The Sacred Heart Orphan Asylum is under the patronage of His Grace, Archbishop Walsh of Toronto, and is managed by the Sisters of St. Joseph. It is one of the many proofs of the Christian charity of the citizens of Ontario's busy metropolis. The dormitories, class-rooms, refectories and play-rooms are large and well ventilated. This worthy institution is situated on the Lake Shore Road, near the present western terminus of the Queen street electric railway, and for beauty of scenery and delightfully refreshing breezes the locality can scarcely be surpassed by any of the fair suburbs of Toronto. The well shaded lawns and playgrounds surrounding the Institution are ample and attractive, and afford the orphan children many opportunities for the enjoyment of healthful exercise. The boys have free access to the north-eastern portion of the grounds, while the girls amuse themselves on the sunny slope to the south.

The foregoing shows that 479 destitute children were cared for during the past year. Of these 276 remain in the Institution, their ages ranging from four to fourteen years. It is needless to expatiate on the usefulness of such a sanctuary. The name "Orphan Asylum" speaks volumes in itself, it tells us that it is the shelter of the homeless, that its inmates are fatherless and motherless, it tells us that it is the abode of the young who require to be cherished, and who cannot possibly support themselves, and it tells us that it fosters, loves and brightens the shadowed lives of the orphans. Those in charge derive no material advantage, nothing save the generous, meritorious and noble work of moulding young hearts and minds; instructing them carefully and long all in their power to make them good Christian men and women. During the past year, 11 girls were provided with good homes in the country, 27 were placed with respectable families in the city, and the majority, 63 were taken by friends or relatives. Of the boys, 6 were sent to learn trades; 12 were placed with farmers; 2 were transferred to the Idiot Asylum, Orillia; 2 mutes were sent to the Deaf and Dumb Institute, Buffalo; 3 were admitted to the St. Nicholas Institute, and the greater number, 77, were taken by friends and relatives.

MEDICAL REPORT.

In making my report, as one of the attending physicians of the Sacred Heart Orphanage, for the year 1893, I have to repeat the story of the preceding year, I have this to say in addition however, that each succeeding year seems to bring with it increased usefulness, and a greater degree of admiration on the part of the many friends of the Institution. There can be no manifest improvement on the part of the Sisters in the discharge of their duties as guardians of God's orphans, because these duties could not possibly be better performed by human beings.

There has been very little sickness among the three hundred children during the year, and no deaths. This is a record that cannot be excelled by any institution of its size in existence.

LETTER FROM THE CHAPLAIN.

It is with the deepest feeling of gratitude to Divine Providence, that the Sisters of St. Joseph, who are charged with the interests of this most deserving Institution, find themselves able to give to the public generally, and their charitable supporters in particular, a most satisfactory statement of their work for the year ending December, 1893. All that is included in the education, support and clothing of nearly 300 orphan children, apart from the slender assistance they receive from the City Council, and the usual Government allowance, must be attributed to the constant self-sacrifice of those religious whose lives are a counterpart of His who was beyond all the Friend of the suffering and destitute, and the Father of the orphan. With the sanction and approval of His Grace, our revered Archbishop, they throw themselves heart and soul into this work at once magnificent and divine. For who will deny that besides the protection offered these tiny strangers of our City and Province, (as most of the little ones may be called) from the pangs of hunger and want felt especially this year by numbers of God's poor; a yet grander and nobler protection is given in the religious training they receive. Here the principles of honor in life, and honesty of purpose and those high moral aims which lead to the highest attainments, civil and christian, are implanted in young and ardent natures, affording the surest guarantee against the withering blasts of moral corruption found in the evil example too common unfortunately, in the greater school of the outside world. Within the shelter of this sanctuary many a poor child breathes for the first time a purely religious atmosphere, and receives its first lesson in the aspirations that dignify a christian's life work.

Owing partly to hereditary causes, and in the case of those who are received at any advanced stage in life, very often to early neglect of parents, the work of imparting knowledge is by no means an easy one. How far the Sisters have succeeded in removing the obstacles that lie in the path of the intellectual progress of so many little aspirants to knowledge, may be gathered from the gratifying report of the Separate School Inspector, Mr. Donovan, appended at the close of this annual statement.

Besides the department of secular knowledge, a special department for the moral and religious training of the children is presided over by the Chaplain. That they enjoy especial opportunities for the development of fine religious instincts from daily attendance at the Holy Sacrifice, the frequent reception of Sacraments, constant religious instructions, and a home under the same roof with the Infant Saviour, and that they appreciate these advantages it is my pleasure to bear testimony. In connection with this, it may be mentioned that a class of 25 boys and 27 girls is in course of preparation for the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion. An hour every day is devoted to their special instruction.

The report presents many features of interest. The average, annual cost of maintaining an orphan in this institution is shown to be only a fraction over \$35. From reports of similar Asylums both in Canada and the United States, \$50 is considered a low average in a like purpose. The grant from the City Council is extremely meagre, being only \$600, while to a Protestant Orphan Home in this city, numbering 220 inmates, they give an annual donation of \$2,000, or proportionately nearly five times that amount. It is hoped that a more liberal patronage will be extended both by the city and our charitable friends during the new year. By giving spiritual adoption, say to one orphan, any of our wealthy Catholics could expend \$35 out of their abundance and have the exceeding great reward of rescuing one of Christ's little ones from physical and spiritual want. Might not the Separate School Board of Toronto, also, by some

friendly apportionment, by giving salary for instance for an additional teacher, or at least by paying for the books used in the class rooms, help to lighten the burden on the shoulders of those in charge of Sunnyside. Benefactors need not have any fear that one cent of their contributions will be wasted. On the contrary, the greatest possible economy is observed. The children are made to bear a large share in their own maintenance. They work in the kitchen and laundry and make and mend all their clothing.

