Mr. Emmerson Admitted
That Serious Consideration
Was Due the Proposal.

Ottawa, July 14.—(Special)—Four amendments to the railway act proposed to the house today by W. F. Maclean were formally declared "lost on division" after a long and heated discussion extending over several hours. The amendments were considered in connection with Mr. Fitzpatrick's bill to amend the railway act.

At the suggestion of the minister of justice they were taken up in advance of the motion for the bill. The amendments which followed were marked with brief differences of opinion, but the settlement of the house was much more favorable to the amendments than those who watched the recent proceedings in the railway committee were led to expect.

The third reading of the bill will be moved on Tuesday next, when the house will be divided on each of the four amendments, which were voted down today. Briefly stated the amendments were as follows:

To bring express companies under the jurisdiction of the railway commission.
To give independent telephone companies access to all railway stations on payment of the actual damage sustained in consequence of their entry upon the railway company's premises.
To apply the Michigan law of graded passenger rates to Canadian railways.

Also defeated at this stage of the bill, the amendments met with considerable favor from both sides of the house, and the matter of the passenger rates will be further considered when the bill comes up again for consideration on Tuesday.

G.R. HAS GOT THE G.B.
IN SPITE OF QUINRY TALES

Already Plans Under Way for Nu-
merous New Bridges and
Added Rolling Stock.

From Hamilton comes the report
that the latest information would
indicate that the Canadian Niagara Power
Company was the purchaser of the
H. G. & B. The former was regarded
in some quarters as a larger concern
than the Toronto-based Niagara Power
Company, managed by MacKenzie &
Mann, and it was known that it was
acquiring considerable property in the
vicinity of the Falls. Niagara Power
possesses, but since not a sufficient
number of factories could be located there
to consume all the power that would
be produced, an electric railway of a
high voltage nature would offer a de-
sired outlet.

It is also asserted that the Canadian
Niagara Power Company has designs
on the electric railway from the Falls
to Hamilton, and that its pur-
pose is to improve the line and to
chase is not impracticable in the
future.

The World received information
from a credible source last night, how-
ever, that the Grand Trunk Railway
is the actual purchaser of the Hamil-
ton, Grimsby & Beamsville Electric
Railway, and that its reported acqui-
sition by the Canadian Niagara Power
Company was a rumor absolutely with-
out foundation. The Grand Trunk has
not only a long history of construction
of numerous bridges and the general
improvement of its lines, but also
its equipment considerable
rolling stock.

COL. SMART IS IN THE CITY.

Col. Smart of the 13th Scottish Light
