University Examinations. The recent examinations for entrance to the University of Toronto, conducted under the auspices of the Education Department, have not been the success which the promoters of the present scheme so fondly predicted.

From their own presentation of the case the public ought to drop the Hurontario Canal promoters as they would a man who had been so long and so far from the public in the right way.

Under the present regulations the Minister of Education has the whole system of examinations separating the high schools from the universities practically under his political and pedagogical scheme.

The Education Department conducts all the examinations (of an immense cost to the country), which formerly were conducted by the universities, and these have been, as a result of this, some startling pieces of jobbery, trickery and deceit on the part of some of the examiners. It has been, indeed, so immense a failure that at a meeting of the Senate of the University of Toronto a few nights ago the report of the examiners was not accepted, and a committee was appointed to investigate the whole question.

The chief trouble seems to have been in the examinations for scholarships. Previous to the present period the examinations for scholarships were always conducted in the University buildings, under the most careful supervision and with the strictest regulations possible.

This year the papers for scholarships were sent all over the province and examinations were supposed to be conducted simultaneously at the various High Schools throughout the country. In some cases, it is alleged, the papers were sent beforehand, opened and given to the candidates for preparation for the next day. In other cases the presiding examiners gave help to their favorite pupils, gave more than the allotted time and used various other devices to ensure scholarships and honors for their pupils and schools.

It seems unjust, unfair and even impossible for the Minister of Education to imagine that examinations for scholarships (at least under the present political scheme of appointing examiners) could be held in so many different places, and under precisely similar circumstances. The University of Toronto should at least reserve the right of determining who shall win the scholarships as its entrance examinations, and the only device which would ensure that just examinations shall take place is to hold them in their own building and under the wing of educational freedom, not under cover of political trickery.

The public have been quietly asking about the matter for some time past, and above, it is hoped, will clear up some of the darkness in which the whole examination was shrouded.

The whole system of examinations seems to be a huge farce. We must have some system, it is true, but a much better one than the present could be devised, in which the merits of the candidates and not the interests (political and mercenary) of the examiners would be at stake.

Agents Need Not Apply. The public should be humbugged no longer in regard to the proposed Hurontario Canal. The World is as anxious as anyone else in the city to help along any movement that will benefit Toronto or the Dominion of Canada, but we would consider ourselves little short of fools if we listened seriously to such a scheme as that with which a certain business-house is at this time now trying to hoodwink the people.

Imagine anything more ludicrous than the meeting on Friday night passing a resolution declaring the canal was perfectly feasible! Not one among them was an engineer or an expert in any line that would warrant him passing an opinion as to the feasibility of the work. Mr. J. L. Hughes was the mover of the resolution, declaring the scheme was "perfectly feasible."

It is said there were 600 present at the meeting, and the resolution that the canal was perfectly feasible went through with a whoop. Mr. Hughes is all right in his own line of business. We might be a more intelligent man than to venture expressing an expert opinion on a matter he knows nothing about. His opinion on this subject is fittingly represented in mathematics by the figure 0. Multiply his opinion, O, by the 600 who backed it up and you just get what you started out with, 0. That is what the resolution signifies. It signifies zero.

The promoters of the scheme are amusing themselves in a harmless kind of way. We cannot imagine them as serious people. If they were in earnest themselves and credited their audience with ordinary common sense they would have come before the people with the written and signed opinions of competent engineers, showing the scheme to be feasible, and that it would cost a certain amount of money; they would produce the estimates of competent persons of the amount of business waiting for the completion of the canal to take the benefit of it.

Instead of these expert opinions we have the opinion of Mr. J. L. Hughes that the canal is perfectly feasible; and of E. A. Macdonald that twenty millions of freight would annually pass through the canal. Mr. Hughes' opinion is worth the paper it is written on. Business men (we cannot say to school teachers) would consider an opinion on canal-building as worth as much weight as the opinions of our City Council would be if we found them deliberating on the literary questions that come before the French Academy.

And as for the opinion of the other party—that, that is immense! It is the same party that recently staked his reputation on the statement that Canada was wildly in favor of annexation; he is the party that built an imaginary city twelve miles from

Toronto and peopled it with thousands of citizens—in his imagination. The promoters of the scheme had very imprudently in putting E. A. Macdonald forward to give this opinion as to twenty millions of freight yearly. No one will put the least confidence in what he says. Last year the total tonnage of the Welland Canal was 355,545 tons of the Erie 281,905.

The Hurontario is to get four times as much freight as the Welland and Erie Canals put together, and twenty times as much as the Welland Canal alone. These are facts—these are the canal statistics for 1892. They give a little idea of the wild imagery of our local madcap.

From their own presentation of the case the public ought to drop the Hurontario Canal promoters as they would a man who had been so long and so far from the public in the right way.

They had the effrontery to imagine they could get the city committed to the scheme by rushing it through the committees at a meeting of the city council.

They produce no evidence of the business that would probably be handled by the canal. They produce nothing but a collection of brass and galls.

On the other hand we have the statement of Sir Casimir Gzowski, who says of the feasibility and commercial value of the project, that it is a "dream." We know nothing of engineering ourselves, but have this much common sense that we will accept the opinion of an engineering expert like Mr. Gzowski in preference to the lunacy of the Bellamy theorist.

HOME RULE WITH THE LORDS

BRILLIANT SPEECHES AND BRILLIANT SCENES.

What Will Be the Result of the Rejection of the Measure?—Graphic summary of the course of the debate.

New York, Sept. 9.—A special cablegram to The Tribune says: Value of the Lords.

LONDON, Sept. 9.—After a full-dress debate, extending over four days, the House of Lords last night threw out Mr. Gladstone's cherished measure by a majority of ten to one.

It is not often that the House of Lords is called upon seriously to debate a measure of leading importance.

When this necessity arises the country is treated to a spectacle very different from what is usually seen in the Lower Chamber.

The latter is a popular body, influenced by the ever-changing fancies and necessities of public opinion and, though much of its labor is devoted to answering popular demands, there is remaining through all its work the indolent strain of party warfare.

In the Lords it is not so. The peers have not to answer to any constituencies, and herein lies the chief recommendation of the hereditary system.

Whenever a big legislative proposal comes before the Lords, though we may reckon upon a distinct bias in favor of the interests of property, it is always a matter of certainty that the discussion will be of a higher class than afforded by the Lower Chamber.

In the latter case, Mr. Gladstone stands head and shoulders above every other. Mr. Chamberlain and Mr. Balfour are fine debaters, but every other name lags far behind.

In the House of Lords there are a dozen speakers who are perhaps not comparable with Mr. Gladstone, but who are in all respects the equal, in some the superior, of either Mr. Chamberlain or Mr. Balfour.

A fine oratorical display, the high quality of the Lords' debating power has been more than illustrated in this week's discussions.

Nothing has been finer in oratorical, dialectical display than the speeches of the Duke of Devonshire, the Duke of Argyll, Lord Salisbury, Lord Rosebery and Lord Salisbury.

It was an unfortunate for the Government party that for every one who could support the Home Rule bill the Opposition had three speakers against it.