The bright and sunny faces of the orphans attest what is not set forth in the subjoined statement, viz. : that the Sisters, by their devotedness, fill if possible the place of parents in their regard. A few days, and the impressions of their former surroundings begin to wear away from the minds of the newly admitted. No uniform in dress is used to give cause for humiliation, but all feel, as indeed they are, members of one large happy family. From the attention they receive and the constant surveillance of superiors in the dormitories, class and work rooms, and even during the hours of recreation, it may be safely claimed that no 300 children in Toronto are more carefully tended, than the little waifs at Sunnyside.

The good Sisters in charge of the Orphanage hereby desire to return their heartfelt thanks to their kind benefactors. They are especially grateful that during a period of depression which is felt all over the country, and from which an institution of this kind must necessarily suffer, the kindness of numerous friends has prevented their curtailing any portion of their noble work, or their being compelled to refuse admittance to a single child during the past year. The November collections in the various city parishes amounted to a neat sum, and the interest shown in former years by the diocesan missions will no doubt, be adhered to, and good returns made. This report is given to the charitable public of all denominations, with a view to create a lively interest in the welfare of the Institution, and hence enable those in charge to extend

their manifold charity in ever widening circles. May the blessing of heaven accompany it!

For my own part, may I be permitted to say in conclusion, that during a period of delicate health, I have been appointed by His Grace, our venerated Archbishop, to take spiritual charge of the Orphanage. It has been to me a source of great joy to bear even a small part in promoting the good work, and from constant association with the little ones, a means of realizing in the sunshine of God, love that is apparent in their lives, the truth of the words of our Blessed Saviour: "Suffer the little children to come to me, and forbid them not, for the kingdom of heaven is for such." That the same Divine Providence, whose continued exercise is manifested in the care of so many dear little ones, may grant me strength and zeal to labor for their best and dearest interests, is my constant prayer.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- I. The Asylum is open to Orphans from four years to the age of fourteen, without distinction as to race or religion.
- II. It is required that children be recommended by a clergyman or some person of respectability, except cases which come under the Sisters' notice in their visits to the sick.
- III. The sum of one dollar per week is required for children whose friends can afford to pay that sum.
- IV. Relatives and friends are permitted to visit the children on Thursdays and Saturdays, from 2 o'clock to 4 p. m.
- V. The girls are trained to all domestic duties, knitting, sewing, etc.
- VI. The boys are employed in various duties out of school hours, gardening, baking, tailoring, etc.
- VII. The children are never allowed to leave the Asylum without permission.
- VIII. The children are always under the supervision of the Sisters, who take notes of how they conduct themselves at play or elsewhere.
- IX. Silence to be observed in the dormitories, refectories and corridors.
- X. All retire to bed at 7.30 o'clock in Winter, and 8 in Summer.

Conditions and terms upon which children are placed out from the Sacred Heart Orphan Asylum, Queen St. west :

Boys are given out from seven to fourteen, and bound until they are twenty-one years of age.

Boys and girls placed out for adoption while under seven years of age.

Girls between seven and fourteen years of age, will not in future be given out.

Parties wishing to obtain children, must make application upon the forms provided for that purpose, which will be found with the various parish priests, or can be obtained by writing to the Orphanage. The sum of five dollars must be paid in advance to the Institution for an outfit. The applicant must execute the agreement required by the Orphanage authorities, and pay the Solicitor's fee of two dollars, for preparing and revising the same, and must defray the travelling expenses of the child to destination.

At the end of two months, children may be returned to the Orphan Asylum, if not giving satisfaction.

The agreement will be signed in triplicate by the Superior, and the applicant, each receiving a copy, the third being filed in the Office of the Solicitor, acting for the Institution.

There is no payment required for boys given out at the age of seven, until they attain the age of ten, when money must be forwarded annually to the Orphan Asylum as follows :

The sum of above payments is payable, with interest, to the boy or girl on attaining the age of twenty one years, subject however, to the discretion of the Orphan Asylum authorities, to withhold such payments, for such length of time as they may deem advisable, if with the approval and sanction of the Archbishop of Toronto, they deem it in the interest of any girl or young man so to do.

Special mention should be made of an anonymous donation from St. Catharines, \$50.00, for procuring good reading matter for the Orphans. This enabled the Institution to provide them with many useful, instructive and entertaining books. These and many other things, which would contribute much to the amusement of the little ones, such as skates, sleds, games, etc., the resources of the Orphanage do not permit the Sisters to procure.

If our kindly benefactors only knew how acceptable cast-off clothing, hats for girls, and caps for the boys, would be, they would not hesitate to send them.

Friends of the Institution who have such articles, which they no longer require in their own homes, would add greatly to the pleasure of the children by sending them to the Orphanage.
