Berlin, Germany, Nov. 21—Germany for some time has been expressing alarm at the falling birth rate and now has dis-covered a new sign of 'social decadence. It is the "marriage crisis." Latest statistics show an extraordin-ary rise in the number of divorces ob-tained in Germany. For instance, 15,780 divorces were obtained in 1911 against 12,160 in 1906.
