CULTIVATION OF HEMP.

THE PREPARATION OF THE SOIL.

Even the best land which may be selected requires preparation and improvement, so us to fit it for the culture of hemp. In the first place, labourers are required, and then the best and most effective manure must be used—hemp exhausting the soil as much as corn.
