Report of Session for 1898.

In presenting our Annual Report to the Congregation, the Session gratefully recognizes the hand of the Lord in the success of the past year. Every branch of our work shows a decided improvement.

The attendance at our morning services has increased, and it is peculiarly gratifying to see the regularity with which even our distant members attend in all sorts of weather. Our evening service is improving, but still requires attention. It is particularly attended by young people and outsiders, it is specially devoted to evangelical themes, and, if it is to reach its end, viz., the conversion of the young and the straying, it must have more attention from our church members. We ask, therefore, that our members make a more general effort to be present, that they use all their influence to induce the young people to come, and that, whether present or absent, they pray most earnestly that the preaching of the Word then be instrumental in saving souls.

Our prayer-meeting is scarcely satisfactory, because many who might attend, do not. As now conducted, its aims are two-fold—the exposition of scripture and the deepening of spiritual life. We urge the attendance of our members, if at all possible, and that those who cannot come, would observe the hour as one of prayer and Bible study in their homes, and so make it indeed a congregational hour of prayer.

Three meetings were held during the Week of Prayer and were very helpful. We intend to organize a series of cottage prayer-meetings, as soon as possible, which, we hope, will be stimulating and strengthening.

The Sabbath School is progressing. The fidelity of our teachers, the faithful labors of the retiring Superintendent, and the fair prospects under the present one, are highly encouraging. We wish to offer three recommendations for your consideration :—

1. That the parents make more earnest efforts to bring their children, and at the appointed hour. In a scattered congregation like this our only hope is in the loyalty of the parents. It would weaken us to break up our Sabbath School into sections, and we call on you to aid us in making our work in this central school the success that it ought to be in a congregation like ours.

2. That the parents visit the school at least once a quarter. Review Sabbath, the last in each quarter, is thrown open to all, and we invite you to attend it, for if you are not interested enough to come once in three months how can you inspire the scholars to attend every Sabbath? The result of such neglect will be inevitably that the scholars will leave the school at the earliest possible age.

3. That the parents study the International lessons systematically either in the Bible class or Teachers' Training class, which are open to all, or in their homes, and so follow a course of regular Bible study and be in touch with the scholars' thoughts and work.

The attendance at our Communion services is about 217 out of over 300 members. This leaves room for too many absentees, and the Session urges a more faithful attendance on what is our chief means of grace, and the most sacred emblem and solemn service of our holy religion.

The Session recommends too, that the contributions to Missions be made quarterly instead of yearly. It is unfair to both church and people to leave these to the end of the year. It is hoped that all our members will avail themselves of the privilege of supporting the cause of Christ abroad no matter how small the sum they can offer, that the disproportion between what we spend on ourselves and what we give for others may be a little less glaring than at present.

A member of the Session has been appointed to co-operate with each of the different societies in the congregation, that we may be in immediate contact with their work.

While we recognize gratefully our past success, we feel that the time has come for a general advance movement. There are many outside the church who ought to be in, many straying who ought to be reclaimed. Therefore in Christ's name we call His people to greater purity, faithfulness and prayer, in order that God may pour out His spirit upon us to quicken and strengthen His followers, and lead His wanderers home.

Sabbath School and Bible Class.

64th Annual Report.

We have much pleasure in presenting this the Sixty-Fourth annual report of our school.

The number on the roll has increased during the past year from one hundred and eighty-six to two hundred and twelve, and the average attendance from seventy to eighty-seven. The average attendance on account of sickness is lower than it otherwise would have been. Because of our congregation covering such a large extent of territory we cannot expect to have the average attendance as high as it otherwise should be. Yet by the

parents taking a more active interest in the Sabbath School work a very much higher average attendance could be secured.

A very important part of our Sabbath School teaching is the memorizing of the Shorter Catechism, and the congregation will be pleased to learn that three of our scholars, Miss Mabel Maas, Miss Mamie Wilson and Walter A. Leslie have correctly repeated the Shorter Catechism at one recitation, thereby entitling them to the diploma granted by the General Assembly.

We would take this opportunity of emphasizing, as the Session have already done, the importance of the home study of the lesson.

The Holy Spirit has been blessing the teaching of the Word during the past year, as eight have professed faith in Christ and become members of the church.

For another year we have to record the remarkable fact that there has none been called away by death during the year in the school or among the teaching staff. Surely God has been dealing very gently with us, and ought we not, one and all to show our gratitude to Him, by an increased desire to serve Him in whatever work He may call us to ?
