, be accepted in full of all arrears up to 31st December, 1875, and your Grand Secretary arrange his books accordingly.

7th. Lennox and Addington.—Your Committee find three Lodges in a peculiar position; Lodge 1135 was returned dormant in 1875, but had not been working since 1868, dues accumulating during that time to \$16.00, which your Committee recommend to be struck off as against the County Lodge. Lodge 636 not working since 1867, W. Master refuses to give up the Warrant, and we would recommend that the Warrant be declared dormant, and the dues amounting to \$18.00 be struck off as against the County Lodge. Lodge 847, formerly in North Frontenac, joined this County in 1873, whilst having arrearages against them of \$8.00, and we recommend that that amount be struck off from the County of Lennox and Addington's arrearages.

Sth. COUNTY CARLETON.—Lodges Nos. 510 and 786 reported dormant on the 11th of March, 1875, and the amount of dues against said County for above Lodges amounts to \$18.00 and \$24.00 respectively, and we recommend that said amounts be struck off, as no trace of the Warrants can be found.

9th. West Durham.—Lodge 695 against which there is a claim of \$6.00 was returned dormant in 1874, and we would recommend that the sum of \$4.00 be struck off as against the County Lodge; they would also recommend

that the sum of \$2.00 charged against L. O. L. No. 402, be struck off as against the County Lodge. Lodge No. 405 had its receipts in mistake credited to another Lodge, the figures being not plainly made, we recommend that it be struck off against the County Lodge.

Your Committee are of opinion that if the Grand Lodge Rules were carried out by the District and County Masters in their respective Lodges, there are ample means provided for the collection of the dues in the future from Private Lodges.

Rule 25 provides that no Master of a Private Lodge shall receive the Annual, when such Lodge is in arrears for dues to Grand Lodge.

Rule 34, provides that such Lodge shall pay annually not less than \$2 to the Provincial Grand Lodge, and in no case shall receive the Annual until this regulation is complied with.

Rule 53, provides that no officer of the Association shall be allowed to vote in any Lodge, except he is a member of some Private Lodge not in arrears for Grand Lodge dues, or which has not made its returns. If these Rules were properly observed it would save an immense amount of labor to the Grand Secretary, as well as a reduction in the postage spent in sending dunning letters to the County Masters for arrears of dues by the Private Lodges. Your Committee further recommends that the Grand Secretary, in future, publish every year with the proceedings of the Grand Lodge a detailed statement, under the heading of their respective Counties, of the arrears of each Lodge, and the year the arrears accrued, so that such Lodge may know its true financial position to the Grand Lodge as soon as they receive their reports.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CORRESPONDENCE.

To the Grand Lodge of Ontario East:

Your Committee on Correspondence beg respectfully to Report that we have carefully examined your Grand Secretary's Report, and recommend that it be published in the Annual Report of this Grand Lodge, for the ensuing year.

Your Committee have great satisfaction in stating to this R. W. G. L., that your Grand Secretary is not only to be commended for the business like manner in which he has transacted the onerous duties of his office during the past year, but also for the thorough system, order, and care bestowed by him in answering the numerous inquiries addressed to him, and attending to other matters brought under his notice.

Your Committee after examining the volumnious correspondence submitted by your Grand Secretary, find that he has conducted a very large letter correspondence, with almost every Lodge in your jurisdiction. In the letters examined, all sorts of questions important and unimportant which have been asked and answered in that brotherly and courteous manner which should characterize all correspondence between the brethren on official business.

Your Committee would particularly refer to the fact that although the great bulk of the correspondence refers to Constitutional questions misunderstood and misinterpreted by so many of the brethren, nevertheless your Grand Secretary has taken pains to explain the questions in the simplest manner possible, so that the most obtuse brother might comprehend them.

Your Committee are aware that while it bespeaks a proper spirit, and a commendable zeal in the brethren to thus seek for information from your Grand Secretary; we cannot but express regret that so many find it necessary to seek for informatian on the most frivolous matters, which cannot fail to tax the patience of your Grand Secretary beyond endurance, most, if not all of which questions might be more readily solved by referring to the book of Constitutions and Laws of the Order.

Your Committee have examined the Correspondence between your Grand Secretary and the Widow of the late lamented Bro. D'Arcy Boulton. The letter from Mrs. Boulton is worthy of consideration, especially as it contains an expression of the views of her late husband on the important subject of providing a fund, by means of a general tax upon the Orange body, for the relief of the widows and children of deceased Orangemen, and the offer of becoming an annual contributor to such a fund as soon as the Grand Lodge takes steps in this direction.

Your Committee agree with the suggestions contained in Mrs. Boulton's letter, and heartly recommend this R. W. G, L. to initiate or adopt such a movement, believing it would elevate and tend to unite Orangemen more closely in sympathy with our beloved order.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PETITIONS.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Lodge of Ontario East:

Your Committee on Appeals to whom were referred the petitions presented to the Grand Lodge, beg leave to report:

That the petition of the County of Northumberland to restore to membership Jonathan Andrews, who was expelled for non-payment of dues from Lodge No. 554, be granted, it having been asked for by the District Lodge and Lodge No. 554.
