MARKET AND GENERAL REPORT.

The market for all descriptions of goods, this week rules very quiet. Prices, however, continue about the same as they were at our previous dates.

We have to report an increase to the stock of flour, arrived from San Francisco by the Kentucky. Golden Gate still continues at the rate of

14. The brands of flour received by the Kentucky were as follows:—Chile, (700 barrels) Kentucky, National, Pleasant Valley, and Commercial Notwithstanding, however, these arrivals, the stocks of flour may be quoted as low.

On the 5th instant, an auction sale of hardware was held by F. M. Backus, the prices obtained

generally being low. The sale, we understand, amounted to about \$1,200. The stocks of dry goods have been much augmented by the arrival of the *Knight Bruce*, from Liverpool, on the 24th December, and the market may be said to be fairly supplied.

The steamer *Enterprise*, from New Westmin-

ster, B. C., on the 6th instant, brought down \$20,000 in gold dust, and reports that the snow had disappeared in the neighborhood the British Columbian capital, although the weather was still very severe further north, and towards the Cariboo district.

In and around Victoria, in fact generally on the island, the snow and frost have entirely gone, and miners are already making preparations to start for the Island diggings.

The Knight Bruce has turned out her cargo in good order, and to the general satisfaction of the consignees.

The Envoy is still in the port, and has not yet completed her repairs.

The rates of Exchange continue without alteration.
