







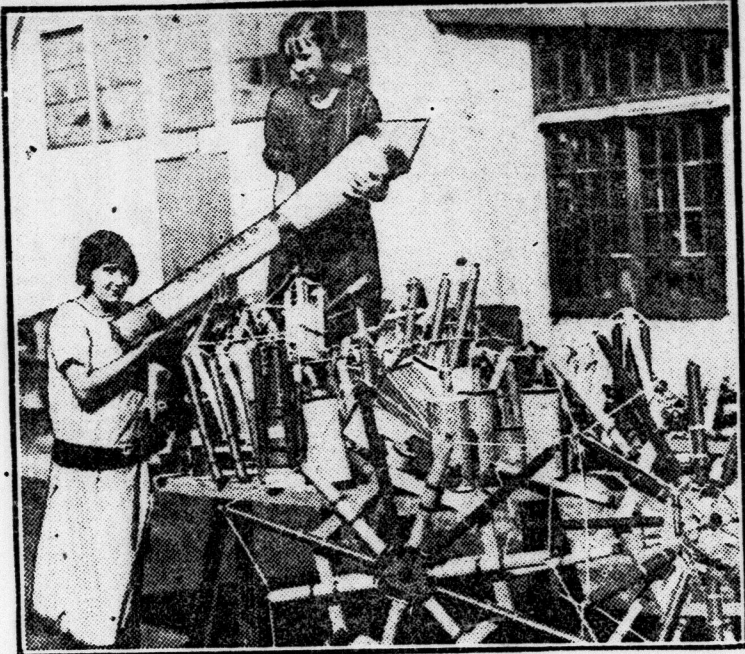

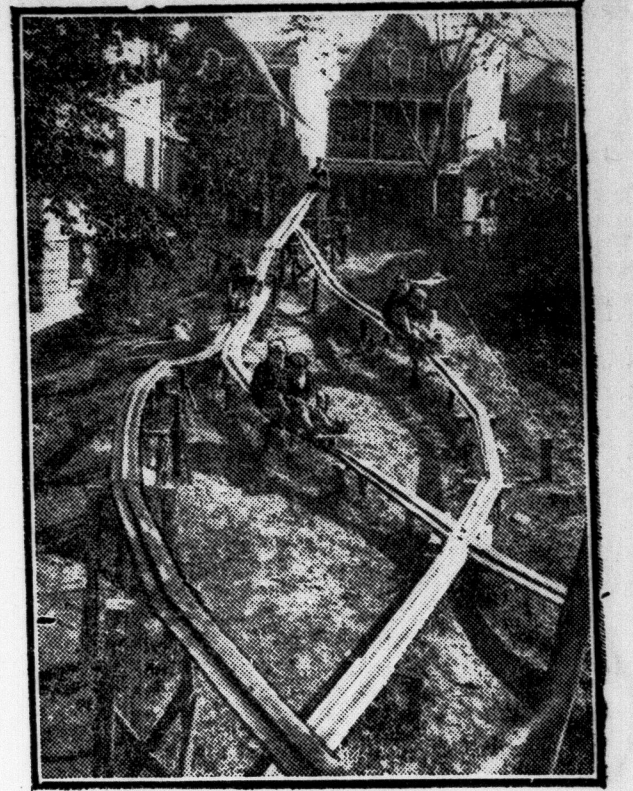

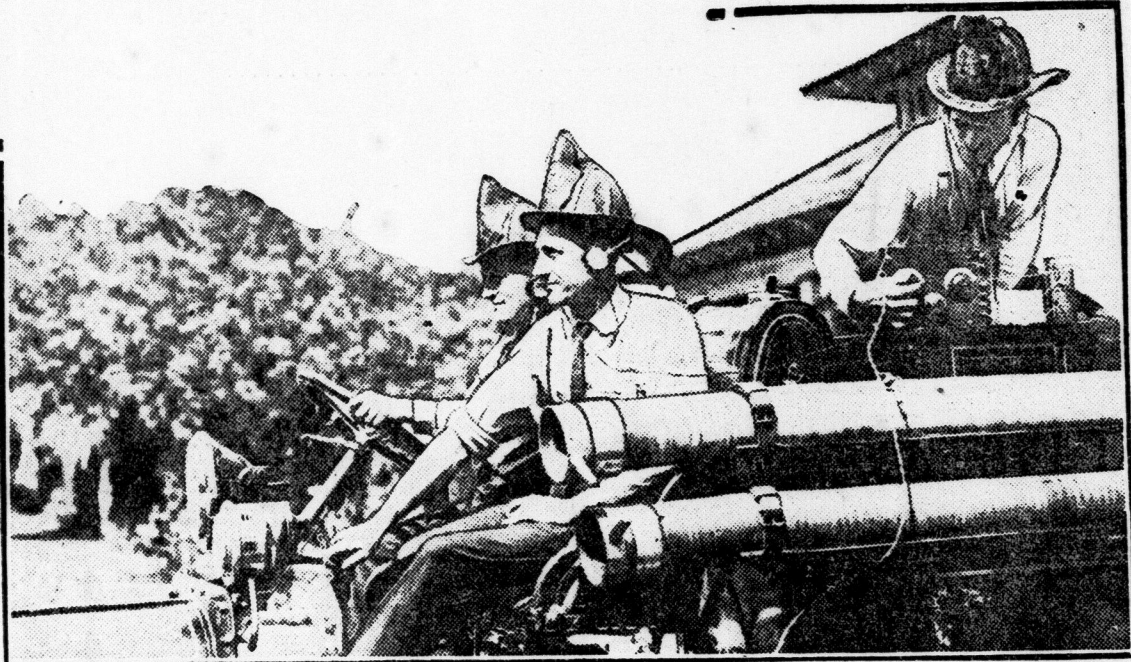

