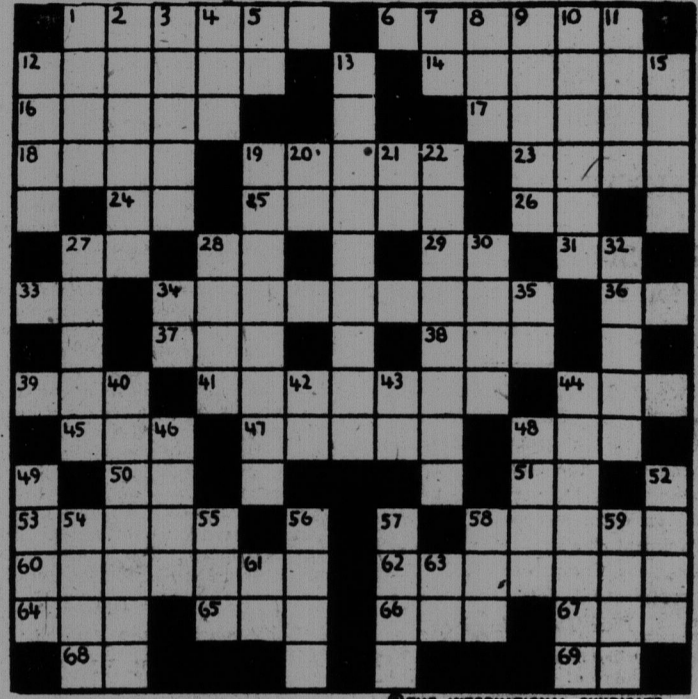

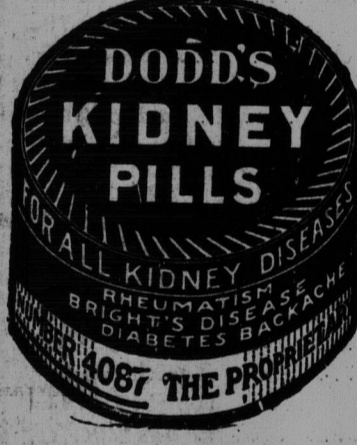

MAN STILL IN DE, BUT BRITAIN
HOPEFULLY FACES NEW YEAR

Long Looked For Trade Revival, Wiping Out the Army of Unemployed, is Eagerly Looked For In 1925

SITUATION IN THIS YEAR REVIEWED

Labor Rule, Elections, Tariffs, Russia and Wemby Enter Into Picture as Seen in Forecast of Better Times in the Motherland

(United Press.)

LONDON, Dec. 23.—Great Britain faces the new year hoping that 1925 will bring the long-awaited post-war trade revival, wiping out her army of unemployed.

The Tories were returned to power with the biggest parliamentary majority they have had since 1900 and the safest majority of any post-war British administration.

Foreign Relations. Foreign relations are steadily improving and empire unity is on the mend. Trade is reflecting the general European recovery.

The Tariff Issue. Stanley Baldwin, who was then and is now again prime minister, proposed a protective tariff as the only practical remedy for the trade crisis.

Outlook Better. As 1924 closes, however, there are distinct signs of an improvement in the business and industrial world.

Wemby Effect. One great stimulus to trade is likely to come from the determination of the administration to put into effect a scheme adopted last year of granting preference to imports from imperial possessions.

Complicated Attention. The change-over to a Labor administration attracted worldwide attention, largely because of its picturesque character.

On the eve of the ensuing election it became known that the foreign office had belatedly protested to Moscow against an alleged letter from Zinoviev of the Third International army and navy.

The Tory Victory. This and the fact that Tories and Liberals combined in many constituencies to avoid triangular contests cost Labor so many seats that it returned only 122 members to the House of Commons, 41 less than it possessed at dissolution.

With Socialist governments in France and Germany, MacDonald succeeded in bringing the co-enemies together in the London conference which adopted the Dawes plan. The idea of such a conference had, however, already received British endorsement under the Baldwin administration.
