SIR CHARLES TUPPER

IS THE BIGGEST TRAVELER

Great Enthusiasm at Brockville, Where the Veteran and Virile Leader of the Conservatives Spoke Amid Cheers for Two Hours.

All three places have paid flattering tributes to the Champion of Canada for the Centennial by turning out an immense attendance respectfully and attentively to his message, applauding him generously and altogether receiving him with unprecedented outbursts of spontaneous enthusiasm, mingled with affection and respect, and whatever the issue of the fight, of this Sir Charles may be sure, that this town is a Tupper triumph.

THE TRANSVAAL IS NOW A PART OF THE GREAT BRITISH EMPIRE

Proclamation of the Fact Was Made at Pretoria on Thursday Amid Impressive Ceremonies—Desperate Attack on Jacobdals Repulsed—Garrison Lost 14 Killed.

Pretoria, Oct. 25.—The Transvaal was today proclaimed a part of the British Empire, the proclamation being attended with impressive ceremonies. The Royal Standard was hoisted in the main square of the city, the proclamation was read by the British High Commissioner, and the British bands played the National Anthem, Sir Alfred Miller read the proclamation, and 6000 troops representing Great Britain and her colonies, marched past.

A Curious Coincidence.
London, Oct. 25.—It is regarded here as a curious coincidence that the news of the capture of Jacobdals by the Boers should be received concurrently with the expected arrival from South Africa of the City Imperial Corporation's "The Orange" steamer, which was captured by the Boers on the 23rd of the month.

HIGHLANDERS SLAUGHTERED.
Boers have captured Jacobdals after a most desperate resistance. Cape Town, Oct. 25.—The Boers have captured Jacobdals, southeast of Kimberley, after a stubborn resistance on the part of the garrison, which consisted of a detachment of Cape Town Highlanders. The latter suffered severely, losing 34 out of 52 men.

The Place Was Not Captured.
London, Oct. 27.—It now appears that Jacobdals was not captured by the Boers, advice received from Cape Town shortly after midnight says:

"Later news from Jacobdals shows that 20 Boers unsuccessfully attacked the garrison. The Highlanders had 14 killed and 20 wounded."

London Cable to Evening Post Says That the General Manager of the G.T.R. Has Resigned

TO RUN THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC RY.

Will Have Headquarters at San Francisco as President of the Big American Road.
New York, Oct. 26.—A despatch to The Evening Post from London says that Charles M. Hays, general manager of the Grand Trunk Railway, has resigned to accept the presidency of the Southern Pacific.
The Evening Post says that this statement has been confirmed by the highest Southern Pacific authorities.
According to the Evening Post, the directors of the company have all agreed on Mr. Hays for the presidency, although formal action is not to be taken until next week. Mr. Hays will reside in San Francisco, and will have complete charge of the operation of the railway with C. H. Tweed as chairman of the Board of Directors in New York.
Charles M. Hays has been general manager of the Grand Trunk since Jan. 1, 1898. He was at one time general manager of the Missouri Pacific, and at a later period occupied the same position on the Wabash.

MR. HAYS WOULD NOT DENY IT.

Report That He Will Leave Grand Trunk for Southern Pacific Believed to Be Correct.
Montreal, Oct. 26.—(Special.)—C. M. Hays, general manager of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, when asked by The World to-night regarding the report from New York that he had accepted the presidency of the Southern Pacific, declined to make a statement for publication. He simply said that the report had not been denied, but he did not deny it. It is generally believed in railway circles that the report is well founded.

Mr. Hays' Great Work.
Mr. Hays has been general manager of the Grand Trunk since Jan. 1, 1898, and has done a great deal of work. He has increased the revenue of the company by \$5,000,000 over the market price of 1903. This is a record for any railway general manager in the world. He has also increased the number of passengers and the volume of freight traffic. He has done all this in a very short time, and his work is being widely appreciated.

