## PROTECTION AND THE GRAND TRUNK

RAILWAY--At the annual meeting of the

shareholders of the Grand Trunk Rail-

way, held in London on the 6th inst.,

Sir Henry Tyler, President of the inst.,

explained that the expenses of the road

had been greatly increased within the

last few years in consequence of the

increased fiscal policy of the Dominion

Government, which made everything the

poor man required dearer than it was be-

fore. As a result, workmen on rail-

ways, as in other branches of trade, de-

manded higher wages which would have

been also dearer than they had been

before, and in particular the cost of

coal was increased to the extent of the

very high duty imposed. He (Sir Henry

Tyler) could hardly conceive anything

more unwise in a nation like Canada

than to place a duty on coal. The re-

sults to the people and to the country

could hardly be beneficial when it was

so exceedingly unfavorable to the rail-

road which in a country like Canada were

of the greatest importance. The Grand

Trunk Railway, he pointed out, was the

rest of the roads. He was not without

hopes, however, as he believed that in its

present position, and with the aid of the

connections as it now possessed, the road

would secure a good portion of the great

trade of the Dominion for American

products in the future. The activity of

business along the line seemed to promise

the Company, he believed, had reason to

anticipate a bright future.
