## 70 MILE AN HOUR GALE

Sweeps Washington, unroofing buildings and doing great damage.

While three persons were killed and many injured.

**WASHINGTON, July 31.**—A cyclone storm with rain and hail whipped back and forth across the capital city, leaving death and ruin in its wake. Three dead, several injured and hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of property ruined were the toll of the storm.

Out of the blinding sky, with the temperature at 100, came the storm, sweeping the city, driving a mass of clouds that cut a deadly path through the city. The gale, reaching a velocity of nearly 100 miles an hour, swept the streets clear, unroofed houses, and leveled many of the city's foundations, wrecked one office building, overturned many cars, and from their roofs, tearing huge branches from trees, and even uprooting many old oaks, the landmarks of a century.
