MEETING OF THE HOUSES OF BISHOPS.

Wednesday 16th January, 1907, is a notable date in the history of the Church in Canada, and to the Dean and Chapter and Congregation of St. Alban's it is much more than a mere milestone in the path of events. It will be remembered by many that the first assemblage of the Bishops of All Canada, meeting for the purpose of a comprehensive organization of the Canadian Church, took place in St. Alban's in the official service preliminary to the meeting held to carry that organization into effect. On that occasion Bishop Machray, then a visitor at the Toronto See House, became the first Archbishop and Primate. Again the Church, as represented by the two Houses of Bishops, has met here, and, in his own Cathedral, has chosen Bishop Sweatman to be, firstly, M tropolitan of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, consisting of Ontario and the Eastern Provinces, and secondly, Primate of all Canada. On his elevation to the first of those dignities, Bishop Sweatman became ipso facto, Archbishop. To His Grace's many friends, and to the Cathedral Congregation in particular, his accession to the head of the Church is most gratifying, and it is with the greatest pleasure that we offer to him the congratulations of all those whom this paper may claim to represent.

St. Alban's, incomplete as it is, besides being firstly, the Cathedral of the Diocese of Toronto, is now also secondly, the Metropolitan Cathedral of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, and thirdly, the Primatial Cathedral of all Canada.

Surely the time has come when a forward movement to ... ands extension of the building should be made, and that in a manner consistent with its now threefold dignity.

The designs for the whole building which have been in hand for several months past, are approaching comp'etion. When the architects have finished their work, it will be for the financiers to take the next step.

The Ven. Archdeacon Sweeny has been appointed Secretary to the House of Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada.

The Dean has appointed Mr. Francis Henry Coombs, Choral Scholar Magdalen College, Oxford, and late of Worcester Cathedral, England, to be Choir Master of the Cathedral, in the place of Mr. David Kemp, who has resigned that office. The changes necessary in consequence of Mr. Kemp's resignation, have rendered us unable to continue to have the services of Yr. Holley, whom we part with with much regret, and with the hope that he will quickly find a position in which his abilities will have better opportunities and advantages than have been possible in the arrangements in the Cathedral Choir.

Our acknowledgements and thanks are again due to Mr. Howard for a gift of wine for the Holy Communion.

THE INTER-DIOCESAN SUNDAY SCHOOL EXAMINATION.
