THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The usual Annual Accounts, duly audited, are herewith submitted. They contain all the receipts and disbursements of the Institute during the past year.

The revenue from the Institute Building, and from the farms, is about the same as last year. The vacant store in the Fraser Buildings has been refitted and arranged for a tenant in consideration of a long lease, and a fair rental has been obtained, but the advantage which will be derived from this arrangement will not be felt till the next fiscal year. And in consequence of the loss of the rental this year, and of several compulsory reductions rendered necessary by the great competition in the leasing of offices, the rental of the Fraser Buildings has barely paid expenses. An advance has been obtained from the Molsons Bank, for the purpose of the expenditure upon the buildings, in preparing the previously vacant store for the new tenant, upon which additional expenditure interest is added to the former rental charged. This advance, it is hoped, will be, in great, part paid off out of the purchase money of the McMartin farm, which is under offer, and which may shortly be sold. The Governors believe that a permanent improvement in the revenue of the buildings may now be expected, and the proximity of the proposed Board of Trade Building will, doubtless, add to their value.

The current expenses of the Library remain about the same as last year. The greatest economy possible is observed in this respect.

The attendance at the Library for the past year has shewn a moderate improvement over previous years, and it has reached very nearly as large a number, as the present building can accommodate. The average attendance per day is about 117 persons, which indicates a very considerable amount of literary usefulness on the part of the Library.

Schedules are hereto appended, shewing the details of the various subjects referred to.¹

A catalogue of the books in the Library, has been completed in two sections, one comprising the English, the other the French books in the collection. This Catalogue can be obtained from the Librarian at a trifling price, representing only its cost to the Library.

The Board desires to repeat in effect its representations of last year, with reference to the Library. As stated in previous reports, the revenue of the Trust is barely sufficient to keep up the required staff, at the lowest possible cost, and affords no margin for the purchase of books; for that purpose heretofore, the Board has derived its sole resources from the subscriptions of a few persous, mostly connected with the Executive. To render the Library thoroughly effective, and to keep it up to the level of the requirements of its position, it is necessary to procure the best books of each year. Without this constant addition of new matter the Library will lose its interest, and will fail in its usefulness to the class it is intended to benefit.

taxation, but in Montreal, it is probable that this resource can never be availed of, in consequence of its mixed population. The present Library, is maintained by the revenue derived from the bequest of Mr. Fraser, and for its supply of books, it has depended, almost entirely, upon the subscriptions of a few friends. Those who are disposed to favor the beneficent object of providing rational and instructive occupation for a large class of people, who are unable to provide books for themselves, will greatly further it by contributions, either of books, or of money for the purchase of books, and in view of the innumerable advantages which such an Institution provides, the Board hopes that the public of Montreal will assist the Governors in improving and increasing the collection of books in the Library, and in placing it in a condition to be useful and creditable to the Metropolitan City of Canada.
