The Session meets on the first Tuesday of each month in the vestry.

The Weekly Prayer Meeting of the Congregation is held every Wednesday evening, at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

The Ordinance of Baptism is dispensed on the first Wednesday o each month, at the Prayer Meeting, in the Lecture Room.

The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper is dispensed on the first Sabbaths in February, June and October.

The Sabbath School meets every Sabbath in the Lecture Room, at $2\frac{1}{2}$ p.m. Bible Class meets in the Bible Class Room, at the same hour.

The Sabbath School Teachers meet on the first Monday in each month, at 7 o'clock, in the Library.

The Committee of the Missionary Society and Collectors meet on the first Wednesday in each month, and meeting of the congregation for prayer and the receiving of Missionary intelligence, is held on the same evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

The Deacons' Court and Managing Committee meet on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Library.

Pew Holders leaving the bounds, or giving up their sittings, are requested to give notice to the Pew Secretary, in order that the seats may be re-let at once. Pew rent is payable quarterly, in advance, on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July and 1st October.

TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Managing Committee

OF

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON

FOR THE YEAR 1875.

- 1. In presenting the Twenty-Fifth Annual Report of the Congregation, the Managing Committee would desire to acknowledge the goodness of God vouchsafed to us during the past year, and to render Him our thanks in permitting us once more to meet in regard to matters pertaining to His cause.
- 2. It is with regret that your Committee allude to the difficulties and trials through which the Congregation passed during the year, and more especially in reference to the removal to another field of labor of our late beloved Pastor. Your Committee sincerely hope that the separation of the Pastoral tie may, in the

Providence of God, be overruled for good to this congregation, and that happiness, peace, renewed health, and a prolonged sphere of usefulness, be granted Mr. Scott in that portion of our Lord's vineyard to which he has been called.

- 3. Your Committee were greatly encouraged in their work in finding the Congregation so fully represented from Sabbath to Sabbath throughout the year. This to them was a hopeful indication that the unhappy dissensions in the Congregation would be healed under a new pastorate, and your Committee now congratulate the Congregation that this wished for result is consummated, as witnessed by the unaminous call to the Rev. Mr. Murray.
- 4. Your Committee have much satisfaction in reporting considerable progress in the financial condition of the Congregation. The interest and compound interest which had been accruing in the past year, 1874, amounting to \$790, have been paid off. The interest due on all the Church liabilities for the year just ended has been met, and we commence 1876 with our Minister's quarterly salary paid in advance, and our other current expenses settled.
- 5. The Treasurer's books have been audited and found correct, and an abstract of the receipts and disbursements for the year is annexed to this report.
- 6. Your Committee, about three months ago, opened a Subscription List for the purpose of meeting our

OF THE

Hoard of Trustees of St. Andrew's Church.

The Board of Trustees of St. Andrew's Church beg leave to submit the following report.

1. With feelings of profound sorrow the undersigned have to report the death, on the 12th of February, 1875, of John Birrell, Esq., one of the original Trustees and office bearers of this church, and also one of the most liberal supporters of the congregation ever since its formation. His sudden death reminds us that in the midst of life we are in death, and that we know not what a day or an hour may bring forth.

2. On the 25th of February, 1875, the Board of Trustees met to consider what steps should be taken to fill up the vacancy at the Board caused by the death of Mr. Birrell, when it was unanimously agreed to appoint Joseph Atkinson, Esq., to the position of Trustee of St. Andrew's Church, and that Warren Rock, Esq., be instructed to prepare the necessary papers for Mr. Atkinson's appointment, and to get the same executed and recorded according to law.

3. In the fall of 1874 the undersigned discovered that several years ago, when drawing up the papers for

The Board have now agreed to procure a minute book and in future all the transactions of the Board will be faithfully recorded, and the deed of the property and all the papers of importance affecting the church property will be copied into the minute book for future reference, all of which is respectfully submitted.

The annual meeting of the Office Bearers and Teachers of the above schools was held in the Library, on the evening of Monday, January 10th, 1876 Reports from the various schools for the past year were submitted, and the Office Bearers for 1876 appointed.

The report from the Central School shows the attendance during the year to have been slightly in advance of previous year. This is very satisfactory, when the circumstances in which the congregation and school were placed during the past year are considered. Not only did the cause suffer from want of a regular pastor for nine months of the year, but by sickness and removal from the city, the school was deprived of some of its most faithful teachers.

The ordinary collections have increased, but there has been a great deficiency in the amount collected for our pupils at Pointe aux Tremble; this is partly accounted for through change of teachers and the interest not being maintained by the annual visit of the Agent.
