The United States has begun to point out to the Allies some of its own great necessities in certain trade lines for which this country was entirely dependent on them up to the time the United States entered the war. Many products could be imported here only if there were surplus at the point of production over the needs of the Allies, also on condition that agreements be signed that the products be not allowed to fall into the hands of the enemy. Balfour to-day received a deputation of Irish-Americans who laid their views before him and called attention to the favorable impression that a solution of the Irish situation would have on this country. Balfour said that while he had no power to speak for the Government he could say that everything possible was being done to bring Ulster, the Redmonites and the Sein Fein elements together, and that the British Parliament stood ready to agree to any solution which the Irish themselves found acceptable. 
