It is a burning shame to Canadians that they should look tamely on while their country is shown by events to be, in a certain sense, a commercial dependency of the United States.

A gigantic American monopoly, for such it virtually is, notwithstanding the existence of competition to a limited extent—has for some time been tyrannizing over the public and its own employees both at once.

The latter having struck for better terms, what follows? A stoppage of telegraph facilities, confined to the country in which the trouble really exists, or where it originated, perhaps not, but the inclusion of Canada in the trouble, just as if these provinces were states of the union.

Had we maintained the independence of our own telegraphic system this would not have happened. Had the independence of the Montreal and the Dominion companies respectively, or even that of the former alone, been preserved, we should not have been in the "fix" we are in to-day; nor would the commercial subjugation of Canada to the United States have been so conspicuously forced upon public attention.

The people of Toronto, at all events, are now in a position to appreciate Mr. Wiman's generous gift to them of so-called free baths, which as a matter of fact have to be paid for every time.

But Mr. Scott has too many friends to allow this to go unnoted. As for Sir John Macdonald, we fail to see how it will profit him to allow Bunting to write down every good conservative who doesn't happen to please him.

A BIG OPPORTUNITY FOR THE GRAND TRUNK.

The telegraph crisis brings to the Grand Trunk one of those opportunities which come only at intervals of decades or scores of years.

A foreign monopoly now controls the entire telegraphic system of Canada, with this exception, that in the Northwest the Canadian Pacific has its own wires, as indeed under the circumstances it is compelled to have.

In the great new country, therefore, we possess that one portion of our telegraphic system which is not controlled from any Canadian worthy of the name.

Looking forward to the day when, either by government interference or in some other way, this telegraph to the dominion—that it is a mere commercial dependency of the United States as far as the telegraphic business is concerned—will be wiped out.

But while waiting and working for the larger consummation of Canada's telegraphic independence (to the extent that such independence is possible), there appears to be something that might be done in the meantime, and which would help greatly towards the larger result.

It is to be done in the Northwest by the Canadian Pacific doing its own telegraphing in the Northwest why cannot the Grand Trunk do its own over the thousands of miles of road which it operates, from Lake Superior to the Detroit river and Lake Huron?

This might be looked upon as a bold move, but the Grand Trunk is quite strong enough to make it and to carry it out successfully.

This would be a popular stroke for the Grand Trunk and would bring round to the Grand Trunk itself a seething tide of public opinion. It remains to be seen whether the authorities of that road have their eyes open to the splendid opportunity now before them, and at the same time the nerve to seize it and act upon it.

UNIVERSITY MATRICULATION EXAMINATIONS.

The authorities of the university of Toronto owe the public, and especially the candidates, an explanation of the delay in making known the results of the June matriculation examinations.

It is now some six weeks since they took place. It is likely to be two more before the results are known. The consequence is that nearly two hundred young persons are held in a long suspense. Those that are through want to know the fact and enjoy the satisfaction; those who have failed, they may get ready to try again or take to something else.

In other universities the results are known as many days after writing as it takes weeks in Toronto.

Garlie in 2:20, 2:23, and 2:20. Since then he has lost but three races, and prior to his appearance at Chicago he made his best previous record of 2:17. He was sold on July 18 to the secretary of the Gainsville (Ky.) track for \$10,000, but Fayette Smith, his former owner, says he is willing to match him against any trotter or pacer in the United States, Johnson preferred for the sum of \$10,000 a side, and it is stated that he has shown such trials in private as would warrant the making of such a match.
