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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "THE ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
2. That the membership fee be \$1 per annum, and that all memberships be paid at that rate.
3. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.
4. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a badge, and to free entrance for Team Prizes in the Affiliated Associations Match.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President.
7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Military District.
8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows:
 - 1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected at the annual meeting.
 - 2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.
 - 3rd. The District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia for Ontario.
 - 4th. The Brigade Majors of Militia for Ontario.
 - 5th. The Presidents of local Affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association.Five of whom shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

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9. Members of the Council may be represented at its meetings by written proxies, containing limited or full powers as may be expressed therein.

Such proxies to be held by members of the Association only, the signature to be duly witnessed, and no member to hold more than one proxy.

10. The Council shall chose from its members the President of the Association.

11. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such Districts, and who shall be elected by the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendance of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to then necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, nor new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

15. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

16. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

17. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

18. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

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19. No change shall be made in the Constitution, except at the annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been sent to the Secretary three months previously, and also posted on the Bulletin Board at the opening of the annual matches,

BY-LAWS.

The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
FOR 1881.

Your Council have the honour of laying before you their annual report of the proceedings of the Association for the year 1881, together with the Cash Statement, Schedule of Stores, &c. &c.

The prize meeting began on the 22nd August, lasting four days ; and while the general arrangements gave complete satisfaction to the competitors, a good deal of annoyance was occasioned through the delays consequent upon challenges, which on iron targets necessitate the stoppage of all firing upon a range, thus not only causing loss of time, but also difference in elevation and liability to change of wind—all of them matters of moment to those who may at the time be firing. At the general meeting many complaints were made, and authority given for a change from iron to canvas targets should the funds of the Association permit of the necessary expenditure.

The prize list, which in 1880 had been very much increased, was in 1881 reduced by some \$250, it having been found that the increase had not attracted a greater number of competitors, nor a corresponding increase in the receipts ; nor have the receipts from the late meeting been as large as might be expected from the liberal inducements offered, and consequently the cash balance is less than last year.

A slight increase in the membership, as compared with the previous year however, it will be seen is observable.

The funds of the Association not being sufficiently large to warrant the purchase of a new cup to replace the " Merchants'," permanently

won by the 13th Battalion in the Battalion Match last year, the "Sir Peter Tait Cup" was substituted, and the Team Aggregate Match, of which it was the principal prize, allowed to lapse.

The Provincial Match at the Dominion Meeting was, we are glad to say, again won by the Province of Ontario Team.

I.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The Meeting will be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of the chairman and two members of the Council, to be nominated by the Council ; and the following regulations are to be observed, together with such directions as may be given from time to time by the Executive Committee.

1. All competitors must be members of the Association.
2. All competitors will be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the meeting.
3. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the meeting, as also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.*
4. They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original detail.
5. They must attend at the firing point punctually at the hour detailed on the Firing Detail board, and deliver their tickets to the Register Keeper. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or to fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such competition will be cancelled.
6. The Matches will take place, if possible, in the order of publication. Any deviations from the rule will be posted on the board at the Secretary's Hut. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
7. The firing will begin daily at 9 a.m., and cease when the mid-day gun is fired. It will be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m., except on the second day, when the firing will cease at 5 p.m., to enable members of the Association to attend the Annual General Meeting.
8. Two guns will be fired for the "Fire" one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points, the second being the signal that firing is to begin ; two guns also at the "Cease fire," one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, after which no competitors will be

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allowed to begin his score, the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun are completed.

9. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

10. No hair triggers will be allowed.

11. No fixed artificial rests will be allowed, the forearm and hand must be clear of all support.

12. Slings may be used as an assistance in all matches; but in those restricted to the Militia the slings must be of regulation length and pattern and attached to the rifles, as in Government arms.

13. Competitors may wipe out or clean out their rifles during any competition between distances only. This does not apply to the "small-bore" Match.

14. No two competitors can shoot with the same rifle in the same match; nor shall a competitor change his rifle during a match, unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.

15. Every competitor must enter, and shoot under his own name, and, unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.

16. No member of a squad or firing party must absent himself without leave during firing. Any competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.

