Bill to explore a line of railway from St. John

House of Assembly.—On Monday the 30th,
the St. Andrews and Woodstock Railway Bill
was taken up, and on motion of Mr. Ritchie
postponed for three months.

Mr. Partel afterwards submitted a report from
the Road Committee, recommending the appropriation
of £13,500 for the improvement of the Ry-
roads and Bridges in the several Counties—
£1357 10s. for Charlotte.

On Wednesday, the House went into Committee
on a Bill (introduced by Mr. Boyd) to abolish all
Licenses for selling Spirituous Liquors, and to punish
those who should sell them. In course of the
Debate Mr. Boyd spoke of the individual benefit
he had received from joining the Total Abstinence
Association, and, among other things, stated that
he had never been himself, and able to stand up in
that it was like a man, until the present Session
The Bill was negatived by a large majority, and
the House then resumed its business in Supply.

On Thursday, the House took up Bill to amend
the City Charter of Saint John and passed all but
three or four Sections.

Mr. Council then moved a Resolution in favor of
giving the St. Andrews and Woodstock Railway
Company, when the Line is complete, all the
ungranted Crown Lands within five miles of the
track.—The Resolution was rejected.—[Chronicle.

"Be it enacted by the Lieutenant
Governor, Legislative Council and Assem-
bly, That all persons liable to perform, or
statute labour on the roads and bridges in the
Parish of Campbell, Bells in the County of
Charlotte, shall in future pay the sum of one
shilling and six pence, for each and every
year, for each such person are respectively
liable to perform.
"And be it enacted, That the money
required to be paid by virtue of this Act,
shall be assessed, levied and collected, in
the same manner as any Parish or County
rates are assessed levied and collected, by
virtue of any law now in force, or hereafter
to be in force for that purpose in this
Province; and such money when collected
shall be paid over to the Commissioner of
Highways to be applied for that purpose
in the same manner, and by the same au-
thority, as Commissioners of Highways are
now appointed, to be by them expended, by
public auction in their respective districts on
the Highways and Bridges in said districts.
"And be it enacted, That this Act
shall continue and be in force until the first
day of April which will be in the year of our
Lord thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.
