The following are the regulations for fasting and abstinence during Lent, in the Roman Catholic diocese of New York:

1. All the week days of Lent, from Ash Wednesday till Easter Sunday, are fast days of precept, on one meal, with the allowance of a moderate collation in the evening.

2.