17. No competitor using a breech-loader must load until called to the front to shoot.

18. In all competitions restricted to the use of breech-loading rifles, competitors will be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*, but only one file at a time will be allowed within the firing ropes; and no person, except the Register Keeper, will be permitted to speak to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point, except in cases hereafter specified.

19. Where only one competitor is present, he must necessarily fire his shots consecutively and without undue delay.

20. A competitor may have any one present within the ropes to see that the scores are recorded by the Register Keeper are in accordance with the signals from the butts.

21. In competitions open to "Any rifle," the competitors will be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.

22. Competitors challenging shots must deposit with the Range Officer the sum of 50 cents, which will be refunded if he (the competitor) prove correct, otherwise it will be forfeited.

23. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so is not allowed to delay the shooting.

24.—In matches shot for by "representative" teams, all competitors will be permitted to have a "coach" or "spot," and to use binoculars or telescopes, provided that their doing so does not delay the firing.

25.—The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint a "spotter" to assist him; but no person, with the above exceptions, will be permitted within the ropes, or allowed to offer advice or give instructions to competitors.

Any violation of this rule, or of any part of it, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on a repetition of the offence must report the same to the Executive Committee, who will deal with the case as laid down in the Regulations under the head of Penalties, and may remove any person advising or instructing a competitor from the ground.

26.—Any competitor protesting against the ruling of the Officer of the Range, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievances in writing (upon forms to be had at the office), giving the names of two or more members of his squad who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it in to the Secretary ; but his firing must not be delayed for that purpose.

27. No practice will be allowed on the ranges, during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.

II.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

Disqualification.

1. Any competitor—
 - (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own ; or
 - (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so ; or
 - (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or
 - (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to an employé of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or
 - (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive ; or
 - (f) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid offences ;
 shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

2. Any competitor—
 - (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
 - (b) Who shall discharge his rifle within the enclosure, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
 - (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points and within the hours of shooting ; or
 - (d) Who shall discharge his rifle accidentally, either by his own want of care, or by reason of any defect in the rifle ; or
 - (e) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable ; or
 - (f) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous ; or
 - (g) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the Officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed,
 shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

Disallowance of Score.

3. Any competitor—
 - (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or
 - (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or

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(c) Who when competing for an aggregate prize shall omit to enter or enter incorrectly his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose ;
shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

Fines.

4. Any competitor—

- (a) Who in "blowing off" shall fail to point his rifle into the pit provided for that purpose ; or
- (b) Who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target ; shall be fined one dollar.

III.—ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees, for the first nine matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary), on or before Thursday, 18th August.

IV.—POST ENTRIES.

- 1. Post entries will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.
- 2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition, in such case the entrance fee will be returned.
- 3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

V.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

- 1. Competitors *who are prevented from being present* at the Meeting can have the entrance fees they have paid returned after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets.
- 2. Competitors who attend the meeting, but who are prevented from competing by illness, will receive back their entrance fees on production of a medical certificate and their firing tickets.

VI.—MEMBERSHIP.

The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees ; and all competitors must be members of the Association.

VII.—AFFILIATION.

The affiliation fee is \$5, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Affiliated" Match.

VIII.—EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey," and "Skirmishing" Matches, will be required to

produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

IX.—RIFLES.

Rifles will be classified as follows:—

CLASS I.

1. Snider-Enfield Rifles of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.
2. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be *temporarily* coloured, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used; they may also be shaded by any extemporized means. The sliding bar may be reversed, but no addition of *permanent* lines to the *one* down the centre will be allowed; *temporary* marks or lines, removable at pleasure, may be used.
4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock, will be disallowed.

CLASS II.

1. "Any rifle;" maximum weight, 10 lbs.
2. Sights of any description, except telescope and magnifying.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 3 lbs.

X.—UNIFORM.

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Men competing for prizes restricted to the Militia, must appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a waist belt. Officers need not wear sword belts, nor Officers of Rifle Corps cross belts. Cap covers may be worn. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing. Part uniform and part plain clothes will not be allowed on the ranges.

XI.—AMMUNITION.

