There will be four Eclipses, two of the Sun, and two of the Moon. The first is a Partial Eclipse of the Moon, the 10th of March, at 1 o'clock 20 minutes in the morning, visible. Duration 2 hours; the Moon will be eclipsed over 3 Digits on the Southern Part.

The second is an Annular Eclipse of the Sun, the 25th of March, at 4 o'clock 50 minutes in the Afternoon, visible. Duration 1 hour 37 minutes; the Sun will be eclipsed 3', Digits on the Northern Part; will be Annular in the North West of America.

The third is a Partial Eclipse of the Moon, the 3d of September, at 4 o'clock 21 minutes, in the Afternoon, therefore invisible; till the Moon rises the Eclipse has passed.

The fourth is a Total Eclipse of the Sun, the 17th of September, at 5 o'clock in the Evening, invisible in the United States; visible on the Northern and Southern Pacific Ocean and Australia.





The rate of Postage on a letter posted in the Dominion of Canada, to any place in Canada, is 3 cents per half ounce and to the United Lingdom 5 cents per half ounce, but this must be pre-paid by postage-ste mp, at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted unpaid, cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead-Letter Office.

The rate for drop-letters is one cent per belf ounce, to be pre-paid by stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, addressed and posted by the Publisher to regular subschibers, or News-agents, may be posted at the rate of one cent for each pound weight, or fraction of a pound, but must be pre-paid. It will be obligatory on Publishers to pre-pay postage on printed matter after Oct. 1st, 1875.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals posted in Canada, other than those addressed to regular Subscribers, the rate of postage will be, one cent per four ounces, to be prepaid by Stamp. Newspapers weighing test than one ounce each may be posted Sixglix, if prepaid by postage-stamp, one-half cent each.

Newspapers posted in Canada, for the United States or Newfoundland, are to be prepaid the same rates as if addressed to places within the Dominian.

11. On books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices-current, hand bills, book and newspaper manuscripts, printers' proof sheets, whether corrected or not, maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, sheet music printed or written, documents wholly or partly printed or written, cuch as deeds, insurance policies, militia and school returns, or other documents of like nature, packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, or grafts, patterns or examples of goods or merchandise, when posted in Canada, for any place in Canada the rate of postage will be one cent per four cunces in weight, to be prepaid by pustage stamp, or by stamped post-kands when saitable for the purpose. No letter or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter must be sent or enalosed in any article of miscellaneous mail matter; and all transmissions anthorized by this regulation must be put up in bovers, open at the onds or existing and the rate of postage will be one
