His disbursements during the twelve months amounted to \$14,784,740. Only the Department of Rallways beats this record, and it requires the capital expenditure to bring it out ahead. Nearly two millions of the public works expenditure also is charged to debt account. The whole exceeds by some four millions, the largest public works expenditure in any previous year. But 1908-09 was election year, which accounts for the excess. We shall probably see the record again beaten about four years hence.

Maguapit Lake was a queer enterprise. This was let August 14, 1908, to the Maritime Dredging Company at "schedule" rates. The report says that the dredging commenced October 19, and closed on the 29th of the same month. "The length of the channel when completed is to be 980 feet long by 70 feet wide at the bottom, with slopes of 3 to 1. The dredging was to "be taken to 7 feet at low water summer level, the material consisting of sand and mud. During the fiscal "year 4,809 cubic yards of ordinary spoil were removed." So reads the report (page, 69) but it is stated in the table of expenditure (page 18) that the amount pain for this dredging was \$49,166, which must be a mistake. 