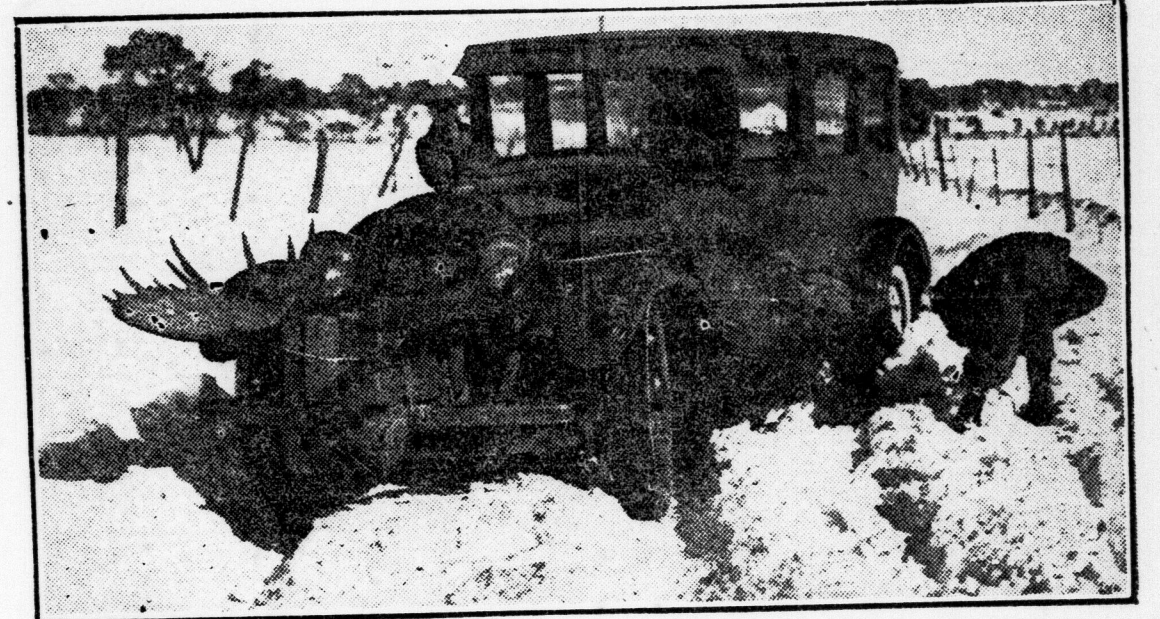

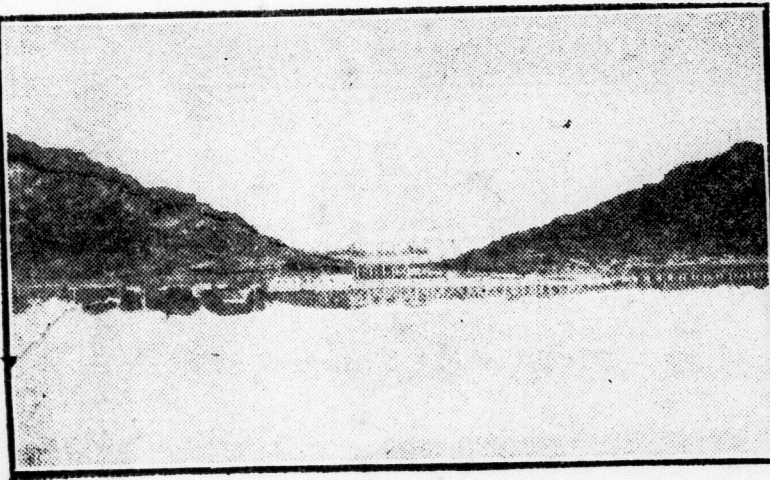

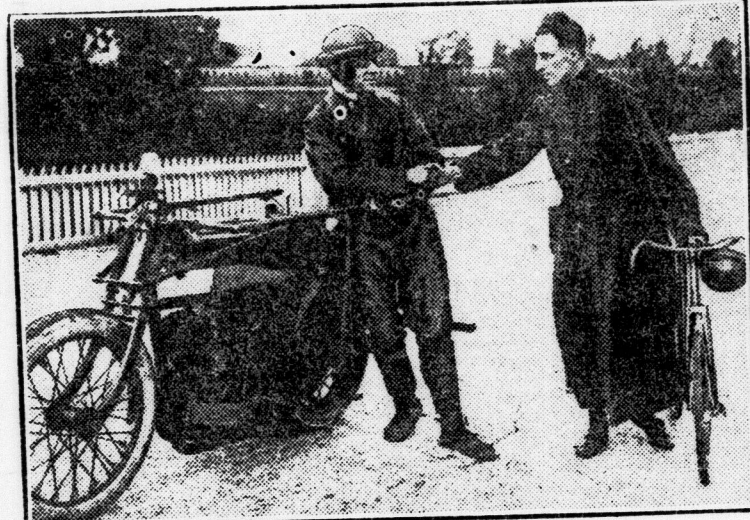

