NO BILL AGAINST NORTHROP AND HE IS SET AT LIBERTY

Grand Jury Recommends That the Mayor Issue No More Boxing Licenses - Judge Hanington Discharges Northrop - His Honor Also Talks of the Labor Dispute.

Fred Northrop, held for the grand jury on charge of manslaughter, in connection with the death of Charles O'Regan, who had hoped that something practical would be done. His Honor said that it should be noted that there are other ports, and that the present difficulty might result disastrously to that port.

The regular sitting of the circuit court opened at 11 o'clock. Mr. Justice Hanington presiding. A very large crowd thronged the court room to watch the trial of Northrop.

The grand jury was called and retired to elect a foreman. In five minutes they returned, and reported that John A. Storey had been selected. The jury was then sworn.

Joseph R. Stone, Daniel J. Purdy, James Lee, Charles D. Trueman, Daniel F. Tapley, Thomas H. Somerville, Henry A. Doherty, Isaac Erb, Richard Sullivan, James A. Steele, Lellan L. Sharp, Miles E. Agar, William Searle, Edmund J. Seaward, John K. Storey (foreman), William N. Sanborn, Enoch W. Paul.

The grand jury returned into court at 10 o'clock and the foreman, John K. Storey, reported no bill. The jury also recommended that his worship be requested to issue no more licenses in future for boxing exhibitions.

His honor, in discharging the grand jury, said that personally he was glad they had found as they did. He said that the case was very strong against him, but that the jury, as was their undoubted right, had exercised a wise discrimination in the matter.

The court then adjourned till this morning at 10 o'clock, when the first civil case will be taken up.

Hon. W. P. Jones appeared for the defence in the case of Northrop, and E. S. Ritchie for the prosecution, who was a witness.

STORM BREAKS LONG NEW ENGLAND DROUGHT

Boston, Nov. 29.—The western storm which wrought such destruction on the great lakes proved a positive benefit to New England, for it broke a drought of just two months' duration, and did much to fill the dried up springs before winter begins to carve.

The storm was well heralded, and the falling barometer all last night confirmed the predictions of the weather bureau, so that only the staunchest vessels left port today. While strong winds from the south and southwest prevailed along the coast, no excessive velocity was recorded.

Several Boston-bound boats from Maine ports were held back, but the Portland steamer Bay State reached here in safety. The only shipping mishap reported up to a late hour tonight was the grounding of a small schooner at the entrance of Ellsworth harbor, in Maine.

Coming on a new moon, the storm heaped the tide up along the coast to unusual heights, and the midnight tide tonight was caused by the flooding of the coast.
