The evening was passed very pleasantly with music, games and other amusements followed by dainty refreshments.

We had the pleasure this week of inspecting a new carbonating machine which has been set up at Parker's Pharmacy by Mr E. W. Fox, a native of this county, and a brother of John H. Fox, of New York, the inventor. The apparatus comprises a carbonator in which carbonic acid gas is mingled with the water, the gas being supplied from a tube in which it is commonly sold; a siphon filling machine which holds the siphon while they are being filled with the charged water from the carbonator; and a bottle capping machine for capping small bottles. The machine is intended for bottling all kinds of mineral water, filling siphons, and may be connected at the same time for counter use, supplying soda water, etc. It is known as the "Dinic Carbonating Machine" and is a most complete apparatus and a big improvement over any hitherto in use. Mr Fox has secured an option on the patents for use in Canada, and is organizing a company for the purpose of carrying on the business. On Saturday of next week a public exhibition of the working of the machine is to be given, and the public will have an opportunity of testing the quality of the drinks.
