CIVIC BODY'S PICNIC PARTY. MAY MEAN AN ISLAND PARK

Land Near Heber's Landing Looked as Location—Ald. Jones Eyes Controlship.

The project to transform the unproductive marshy wastes of the island interior, comprising about 100 acres, into a park, was the reason for the official visit to the island yesterday.

The mayor, controllers Hubbard and Spence, Ald. Vaughan, Jones, Dunn, Graham, McBride, Church, Jay Chisholm, Park Commissioner Chambers, Assessment Commissioner Forman and City Engineer Rutt were among the officials who took the trip, which was the first since the island was placed in the hands of the city.

The main body of the party crossed in the tug "National," after making the passage in gasoline launches, after steaming up Long Pond to the landing at the Civic children's hospital, where the civic body divided to meet later at Hughes' Park, where a supper was served and speeches made.

The chairman, Ald. Jones, thought there should be a park on the island, and he suggested that the people be prepared to vote liberally for the proposed improvement. He hoped that the civic body would be generous, not by a direct grant, but by agreeing to submit a bylaw to the city council.

Progress Slow at Present. The council had never in the past shown proper appreciation of the island, and the stern arraignment of President H. C. Hocken of the Island Association, Mr. Hocken said some complimentary things of the ferry service to Island Park, declaring it to be very unsatisfactory by reason of the fact that the ferry would give the island a better service than the present one.
