Sir Clifford Sifton's Open Letter Causes Sensation at Ottawa--Active Efforts to Unite Parties for Prosecution of War.

Ottawa, July 23.—Ottawa experienced another sensation this afternoon when the House passed an open letter from Sir Clifford Sifton, addressed to Senator Bostock, leader of the opposition in that chamber, calling for union government and absolute unity of the Canadian people to win the war.

Open Letter to Senator Bostock, Liberal Leader in Senate, Declaring Union Government Only Means of Grappling With Grave Situation--Return of Laurier to Power Would Mean End of Active Prosecution of War.

OTTAWA, July 23.—The following open letter has been addressed to Senator Bostock, Liberal leader in the senate, by Sir Clifford Sifton:

To Hon. Hewitt Bostock, the Senate, Ottawa: My Dear Bostock: "Will you permit an onlooker to respectfully express his views upon the present grave crisis in the affairs of Canada?"

We have eighty thousand men in the fighting line. It is not more than our share. Their numbers are being daily diminished by death and the casualties of war.

- 1. To put every possible ounce of force into our striking power with men, guns and munitions, in order to help the allies to win the victory for liberty.

The meaning of Sir Wilfrid's attitude, and that of his principal supporters in Quebec, is that they have determined to force an election on the single issue of conscription.

- 3. Under these circumstances, it will be obviously impossible to raise troops in the other portions of Canada (imagine a Laurier government trying to raise troops in the other provinces while Quebec scornfully refuses either to submit to conscription or to recruit.)

Munition Firms Asked For Hundred

The report of the women's depart-  
ment of the Ontario Employment  
Bureau shows that during last week  
there were 223 applications for work,  
and 190 applications from employers.  
The number referred to positions  
were 120 and positions secured 43.

