YALE-CARIBOO DISTRICT.

Mr. and Mrs. Hewitt Bostock arrived from Victoria by the Charmer this morning, and left for the Interior by the Atiantic express. Mr. Bostock has accepted the Liberal, or Opposition, nomination for the Yale-Cariboo division at the approaching Dominion election. His constituency is an extensive one, said to be the next largest in area to Burrard in Canada. Some idea of its immensity can be gained when it is stated that it extends from the international boundary on the south to the imaginary line between this Province and the Northwest Territories, and from Agassiz eastward to the utmost limit of British Columbia, more than 450 miles. From the dividing line between the Yade-Cariboo and Burrard districts, it runs northward to a point between parallels 50 and 51, taking in part of the Pemberton Meadows, thence westward to longitude 124, about another 100 miles to the distance from west to east. North to South the area must be in the neighborhood of 600 miles. This will give our readers a notion of the ground Mr. Bostock and his supporters will be obliged to cover in their canvass. Many portions of the district are difficult of access, for want of roads and ready means of transportation. The interests of this sterritory are varied. In one section it is largely given to stock-raising and general farming; in another gold diggings and placer mining, with hydraulic oppoperations, are being carried on to a considerable extent; again it is rail-roading, and in the southeast there exists what is claimed to be the richest silver producing territory in the world. Here gold and coal are to be found in large and paying quantities, making the Yale-Cariboo electoral district one of the most important in the whole Northwest. Mr. Bestock has large interests in the district, being the owner of a splendid ranching property at Ducks and Pringles, a short distance east of Kamloops. He is determined to visit as much of the field embraced in the consituency as possible; to see the people at their homes; to talk w

THE HEKTOGRAPH.

Some little time ago a correspondent at Port Haney wrote acking for the composition of those gelatinous pads from which many copies can be made of anything written in a proper kind of link. The information was not at hand at the time but it is now given in the hope that it may still be of use to the Port Haney enquirer as well as to others. The pad is composed as follows: Gelatine, by weight, 1 part; glycerine 4 parts; water 2 parts. The links are made as follows: No. 1—methyl violet, 1 part; water 7 parts, alcohol 1 part. A shallow tin holder made slightly wider and longer than a sheet of foolscap is the preferred size. To prepare the pad for use it is necessary to pass a wet sponge lightly over the face of the gelatine, allowing it to mearly dry before taking the first copy. If this precaution is neglected, the face of the pad will be ruined by the first transfer.

THE B. C. COAL INDUSTRY.

In a supplementary issue of the Winnipeg Commercial; some up-to-date faces are given relative to Betilsh Columbis's coal industry. In 1894 the island coal mines turned out \$8.000 tons, against \$48,000 tons, the product of the year 1893. The Mongolian colliery affair, however, is a two-edged sword, for it is also seriously interferes with the business of the Nanaimo colleries, the Vanc. uver and Wellington mine companies, who employ some 4,000 or 5,000 white miner, sand are the mainstay of the thriving town of Nanaimo. The men, on being confronted with this state of affairs, coupled with the fact that a general depression prevailed, consented to an extension of time on a cut in wages made some m.nths ago. But the matter was of such great moment that a letter was written to a prominent official of the Nanaimo mines, from a business standpoint, asking that gentlamin if he would be kind enough to express his views on the vexed question. His answer was rather startling; in brief, it was to the effect that his companies could not successfully compete with the mines employing Mongolian labor.