1. In all competitions, unless otherwise specified, any ammunition may be used, provided of Government issue, or that supplied by the Association.
2. Ammunition (No. 9) for Snider-Enfields will be supplied on the ground at two cents per round.

XII.—POSITION.

Any position at all ranges, provided the rifle has no rest or support other than the person of the competitor; but in no matches, save the "Small-bore," will the "back" position (feet to the target) be allowed; and the word "any" relating to position, hereinafter used, shall be considered subject to this qualification.

XIII.—SIGHTING AND FOULING.

Tickets for sighting shots, price 10 cents each, and fouling shots 5 cents each, will be sold at the office provided for that purpose. They must be de-

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livered up to the Register Keeper—two of the former and one of latter allowed at each range—before a shot is taken. Such tickets to hold good in any match during the continuance of the Meeting.

XIV.—TARGETS AND MARKING.

1. The size of the targets will be as follows :—

- At 200 yards—
6 feet by 4 feet wide ; Bull's Eye (Circular), 8 inches ; Inner (circular), 16 inches ; Magpie (circular), 2 feet ; Outer, remainder of target.
- At 400, 500 and 600 yards—
6 feet square ; Bull's Eye, (circular), 2 feet ; Inner (circular), 3 feet ; Magpie (circular), 4 feet ; Outer, remainder of the target.
- At 800, 900 and 1,000 yards—
6 feet by 12 feet wide ; Bull's Eye (circular), 3 feet ; Inner (circular), 4 feet 6 inches ; Magpie, 6 feet square ; Outer, remainder of the target.

2. Hits will be signalled at the butt and entered on the firing tickets according to the following scale :—

3. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.

4. The marking as signalled cannot be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the Range Officer is satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may telegraph to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final.

5. The competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

XV.—TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows :—

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

- 1. When the firing takes place at more than one distance—
 - (a) By the range totals in inverse order.
 - (b) By the fewest
 - (c) By the fewest
 - (d) By the fewest *outers.*
 - (e) By the fewest *magpies.*
 - (f) By the inverse order of shots *inners.*
 - (f) By division if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot at the longest distance, if for prizes in kind.

2. When firing takes at one distance only—

- (a) By the fewest *outers.*
 (b) By the fewest *magpies.*
 (c) By the fewest *inners.*
 (d) By the inverse order of shots.
 (e) By division if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot, if for prizes in value.

IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- (a) If at more than one distance by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
 (b) By the fewest *outers.*
 (c) By the fewest *magpies.*
 (d) By the fewest *inners.*
 (e) By the total of each round in inverse order.
 (f) By the highest scorer in each team shooting off three rounds at the longest distance.

IN AGGREGATES.

1. By score at each match in inverse order.
 2. By following the rules for individual ties.

The names of competitors who have to shoot off ties will be posted up daily at 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 noon, on the Tie's Notice Board.

XVI.—PRIZE WINNERS.

1. Winners of prizes must apply to the Treasurer's office on the ground for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same.
 2.—All prizes not claimed before the 31st December, 1881, will be forfeited to the Association.

XVII.—TRANSIT.

By special arrangement with the Grand Trunk, Great Western, Northern and North-Western, Credit Valley, Toronto and Nipissing, Toronto, Grey and Bruce, St. Lawrence and Ottawa, and Canada Central Railways, and by the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company, competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at *single fare* on being furnished by the Secretary of the Association with certificates *before leaving home.*

XVIII.—QUARTERS.

1. Competitors desirous of being near the ranges may obtain a Tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a tent alone, \$1.
 2. Meals can be obtained on the ground.

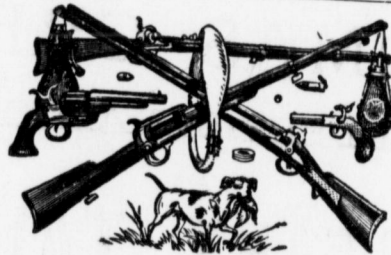

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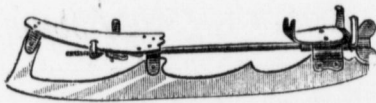
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