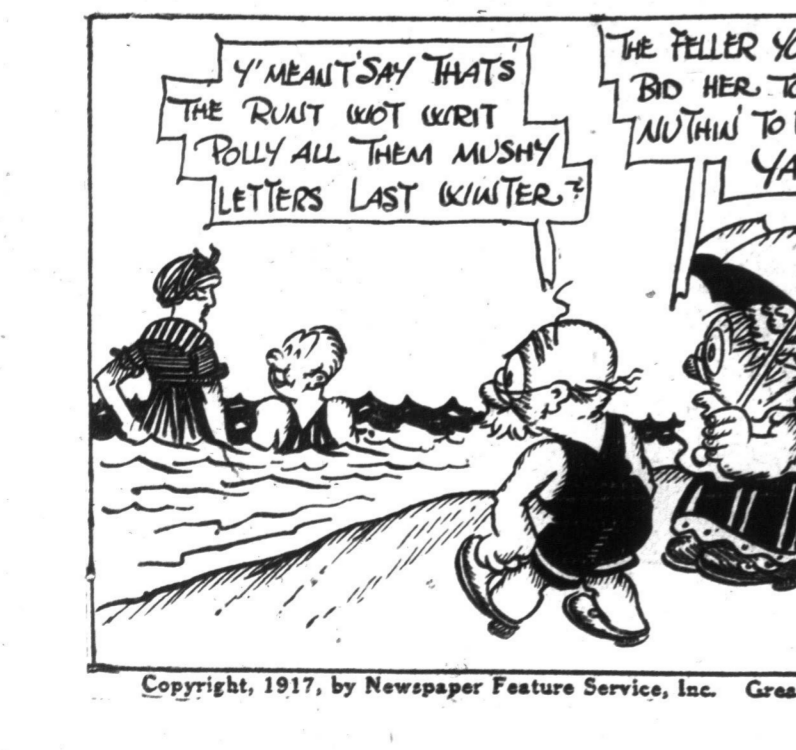

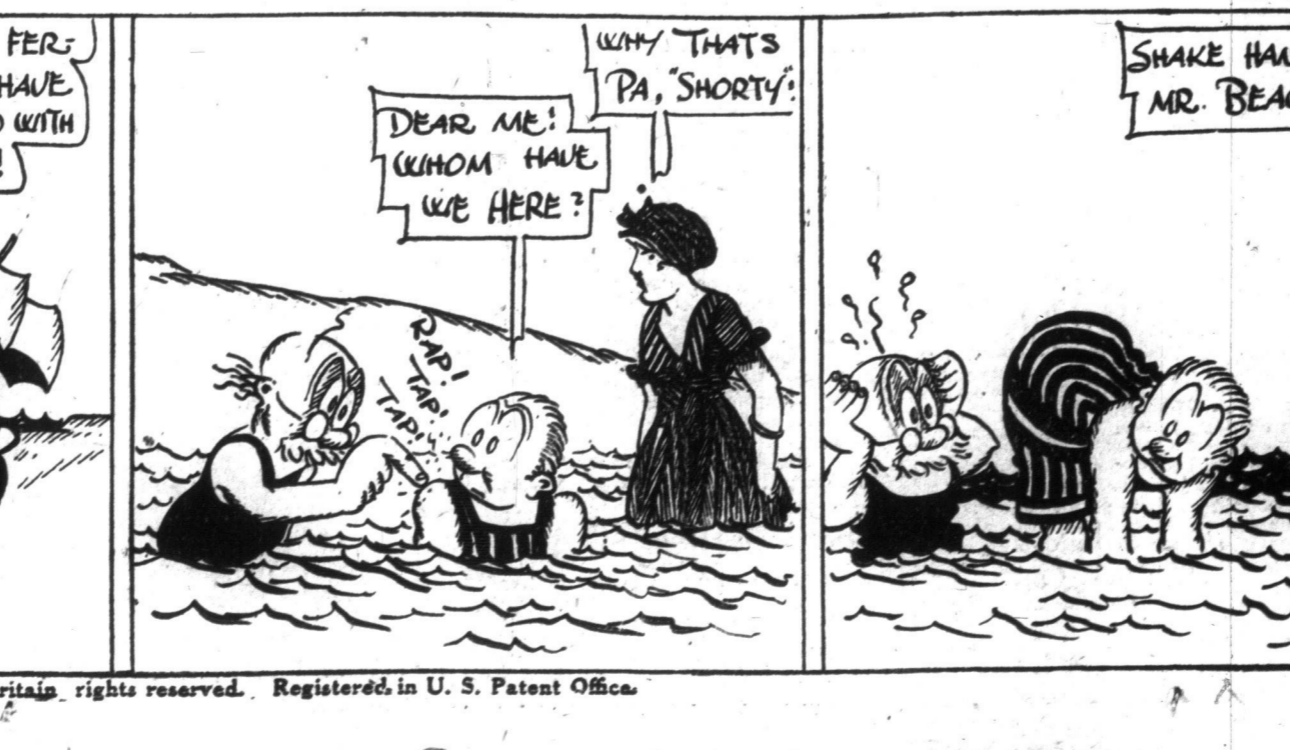

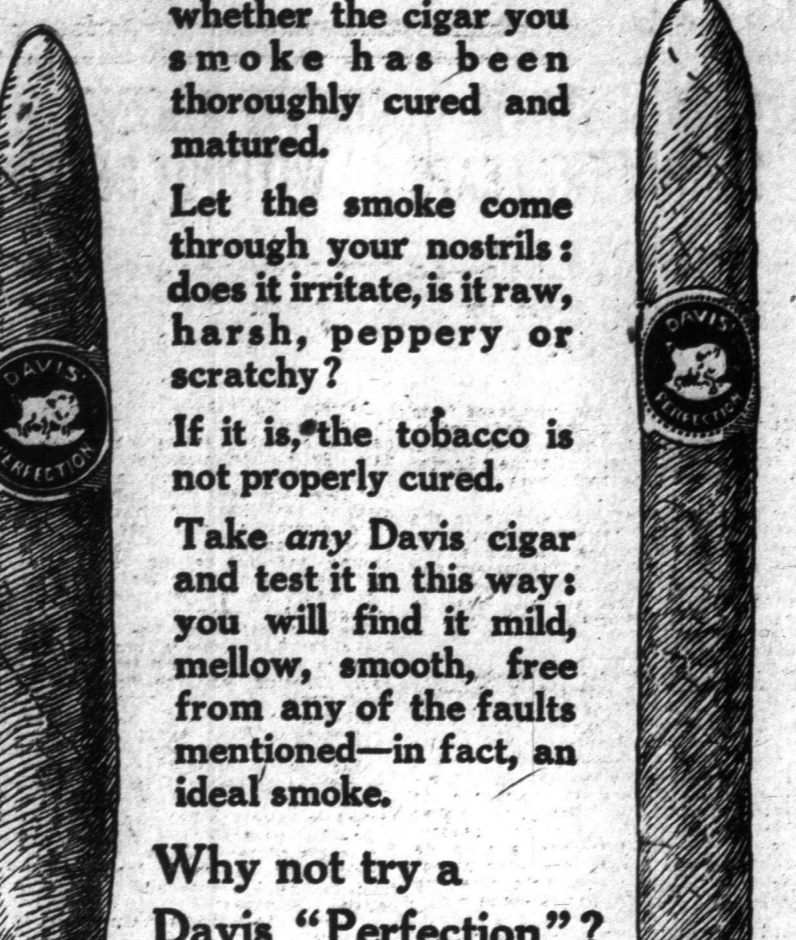
