Dublin Aimost Deserted.

Dublin, Aug. 21—The notice of the government garrison of Dublin to keep indoors Saturday night generally was obeyed. Very few persons ventured out, and the theatres and moving picture shows were almost deserted.

The expected attack by the irregulars did not inaterialize and except for the usual sniping the night passed quietly. Shortly after noon yesterday heavy machine gun, rifle and revolver firing was heard. It was stated that snipers were at work and that the National troops replied with machine guns and riffes. The fusillade continued for some time.

Sydney, N. S., Aug. 21. — Although practically all the maintenance men in Cape Breton South went back to work at the power house, pumps and fans, on Saturday and Sunday, full maintenance operations have not yet been resumed at several places, including the main power house at No. 2. New Aberdeen, where the military garrison is stationed.

The reason for this is that it has required some time to get things working after the almost complete shutdown of the last six days. It is expected, however, that full steam will be available at No. 2 and other centres this afternoon, when the work of pumping out the pits can be vigorously prosecuted.

Through some error in transmission of orders from U. M. W. headquarters the Sydney mines maintenance were not notified of the decision to return to work pending a conference with the company, and the pumpmen there were still out this morning.




Diagram of Loose Goupler
