

The floor itself is full of cracks, showing the lava red hot at about a foot or two beneath the surface, and even where we stood you could not bear the hand on it long. At the upper end of the hollow is the new cone, which forced its way up suddenly, and keeps up a continuous shower of lumps of red-hot lava. The more violent explosions throw up to a height of a hundred feet or so, with a dull, smothered report; the lesser

One theory is that it will grow until it fills the present crater and take the place of the 'old cone. as the old one did that of the left. hand cone in the year 79, when Heis culaneum was destroyed. 


