





The fortress is as good as It is not certain, in spite of the appearance of the cruiser Novik in the roadstead, that the entrance to Port Arthur harbor is open. The Novik is a shallow draught vessel and may pass in and out of a channel which larger vessels could not navigate. It is doubtful therefore if the Russian Port Arthur fleet could as yet get out of the harbor to assist or join the Vladivostok squadron, supposing the latter manages to get near Port Arthur, a feat which appears to be humanly impossible.

One of the troop laden transports first reported sunk by the Vlad ivostok squadron has been towed into a home port disabled, but with all on board safe.