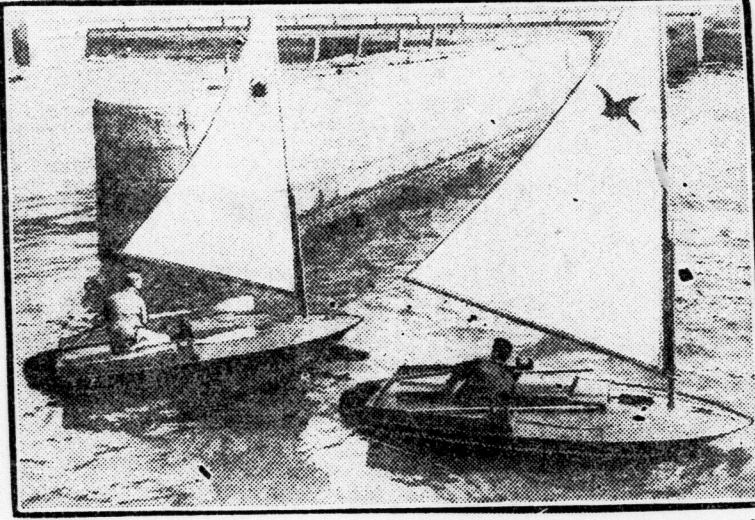

Looking up the new Holland marsh drainage canal, near Bradford. In the background is the Yonge street bridge.

