The Thirty-Third Annual Report

—of the —

Orphans' Home of the City of Ottawa.

Never, perhaps, in the history of this institution, has its work been carried on more satisfactorily than during the past year. Everything has been in good running order, and the managers feel that in presenting this, their thirty-third Annual Report, they have great cause for thankfulness.

The register of the institution gives the following statistics :

The total number of both adults and children has been 142. Collective days' stay, 28,124.

About twelve have been placed in the Home by the “Children's Aid Society,” an association whose operations are kindred to our own, and which is doing much to rescue neglected and cruelly treated children from their unfortunate surroundings.

The care of the inmates remains in the same hands. Miss Horne and Miss Merrick, the former in charge of the children and the latter of the aged women, have given unremitting

attention to their often very difficult duties, while Miss Braden continues her work in the schoolroom, under the care of the Public School Board.

HEALTH.

It is not necessary to enter into particulars regarding the health of the inmates, as a full report will be given by the attending physicians, except to remark that there has been no epidemic in the Home during the past year, and that for nearly four years there has been no death among the children. This surely speaks well for the care exercised by the Matron and the excellent food and sanitary conditions of the Home. Three of the women have passed away, at an advanced age. The attending physicians, Dr. Small and Dr. J. A. Grant, Jr., have the renewed thanks of the Board for their professional services so kindly rendered, and Mr. Henry Watters is also thanked for again supplying medicine free of charge. The Children's Hospital has, as heretofore, taken care of any cases needing special treatment, the Managers would therefore express to the authorities of that institution their grateful acknowledgements.

FINANCES.

Though the affairs of the Home have been managed with as much economy as was consistent with the efficient carrying on of its affairs, the Committee regret having to announce, for the first time, an overdrawn account of \$166.04.

The usual grants have been received from the Ontario Government and the County Council, from the former \$993.77, from the latter \$125.00.

The late Mr. John Graham bequeathed the sum of \$500 to the Home, of which \$100 has been received.

Attention is directed to the Treasurer's report for full particulars regarding the finances.

In accordance with the requirements of the law, fire-escapes have been erected at both wings of the building. The interior

of the house was thoroughly overhauled last spring, walls tinted and everything put in good order, the roof repaired, sheds and fences painted, at an outlay of \$477.33, as the Managers consider it wise economy to keep the premises in a good state of repair. One hundred dollars, the donation of His Worship the Mayor, was applied to this object, thanks are given for this timely gift.

LIFE MEMBERS.

We are happy to add to our life members the names of Mrs. David MacLaren and Mrs. Alex. Lumsden of Ottawa, and Mr. and Mrs. M. Dwight Johnston, Mrs. Eleanor Vosburgh and Dwight Vernet Johnson of Oak Park, Illinois. Mr. and Mrs. Johnston, having visited the Home, were so pleased with the good work carried on, that they desired to express their appreciation of it by making themselves and the other members of their family life members of the institution.

We regret the resignation of three members of our Board of Management, Mrs. W. H. Walker, Mrs. C. Macnab and Mrs. Z. Wilson. They have all been earnest and faithful workers for many years, Mrs. Walker's name being one of the only four found on the first printed list of Managers who have remained connected with the Home up to the present time.

The Home is affiliated with the Local Council of Women, the Children's Aid Society and Associated Charities, and sends representatives to all these associations.

THANKS.

As usual, the children, by invitation of the directors, enjoyed a day at the Exhibition. In this connection special thanks are due to Mr. J. W. McRae, who made the day such a happy one for the children by giving them an opportunity of seeing all the sights to advantage and afterwards sending them home, a happy band, in the cars.

Mr. Woodruff very kindly gave an exhibition of his graphophone last winter, and all the inmates, by means of the "Fresh Air fund," were given a trip to Aylmer Park during the past summer.

The Board are under obligation to Mrs. Robt. McGregor for her kindness in taking one of the children for two months to her summer home in the country, an outing which was much enjoyed by the boy.

The Committee would thank those clergymen who have visited the Home, especially Rev. H. Southam who has held

regular services every Monday. They would also express their thanks to Mr. John Christie for legal advice, to Mr. Maynard Rogers for funeral expenses of one of the inmates, to the press of the city for copies of their journals and insertion of donations, to the dentists of the city, to Mr. John Curtis, barber, and many others who, from time to time, have rendered services or sent donations to the Home.

Exhibition time always brings to the Home former inmates who have grown to manhood and womanhood, and who take advantage of their presence in the city to revisit the institution where they spent their childhood and which most of them remember with gratitude. Many express to the matron their appreciation of the benefits which in early years they derived from the care bestowed upon them here.

To those who have watched the growth of Ottawa since the inception of this charity in 1864, nothing is more striking than the steady increase of institutions for the care and relief of the needy and suffering. When this Home was founded there were no asylums for orphans or destitute children in the city, nor was provision made for the aged, except in the hospitals. Now it seems as if every class of suffering was provided for. During these thirty-three years this Home has afforded a refuge for aged women and children. Let us hope that as other charitable institutions multiply, this, the oldest and certainly not the least deserving, may not be forgotten by its old friends, and that new friends may rise up to carry on the work, the foundation of which has been so well and truly laid by a generation now passing away.

Report of Attending Physicians.

To the President and Board of Directors of the Orphans' Home :

We beg to present the following report upon the health of the inmates of the Home during the past year.

We are happy to state that the health of the inmates has been excellent, and during the year there has not been a single infectious case of any kind. There have been a considerable number of cases of minor ailments among the children, but none fatal.

Three of the aged women have died ; Mrs. Sumlor, at 76, apoplexy ; Mrs. Clifford, at 78, gangrene ; Mrs. Hebb, at 70, crsipelas.

The following is a list of the cases treated :—

Diarrhoea 7, Eye Disease 4, Febricula 3, Indigestion 4, Eczema 4, Anaemia 2, Cystitis 2, Fracture 1, Palpitation 1, Debility 2, Ear-Disease 4, Influenza 6, Ulcer 1, Neuralgia 1, Insomnia 2, Constipation 4, Bronchitis 2, Menengitis 1, Tuberculous glands 1, Cramp 1, Asthma 1 ; total 54.

Seven cases had to be sent to the Children's Hospital, where they received every care and attention.

Three cases had to be isolated, fearing the onset of some infectious disease, and for that purpose we used a room on the top flat, fortunately none of them proved serious, but it is at present impossible to thoroughly isolate a suspicious case.

Among the aged women there has been considerable illness, and some of these cases would come under the head of incurables, that at present are difficult to dispose of, but thanks to the generosity of our citizens they seem likely soon to have their own institution.

Let us offer our praise for the work done by the matrons Miss Horne and Miss Merrick and their assistants. The young and old receive not only care and attention, but this is a home to them in every sense of the term.

There are few among you better able to judge of the usefulness of this institution than the attending physicians, coming as we do at all times and seasons, and we sincerely congratulate the Board of Management and their co-workers on the noble work they have so successfully carried on for thirty-three years.
