### BODY OF THE LATE KING LIES IN STATE IN THRONE ROOM

Duke of Connaught Returns From Abroad and Takes Last View of the Dead.

LONDON, May 14.—King George's uncle, the Duke of Connaught, arrived in London last evening from their African trip. They were met at the station by the King and Queen Mary and the royal party immediately drove to Buckingham Palace, where the body of the late monarch lies.

King Edward's coffin was temporarily placed to give his brother a last view of the body. The casket rests in the centre of the throne room, which presents the appearance of a richly adorned private chapel. The chairs have been removed, and an altar has been erected on a dais beneath a canopy, with a profusion of white flowers banked around it. Only members of the royal household, the diplomatic corps and intimate friends of the late monarch were admitted to this private lying-in-state.

On the day of the funeral of King Edward memorial services will be held in every chapel and church through the country.


