BUTTER AND CHERSE.—During the year 1879 there were exported from Canada 14,207,977 lbs. of butter, of which 12,656,567 lbs. went to England, United States 283,500 lbs., and 115,525 lbs. to the West Indies. Of cheese there were exported 46,414,035 lbs. of this amount 43,969,028 lbs. went to Great Britain, 22,11,376 lbs. to the United States, and 129,379 lbs. to Newfoundland. Of eggs there were exported 5,440,828 dozen, valued at \$674,095. Of these the United States took 5,167,788 dozen. The total export of all these articles amounted in value to \$6,747,292.