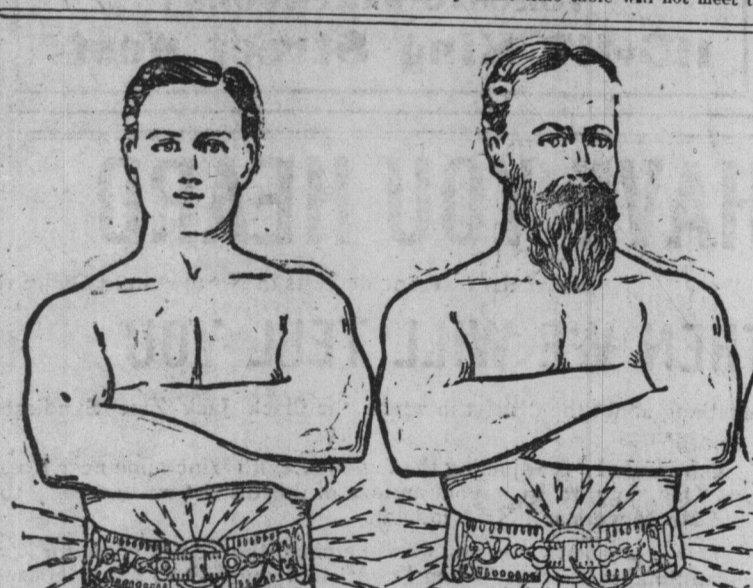

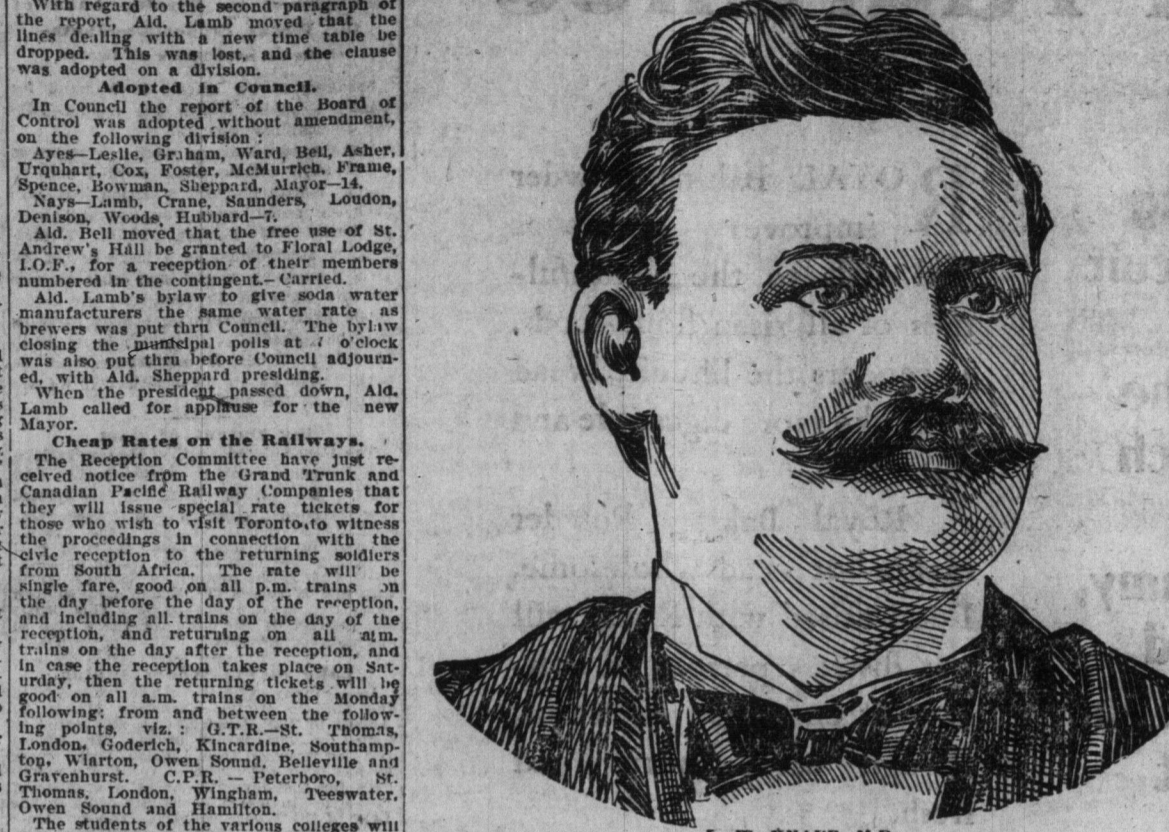
