The colour of the latter is various; its hardness being somet mes soft and ducti'e , like clay, sometimes hard and solid, like stone, and sometimes is is extended into thin Leds, like slate, Shelltharl is easily distinguished by the shells, which always appear in it : but the similarity betwixt earth-mail, and many other fossil substances, renders it difficult to distinguish

them. Shell-mart is very different in its nature from clayey and stope marks, and from its ef-frats upon the soil, is commonly classed among the animal manures: it does not dis solve with water as the other marks do. It sucks it up, and swells with it like a sponge, Dr. Home says, that it takes six times more of acids to saturate it, than any of the other mart which he had met with. 




