If in the opinion of a majority of the parishioners aspled at the meeting it is thought desirable that such divishould be effected, the chairman shall signify the same e Bishop, and the Bishop shall then, if he think proper, the necessary steps to divide such parish or mission. And in the event of any attempt to procure the division parish otherwise than in the manner above specified, the Bishop is hereby authorized on behalf and in the name is Synod to petition the Legislature to refuse their sancto such division.