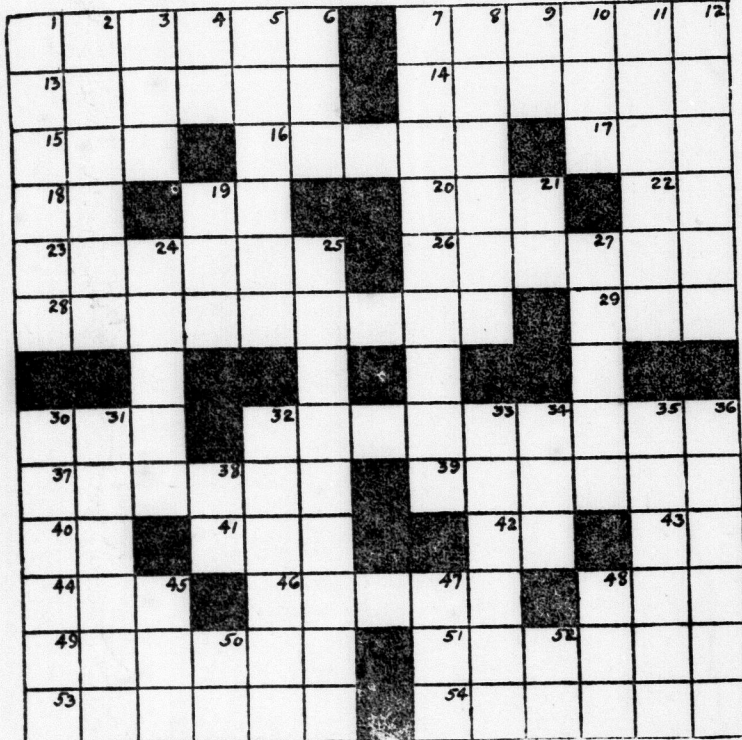

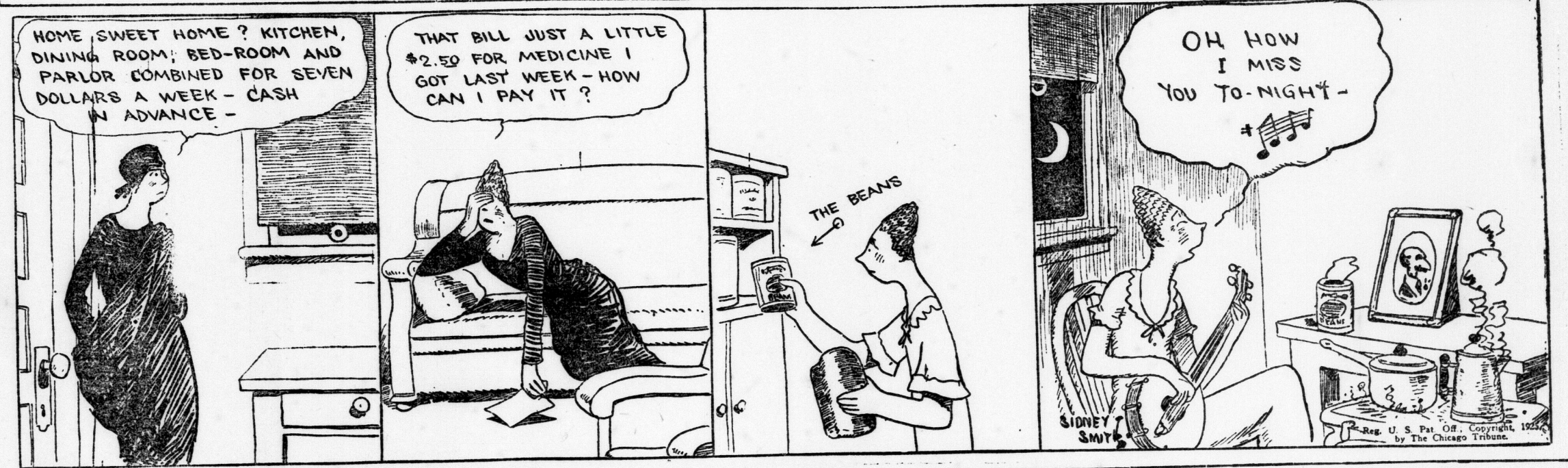
