I was over on the sand bank on the south side of Ashbridge's Bay on Thursday, taking a look at the works in progress there, and I went ag in this morning 50 see what changes the storm had made. On Thursday the channel which had been dredged between the bay and the lake was about 50 feet in the narrowest part. To-day it is about 60 feet, not 200, as stated in an evening paper on Saturday, and although the water was as smooth as a milipond a strong current was running out from the bay into the lake. I am inclined to think the works now in progress will, if completed before the winter, be sufficient to keep the channel open always and that when the cut from Toronto Bay into Ashbridge's Bay is complèted there will be a steady flow and that the water will be reasonably clear, The City Engineer seems to have hit upon the projer spot for the channel into the lake. Contractor Shields has made good progress with the eastern breakwater, which runs out opposite Lang-street due south about 400 feet into the lake. He has driven three rows of piles about four feet apart and the spaces between which are filled in with stones up to the level of the lake. Large rocks are being dumped between the piles on the top of the stones, and it looks as if a breakwater will be repermanent sandy beach running north and south east of the breakwater. The western breakwater is very backward. A few piles have been driven, but no men were at work nor are there signs of anything being done. 


